Cris Henkle asked how it is determined what streets get cleaned after a snow storm. Kristopher Stapleton told her the Main Streets then the secondary.

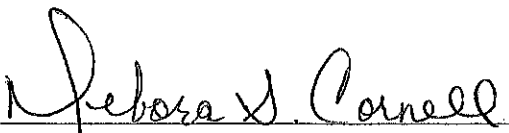
Calvin Divine told the council that the 201 Board will be making a decision on whether to allow Duenweg to go into contract for their sewer collection.

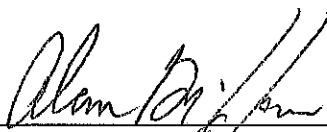

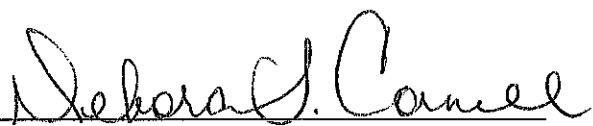
Department Reports

Kris Stapleton had nothing for the council.

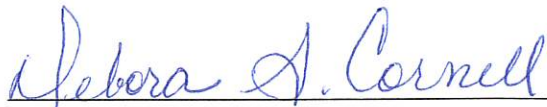

Mayor Griffin told Calvin that he appreciates all of Calvin's years of service for the city.

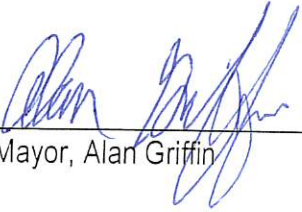
Mayor Griffin told the council that he would like to see what all is out there for Judges before he makes his appointment for the City Judge.

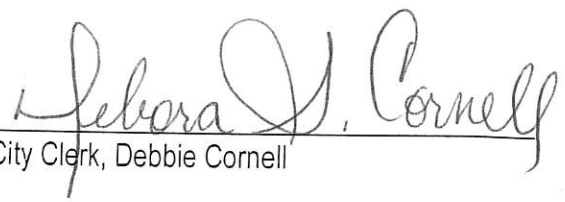

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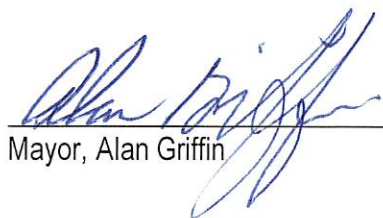

Will Cline told the council that he has completed the ISO study that is due every 5 years.

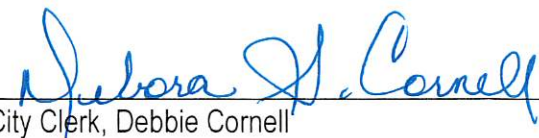

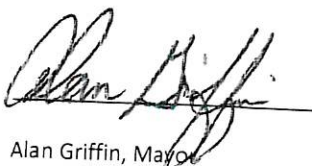

Some of those include data analysts, business owners/operators and current/ex state or municipal government officials who live in Cartersville or are from surrounding towns who are happy to assist. My role moving forward is to be the teams strategic advisor/speaker. I was raised here in Cartersville and know many people across this great town as well as in this room. I'm thrilled to have been asked to support this strategy. I bring 30 years of professional operational leadership strategy as well as HR & Law education with me.

I would like to start off by reading the team mission statement to you and breaking it down some.

Mission Statement:

"The CCFC mission is to collaborate with fellow citizens and city leadership for long term sustainable solutions to ongoing, unresolved issues while stimulating growth thru taking aggressive, new, proactive approaches as a total engaged community."

The following bullet-points are just a few of the many active community driven concerns that is beginning to be worked thru and evaluated as we speak.

1. **Manufactured housing solution-** The CCFC believes that Cartersville should not be debating this issue any longer. The citizens of Cartersville want to move on by allowing manufactured housing to be moved into Cartersville wherever new citizens would like as long as the current ordinances and state property/hud guidelines are met in regards to placement/ existing city standards. Citizens are widely not in favor of trailer parks.
2. **Police dept productivity-** The people of Cartersville want to see public weekly crime, arrest and citation reporting, enhanced expenses transparency and better code enforcement- The citizens of Cartersville want resident property code enforced much more consistently, enhanced to accelerate solutions to delapidated, abandoned housing

families. Citizens want to be able to see detailed reporting and physical progress each month presented by the Police Chief during council meetings.

3. **Infrastructure-** Simply, how can we work together to accelerate a long term solution to current infrastructure and roads issues. CCFC believes this is the number one issue holding Carterville back from growing again and saying that we don't have the funds is just simply not a solution anymore.
4. **Economic development-** Carterville citizens believe that the city should cease the moment with the East street rapid growth in Webb and feed traffic to the East side of Carterville. How do we do that?

The CCFC will present future suggestions as well as any factual based concerns during future council meetings. We all fully understand that emotions on both sides can certainly become a factor when citizens have been directly impacted by what they feel has been a lack of relationships between them and city leaders. The CCFC seeks to close the gaps and to create avenues for the people of Carterville to become more engaged with solutions verses anyone having an us verses them mentality. One exciting way the CCFC will be creating an avenue for citizens is by the upcoming creation of a CCFC Facebook "Great things Happening in Carterville" page in the near future.

As a group we will commit to always treating each of you with respect. However the time now is for action. We are currently developing a proposed plan to create higher engagement within the leadership and citizens that we will present at the Nov meeting that would require round table meetings with the citizens as well as personal connections from each wards council members. There are eight core CCFC members that would like to be part of those personal connections as well.

The bottom line is that Carterville is a beautiful, historical community and the town is truly blessed to have so many wonderful people in it. All of us in this room are volunteering our time and we all know how busy life is. Thank you all for your service to this town. You don't have to be here anymore than we do and that is greatly respected. Here are some final thoughts.. We have all got to think at a higher level and become unified in our approach to help this great town. While other small towns all around us such as Oronogo, Galena and others are really making strong progress, Carterville is not and is actually falling more and more backwards. We cannot waste another a minute be wrapped up in empty emotions of who is at fault and expect anything to come from it. We need to be united and

any serious concerns together and then move on to bigger, better things that will put Carterville back on the map and increase pride across the community. Thank you.

Department Reports

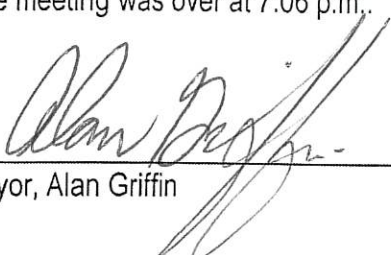

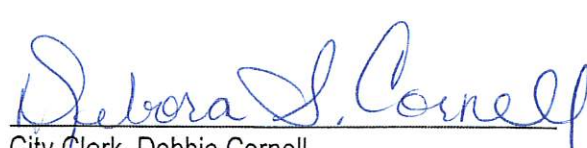
