Chief Pike said he had investigated all avenues for replacing the car, selling the damaged car to a salvage yard, or to another police department, and it looked like having it repaired and keeping it would be financially the best thing to do. We would still have 14,000 miles of warranty left on the car. Betty made a motion to go ahead and get the car repaired, Angela seconded the motion.

Angela questioned Chief Pike as to why we didn't have the decals on the white police car, Chief Pike said first it had been to cold and then the blue car was wrecked and we had to use the white car full time.

Teresa brought a statement for video camera use that she wanted Chief Pike to have all the officers to sign and start implementing, Chief Pike said he would take care of it. Chief Pike told the committee that because of the way the cameras have to be mounted in the police cars, it makes the driver's side air bag a potential safety hazard, and he is looking into having them disabled. He has talked to Lambeth Auto and they would need a letter from our attorney to relieve them of any liability, Chief Pike has contacted our attorney and Ford Motor Co. to see how much the disable switch will be.

Betty motioned to go into closed session pursuant to RSMo. 610.02(3):Hiring, firing promoting, or disciplining an employee of a governmental body, with closed record and closed vote pursuant to RSMo.610.021. Re: New Guidelines for Carterville Police Department

Effective immediately, the following guidelines will be implemented and adhered to by all of our police officers, including reserves:

1. The City patrol vehicles will remain within the city limits except for the following:

- A. Transporting prisoners to the appropriate facilities.
- B. Transporting juvenile offenders to the appropriate facilities.
- C. Transporting animals to the Humane Society.
- D. Delivering or picking up materials to Jas Co or the Prosecutors' Office.
- E. Assisting other law enforcement agencies, ONLY WHEN ASSISTANCE IS REQUESTED BY THAT AGENCY.
- F. Delivering or picking up patrol vehicles for maintenance or repair.

2. On any occasion a patrol vehicle leaves the city limits, the following information must be recorded on a destination log sheet by the officer operating that vehicle:

- A. Date, time, and mileage upon leaving the city.
- B. Date, time, and mileage upon returning to the city.
- C. The destination and reason for leaving the city.

NOTE: This information will be submitted at the end of each shift and the Chief will be responsible for submitting these destination log sheets at each Public Safety Committee meeting.

3. The patrol vehicles will not be taken outside the city limits for the purpose of meals nor used for any personal business. A microwave oven and refrigerator are located in City Hall for the use of the officers.

4. Officers are not to operate radar in the following areas:

- A. Highway 71
- B. Highway 71 overpass (including all access ramps).
- C. Outer roads on either side of the overpass.
- D. Walnut Street at HH Highway.
- E. 5th Street at HH Highway.
- F. Carter & Lewis Streets (directing radar towards Webb City).

NOTE: The Public Safety Committee and the Chief will review this list of areas and make changes as needed.

5. Since we do not currently possess "police package" patrol vehicles, officers will not leave an unattended patrol vehicle with the motor running.

6. Any person wishing to ride with an officer while on duty must receive permission from the Public Safety Committee. The only exceptions to this would be in an emergency or when assisting a citizen.

Angela Madden called the meeting to order at 5:30p.m. Chief Pike gave the committee a resignation he had received from Brad Campbell. Brad's resignation is effective June 1st. Chief Pike told the committee that Brad would like to purchase the vest that had been ordered for him on the grant. He would like to pay \$50.00 a month until it is paid for. The committee decided to table a decision on the vest until we could look into the grant and see if we would be able to sell it. Chief Pike will run an ad in the paper for a replacement officer.

Chief Pike told the committee he would like to have internet access in the police department. He had checked on some internet providers and found the Computer Patch wants \$216.00/yr and will wave the service fee, IPA is \$258.66/yr., or \$287.40 if you pay monthly, and Sofnet has a \$10.00 activation fee and is \$17.95/month, which is \$215.40/yr or if you pay lump sum, \$195.00/yr. Betty told the committee that this would also involve putting in an additional phone line because we don't have any spare lines that could be tied up with internet usage. The committee decided to table this matter until the budget could be studied for impact.

Mayor Harnden told the committee that Coffey's have brought in a second cougar. We may start hearing complaints from their neighbors. The conservation department has been contacted. The first cougar is grandfathered under our ordinance, however the conservation agent may take both of the cougars. Chief Pike said our ordinance #2601 does not require a registration fee for exotic animals, and needs to be reviewed.

Teresa addressed the problem we are having with the pager assigned to the police department by 911. She said the officers should be responsible and take the pager from car to car with them. Chief Pike said they were doing this now.

Betty asked if the police were still taking calls for burn permits and if the fire department had been contacted about this? Mayor Harnden said he would talk to the fire chief about this problem and see if he could get it sorted out.

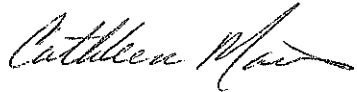
