POLICE COMMITTEE

The Police committee met on September 20, 2006 in Council Chambers at 6:00 PM.

Chief Will Cline

Committee Chairman David Comstock opened the meeting at 6:00 PM.

Chief Cline reported;

This week he had cleaned out the storage room and burnt the old closed case files that were causing clutter. The carpenters had completed building two new rooms in the building to use for evidence and equipment storage. He was in process of organizing the equipment to make it more available.

He had issued a written warning to Chris Patton to clean up the demolished house on Hannum Street. He had also issued a summons to appear in court to the owner of the Flea Market on Main Street to clean up the mess and stop operating without a city license. Angela advised the Chief to watch for illegal dumping of trash from the flea market. David Comstock offered to contact Dollar General to see if their outside surveillance cameras could monitor the activity at the flea market. Chief said that he would assign extra patrolling in that area.

Chief said that he would be attending a meeting with the county this week. He felt confident that the department would receive some funding, but he didn't know how much. He was hoping for a new patrol car.

Chief said that he had completed compiling a procedures manual. He also reported that he still had two officers who needed long-sleeved shirts. He was going to search through some of the old uniforms first. He would like to set the date of October 15th to have all officers change to long-sleeved shirts and ties at the same time.

He reported on the patrol cars- #511 had the transmission repaired but decided to postpone repairing the sensor causing the check engine light to come on; #514 was having rear end problems that needed fixed; #512 was running good; #513 would be stripped of patrol equipment. The Mayor suggested that the basic car either be sold by bid or traded for a truck that could be used to haul problem stray animals. All of the vehicles were without basic emergency equipment such as fire extinguishers,

blankets, first aid kits, and blankets. The Mayor asked him to get a list and check on acquiring these items.

Chief reported that the CSI class that he attended at Missouri Southern State University was going well and he had passed the first stage.

Chief said that he had acquired some treats for the kids at Halloween but would still like to get some of the sticker badges that they liked so well last year. The Mayor suggested that he get them ordered, and check with COPE to see what they had for the kids.

With the Chief's report being completed a motion to adjourn was made by David Comstock and seconded by Gerald Lee. By unanimous agreement the meeting adjourned at 7:10 PM.

The Police committee met on October 18, 2006 in council chambers. Chairman David Comstock called the meeting to order at 6:00 pm. Committee members in attendance were David Comstock(chairman), Clyde Ward, Shirley Almandinger, Mayor Jess Harnden, Gerald Lee, Angela Madden (visitor), Johnny Arrowood (visitor), Keith Hamsher (visitor), and chief Will Cline.

Chief's report;

Vehicle #514 seems to be running good, # 511 is having starter problems, and # 512 is having battery problems. A spotlight is needed on # 514. Chief estimated the cost at about \$139.00. He said that he would take the old one apart and check on parts. Mayor Hernden suggested we search locally at auto parts stores before ordering.

Uniforms- Chief said that the new shirts had been ordered and that the new jackets would be ordered as soon as the city opened an account with the company. Mayor Hernden signed the account application. Chief said that he had found a usable hat in storage.

Chief reported that he had finished the 9010 Grant. He had requested another camera for vehicle #514; 5 Flashlights; 5 First Responder Kits with oxygen bottles; a shotgun rack; Vests and gloves; and a \$500.00 Crime scene kit. He said we will have to wait and see how much we get awarded. A motion was made by Shirley Almandinger to have Mayor Hernden sign the grant so it could be sent.

Chief had been checking on obtaining a web site for the department. This month the department had issued 51 citations, worked 1 burglary, 1 fraud case, 1 domestic dispute, 5 active cases, and made 12 arrests.

Chief was working on adopting vacation request sheets and enact a policy of requesting vacation at least a week prior to taking time off.

Mayor Hernden reported a problem in getting the fire department to respond to first response calls. Chief said that once he received some of the new equipment requested in the grant, they might be able to respond to some of these calls. The Mayor said that he was going to contact John Peterson, the chairman of the fire department board.

Chief said that the office was finally back together after the construction, but he asked if the city workers could finish the wall in the evidence room. A motion was made by Shirley Almandinger and seconded by Clyde Ward to have that wall finished. The motion was passed by a unanimous vote.

At 6:25 pm a motion to go into closed session pursuant to RSMo. 610.021 was made by Keith Hamsher and seconded by David Comstock. The meeting by a unanimous vote then went into closed session in order to conduct interviews for the purpose of hiring a new part time water clerk.
