## PREFACE



### A LITTLE HISTORY ON THE INJUNCTION!

Injunction: This was a tool used by Industrial Management in Labor Conflicts.

An Injunction is a court order instructing a party to do, or refrain from doing, a specified act.

Beginning in the 1880s, the Injunction was requested by industrial management and granted by sympathetic courts to end *strikes* and *boycotts*. Its effectiveness was demonstrated during the Pullman Strike of 1894. The injunction long remained a prime tool used to curb labor union power.

This is an excerpt from Martin Luther King Jr's speech when he said he has been to the mountain top:

*All we are asking of America is to be true to what you said on paper. If I lived in Russia, China or any totalitarian country, maybe I can understand some of these illegal **Injunctions**. Maybe I can understand the denial of certain basic 1<sup>st</sup> amendment privileges, because they have committed themselves to that over there. But, somewhere I read of the freedom of assembly. Somewhere I read of the freedom of speech. Somewhere I read of the freedom of press. Somewhere I read that the greatness of America is the right to protest for rights. So, just as I say, we are not going to let no dogs or water hose turn us around. We aren't going to let any **Injunction** turn us around. Well, I don't know what will happen now. We got some difficult days ahead. But it really*

*doesn't matter with me now, because I've been to the mountain top, and I don't mine...applause! Like anybody, I would like to live a long life, longevity has its place. But I'm not concerned about that now. I just want to do God's will, and he's allowed me to go up to the mountain, and I've looked over, and I've seeeeen the promise land. I may not get there with you, but I want you to know tonight, that we as a people will get to the promise land. So, I am happy tonight. I'm not worried about anything. I'm not fearing any man...*

Let's look in our STATE'S constitution to see if we can find what he was talking about, when he said, "somewhere I read".

Florida constitution of 1885, Declaration of Rights, Section 13. Every person may fully speak and write his sentiments on all subjects, being responsible for the abuse of that right, and no laws shall be passed to restrain or abridge the liberty of speech or of the press. In all criminal

prosecutions and civil actions for libel the truth may be given in evidence to the jury, and if it shall appear that the matter charged as libelous is true, and was published for good motives, the party shall be acquitted or exonerated.

Section 15. The people shall have the right to assemble together to consult for the common good, to instruct their representatives, and to petition the Legislature for redress of grievances.

*Bonus:* Section 22. The right of the people to be secure in their persons, houses, papers and effects against unreasonable seizures and searches, shall not be violated, and no warrants issued but upon probable cause, supported by oath or affirmation, particularly describing the place or places to be searched, and the person or persons, and thing or things to be seized.

Once you break down what Martin Luther King Jr. was talking about in his speech, he was talking about the US constitution of 1778. That was a powerful speech. When I first heard it, it went over my head. Once I started studying and teaching the constitution, it all opened up for me.

As you can see, the Injunction has been around since the late 1800s. In the beginning, the Injunction played a subordinate role in the structure of remedy, but you will see how it has changed its position in that structure. Here is an excerpt from the book **THE CIVIL RIGHTS INJUNCTION**:

**In the late nineteenth century a new paradigm emerged—the labor injunction. The injunction then came to be used as a tool of industrial warfare, as a means of preventing the organization of labor and breaking strikes. This usage was best symbolized by the celebrated *Debs* case,<sup>1</sup> involving an injunction against Eugene Debs and his followers in the American Railway Union. They struck in support of the Pullman workers and managed to tie up the railways of the nation. The Supreme Court built on the law of nuisance, more particularly, that branch of the law of nuisance authorizing injunctions to re-**

move physical obstruction to public highways and navigable waterways, and sustained the injunction—nominally not to deny the right to strike, but only to remove the obstruction to interstate commerce.

The strike occurred in 1894 and the Court sustained the injunction a year later, in the context of reviewing Debs's contempt conviction. Long before the Supreme Court spoke, the injunction had its bite—federal troops had been deployed, Eugene Debs was arrested and removed from the field, the strike was broken, and the American Railway Union destroyed. What the Supreme Court added, however, was legitimacy—it gave a legitimacy to the practices represented by the *Debs* injunction. The Court showed that only lip service need be paid to the traditional restraints on the issuance of injunctions, and in this lesson it altered the traditional conception of the injunction and its place in the remedial hierarchy. The Court promised that in matters of industrial warfare the injunction could be the remedy of first recourse, and in the next decade or two that promise was fulfilled:

The Injunction was inserted into the constitution of Florida in 1885. This is a powerful piece that helped structure the foundation of this book and the Injunction Template that can be found on my website [www.TempleOfCommerce.com](http://www.TempleOfCommerce.com). I study the constitution and I teach the power of the constitution on my blogtalk radio show called the 48



CHAMBERS OF COMMERCE. My knowledge of the constitution is evident in how I carry myself throughout the land. This is an excerpt from the Florida Constitution of 1885, Article V, Judiciary Department

Section 11. The Circuit Courts shall have exclusive original jurisdiction in all cases in equity, also in all cases at law, not cognizable by inferior courts, and in all cases involving the legality of any tax, assessment, or toll; of the action of ejectment and of all actions involving the titles or boundaries of real estate, and of all criminal cases not cognizable by inferior courts; and original jurisdiction of actions of forcible entry and unlawful detainer, and of such other matters as the Legislature may provide. They shall have final appellate jurisdiction in all civil and criminal cases arising in the County Court, or before the County Judge, of all misdemeanors tried in Criminal Courts, of judgments or sentences of any Mayor's Court, and of all cases arising before Justices of the Peace in counties in which there is no County Court; and supervision and appellate jurisdiction of matters arising before County Judges pertaining to their probate jurisdiction, or to the estates and interests of minors, and of such other matters as the Legislature may provide. The Circuit Courts and Judges shall have power to issue writs of mandamus, *injunction*, quo warranto, certiorari, prohibition, habeas corpus and all writs proper and necessary to the complete exercise of their jurisdiction.



Section 14. A Circuit Judge may appoint in each county in his Circuit one or more attorneys at law, to be Court Commissioners, who shall have power in the absence from

the country of the Circuit Judge, to allow *writs of injunction* and to issue writs of habeas corpus, returnable before himself or the Circuit Judge. Their orders in such matters may be reviewed by the Circuit Judge, and confirmed, qualified or vacated. They may be removed by the Circuit Judge. The Legislature may confer upon them further powers, not judicial, and shall fix their compensation.

So, an Injunction is a writ and an order that must be carried out when it is structured properly.

In 1932, the Norris-La Guardia Act enumerated labor practices to be rendered exempt from judicial injunction, including the strike. In the wake of this law and other New Deal measures, many state legislatures enacted laws enhancing the powers of unions.

Here is another excerpt from the book THE CIVIL RIGHTS INJUNCTION:



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At roughly the same time, during the ascendancy of the labor injunction, the injunction also became an important instrument for fighting Progressivism—conceived in this instance as a program to reform and regulate business practices. The Progressives attained a number of legislative successes, including laws to regulate the rates of railroads and to impose maximum hours of employment, and the various business interests that lost the legislative battles often took their grievance to the courts.

Usually their claim was tendered by way of a defense in a criminal prosecution. The Supreme Court sustained such a claim in *Lochner v. New York*,<sup>2</sup> invalidating a state law prohibiting employees from working in bakeries more than sixty hours a week. *Lochner* was decided in 1905, and in 1908, in the midst of the public outcry over that decision, the Supreme



Court sustained a similar anti-Progressivism claim, this time cast in the injunctive form. In *Ex parte Young*,<sup>3</sup> in an opinion written by Justice Peckham, also the author of *Lochner*, the Supreme Court allowed a federal injunction to be used against the Attorney General of Minnesota, to prevent him from enforcing a state law proscribing maximum rates for railroads. *Ex parte Young* was viewed as an integral part of the judicial assault on Progressivism, and the reaction to it was aggravated by the specter of a federal judge holding the attorney general of a state in contempt, particularly when the contemptuous act consisted of nothing more than the commencement of a law suit in state court, as a means of enforcing the maximum rate law. The salience of the injunction was thereby heightened and the coalition of those wary of the labor injunction broadened. The dissatisfaction with the labor injunction was generalized to all injunctions.

This dissatisfaction received congressional expression. Some of the restrictions that resulted were procedural—for example, the 1910 Act requiring a three-judge court for the issuance of interlocutory injunctions against state statutes<sup>4</sup> and the 1914 Clayton Act confining temporary restraining orders to situations of true necessity, narrowing the binding effect of injunctions to parties, and guaranteeing trial by jury in certain contempt proceedings.<sup>5</sup> Other restrictions were substantive—the Clayton Act sought to protect the rights to strike and picket, and the right peacefully to persuade others to engage in this activity, by prohibiting federal court injunctions against such conduct;<sup>6</sup> the 1932 Norris-LaGuardia Act went one step further and altogether denied the federal courts the power to issue injunctions in labor disputes.<sup>7</sup> Many of these federal enactments had state counterparts.

Following World War II, Congress passed the Taft-Hartley Act (1947), which allowed the courts to resume the use of injunctions under specified circumstances. The Labor Management Reporting and Disclosure Act (1959) further broadened the courts' authority to issue Injunctions.

# INTRODUCTION



It was about 9:30am. I woke up feeling good. I had just gone to sleep about 4:30am. I was energized with a different energy this morning. About 9:45am, Destiny (The Cohost) woke up. Stacey was already up folding clothes and watching TV. I got dressed. I put on my Peace to the Gods T-shirt I had made. Every Friday at 11am, I called in to Open Forum Friday and talked with the OFF Host, which was a business partner of mine. I would drop a little knowledge on the subject, and kickback and listen to the show. That knock changed my life forever.

## **WHO IS THIS TAILGATING ME**

**Flashback:** I completed my Injunction on Thursday, a week and 1 day before the knock at my door. I sent my Injunction out to all the key people in my STATE. On Friday, a week before the knock, I sent my Injunction off registered mail, notary presentment, and they received it on Monday per my return receipt confirmation. 5 days later on Wednesday, The Cohost and I are traveling home from the store. Out of nowhere, someone started tailgating me like they had road rage. It was dark, and it seemed like there weren't any street lights on. Now they are really tailgating close. So, I slow down a little, to allow them the



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opportunity to go around me, but they don't do the obvious. So, now I'm getting upset, (and I always have an extra friend with me), wink, wink! So, I bring my little friend a little closer to me. So, I'm riding extra dirty, if you know what I mean. I have dark tents on my SUV, so I can't quite see whose tailgating me like a mad dog. So, I roll my window down to get a clearer view, and I can now see lights on top of the car. Yep, you guessed right, it was the po po, deputy sheriff to be exact. So, I said, oh sh--, and rolled my window back up!

## CHAPTER 1. WHAT IS AN INJUNCTION



What is a right to travel or freedom of movement? Freedom of movement under United States law is governed primarily by the Privileges and Immunities Clause of the United States Constitution which states, "The Citizens of each State shall be entitled to all Privileges and Immunities of Citizens in the several States." As far back as the circuit court ruling in *Corfield v. Coryell*, 6 Fed. Cas. 546 (1823), the Supreme Court recognized freedom of movement as a fundamental Constitutional right. In *Paul v. Virginia*, 75 U.S. 168 (1869), the Court defined freedom of movement as "right of free ingress into other States, and egress from them.

Remember, no one has a right to travel until it is enforced. The only rights someone has are the rights they know how to enforce. The most beneficial of all prayers are those we offer as an expression of gratitude for the blessings we already have.

### **DEFINITION OF AN INJUNCTION**

An Injunction is a judicial order that restrains a person from beginning or continuing an action threatening or invading the legal right of another, or that compels a person to carry out a certain act, e.g., to make restitution to an injured party.

A party that fails to comply with an Injunction, faces criminal or civil penalties, including possible monetary sanctions and even imprisonment. They can also be charged with contempt of court.

Injunction is a prohibitory writ, specially prayed for by a bill, in which the plaintiff's (I believe that plaintiff or defendant are not necessary, claimant or affiant) title is set forth, restraining a person from committing or doing an act (other than criminal acts) which appear to be against equity and conscience.

Injunctions are of two kinds, the one called the writ of remedial, and the other, the judicial writ.

First, the former kind of Injunction, or remedial writ, is in the nature of a prohibition, directed to, and controlling, not the inferior

court, but the party. It is granted when a party is doing or is about to do an act against equity or good conscience, or litigious or vexatious, in these cases, the court will not leave the party to feel the mischief or inconvenience of the wrong, and look to the courts of common law for redress, but will interpose its authority to restrain such unjustifiable proceedings. Bouvier Law Dictionary Vol. I

Remedial Injunctions are of two kinds, common or special. It is common (public) when it prays to stay proceedings at law, and will be granted, of course, as, upon attachment for want of an appearance, or of an answer, or upon a *dedimus* obtain by the defendant to take his answer in the country; or upon his praying for time to answer.

Common Injunctions are what I believe to be public Injunctions, because the claimant is asking the court for permission to grant the Injunction. So, it might be considered public when you pray for relief or ask for permission.

A special (private) Injunction is obtained only on motion or petition, with notice to the other party, and is applied for, sometimes by an *affidavit* (I believe that an Affidavit is the only voice in the court) before answer, but frequently upon the merits disclosed in the defendant's answer. ***Injunctions before answer are granted*** in cases of waste and other injuries of so urgent a nature, that mischief would ensue if the plaintiff were to wait until the answer was put in; but the court will not grant an Injunction during the pendency of a plea or demurrer to the bill, for, until that be argued, it does not appear whether or not the court has jurisdiction of the cause. The Injunction granted in this stage of the suit, is to continue until answer or further order; the Injunction obtained upon the merits confessed in the answer, continues generally until the hearing of the cause.

A Bill for a Special Injunction and Relief, having for its object the restraining parties from continuing to do acts in trade (or other acts) in the manner hitherto done, to the unjust prejudice of the plaintiff; or else to restrain parties from carrying into execution the threats they have made to act in a particular manner, that will be to the unjust

prejudice of the plaintiff, and for relief in regard thereto. This is an excerpt from COMMON FORMS AND RULES FOR DRAWING AND ANSWERING AN ORIGINAL BILL IN CHANCERY,

### **WHEN ARE INJUNCTIONS GRANTED**

An Injunction is generally granted for the purpose of preventing a wrong or preserving property in dispute pending a suit. Its effects in general, is only in personam, that is, to attach and punish the party if disobedient in violating the Injunction.

### **THE INJUNCTION IS ON THE NAME**

This is the most important part of the book. When an Injunction is done, the Injunction is done on the *name*. In my opinion, it's not necessary to put the tag, VIN number, boat, car or house or any other property in the Injunction, because the Injunction is done on the *name*. They do not put these items on the **DO NOT STOP, DO NOT DETAIN LIST!** Everything is connected to the *name*, like your car for example. When the police pull someone over, it is generally because they have run the license plate number through their computer system, and that license plate number is connected to, YOU GUESSED IT, the *name*. So, therefore, thou must become the Administrator of the (it is not yours in commerce, thou are the beneficiary of that trust account) all caps *name*, which is a trust account. Who is administering that trust account with the name on the driver license, mortgage documents, credit cards, etc.... Who has Power of Attorney to speak on behalf of the *name*. Now ask the question, is there a dba with an *affidavit* attached to it indicating someone being back in office as the Administrator/Beneficiary, and no one has jurisdiction to speak on behalf of the *name*?

Thou should understand the importance of the *name*? The name means Greatness, Hire, Superstar, Credit, Lion, Hero, Appoint, Dignitary, Signature, Title, Big Wheel, just to name a few. The *name* is very important for someone to understand. The Bible says in Proverbs 22 A good name is rather to be chosen than great riches, and loving favour rather than silver and gold. Thou must claim the *name* to claim jurisdiction to speak on behalf of the *name*. If the *name* isn't claimed, it

is considered abandon property, and anyone can use and control the *name*. Look at it like this, an abandon *name* is like an abandon ship, with no captain at the helm. When the pirates find an abandon ship, what is the first thing the pirates do? They plant their flag, and take over the ship. They use the ship to do commerce, for their benefit. They appoint a captain and other officers on the ship. They navigate from port to port doing business in the ship's *name*. So it is with the *name* of the trust, they use it in commerce for their benefit, and they will attack anyone who comes in that *name* without authority to use the *name*. Make sure thou has authority to use the *name*, and this will stop the pirates from using the property. All property, is in the *name*. Protect the property at once. Control the *name*.

### **BEWARE OF THE UNLEARNED TEACHERS**

There are a lot of teachers telling you to put your license plate, VIN number, boat, car, house etc. into the Injunction. They are also telling you to send it to three or four different Sheriffs (Exhibit 1, what not to do). They are also telling you to list one Public Officer on the Injunction at a time when you send it out. (confusing huh) In the Injunction webinar done by the OFF Host, he changed his template for the public, and had everyone sending their Injunction to one Public Officer at a time.

This is an excerpt from **COMMON FORMS AND RULES FOR DRAWING AND ANSWERING AN ORIGINAL BILL IN CHANCERY:**

A Bill, if it be filed by more than one plaintiff, must have those persons only for plaintiffs who have an interest identically alike in every respect, so that one relief suits all of them exactly as if they formed but one plaintiff, with one character of interest at stake • all other persons interested, though friendly, must be made defendants, if their interest is not identical with the plaintiffs', and even if a person, who ought to be a co-plaintiff, will not be so, he must be made a defendant.



The knowledge was pouring that night. I was excited and nervous at the same damn time. I couldn't eat anything for 2 days, because I was so nervous about my first show. This type of nervous energy lasted for about 2 or 3 months. I couldn't eat for 1 or 2 days before any of my shows on Thursday. I lost weight, which I did not like, and could not afford. But as soon as my show was over that night, I tried to make up for those days I did not eat. LOL! The name of my show is called THE TEMPLE OF COMMERCE. It was and is the hottest show on Thursday. I always start my show off the same way every Thursday since the beginning of my talk radio career. This is how I start: *I give thanks to my ancestors, whose blood runs through my veins, I give thanks to my ancestors for elevating me to a higher plane...*Peace to the Gods...Psalms 82:6 Ye are all gods, children of the most high.

Who's The Boss? See, a lot of times we be arguing and fusing with deputy clerks, when we should be dealing with the boss, the head clerk or the head of whatever establishment you are going into. We really shouldn't argue anyway. The bible says, show thyself friendly.

### **FIRST THINGS FIRST**

First thing I will do is go into the Florida Constitution of 1885. We are going into Article IV of the Executive Department. We are about to find out, who are the BOSSES we should be dealing with. The constitution is going to show us and explain to us their position, their titles and what they are supposed to do. We are supposed to hold them accountable, because, most times, the BOSS is the only one who took an oath to uphold the constitution.

### **PERSONAL STORY**

As a matter of fact, to give you an example before we go into the subject at hand, this past weekend, I was in Orlando, FL with my beautiful wife and my beautiful daughter just hanging out for the weekend having some fun. So, I grabbed a napkin, and I pulled out my pen, because I keep a pen on me at all times, so I can get contact info from people I meet, and to write down different ideas that come to mind (I learned that in Network Marketing). I started writing down what happened, point by point, the way it happened, while it was fresh. (This was my affidavit) Guess what, another couple (white couple) walked up on the other side of me, and the other bartender went to them and said, you guessed it, may I help you? Oh, my LORD! I looked around, and asked myself, am I being Punk'd right now! Man! I can't believe it! So, I grab another napkin, and wrote it down (my 2<sup>nd</sup> affidavit). I get up from the bar, go to the receptionist, and ask for the manager on duty. She was very courteous. She turned around to go and find him, and she said, here he is right here. (Side Note: the 1<sup>st</sup> bartender was a black guy, and the 2<sup>nd</sup> bartender was a white guy, even though I know that no one is black or white, these are the terms that people are familiar with). I said, are you the manager on duty tonight for the entire restaurant?

Manager: He said yes. (I wanted to make sure I was talking to the Boss, and not an under boss) Khalifa: So, I told him what happened at the bar. I showed him my notes (affidavits).

Manager: I apologize for that sir. I am going to take care of you personally. He went and got my food, brought it out to me, and said, sir, I really apologize about that. I will talk to those guys at the bar. Don't worry about paying, it's on me. Most people would be excited about a free meal. Not me! I had money for the food, and I was going to leave a good tip.

He was sincere, so I never sent those Affidavits to the corporate office. I am not here to intentionally injure someone in commerce who ask for another chance. The Bible says, agree with thine adversaries immediately. He made an offer (he paid for my food) and I accepted his offer. We came to an agreement.

### **THAT'S HOW YOU HANDLE BUSINESS**

See, that's how you handle business. You go and talk to the Boss! Stop talking to people who have no power to handle business the way you know it should be handled. I started to cuss those bartenders out. We would have gotten into an argument, and I would have been the one looking like an idiot, or they would've kicked me out of the restaurant like I was the one in the wrong. So, instead of doing that, I calmed down, relax myself, and went and handled business with the Boss.

So, let's find out who we should be talking to in our STATE'S constitution. Let's go into article 4, the Executive Department, Section 1. The biggest Boss of them all! Check it out! It says: The supreme executive power of the STATE, shall be invested in a chief magistrate, who shall be styled the governor of Florida.

Stop right here! I must look up every word I see. What is a magistrate? Magistrate- is an officer of the STATE. In modern usage, the term usually refers to volunteers, who hears cases in tribunals. See, a magistrate is an officer of the STATE, and he is a volunteer. He works for the STATE. That definition is from Wikipedia. But remember, the Governor is the chief magistrate. A chief magistrate is a public official, executive or judicial, whose office is the highest in its class.

Section 2. The governor shall be elected by the qualified electors of the STATE at the time and place of voting of members of the legislature.

What is a qualified elector? Let's look that up. First, what is qualified? Qualified- officially recognized as being trained to perform a particular job, certified. So, the qualified electors are trained to do a particular job. They are certified in doing what they do best. What's an elector? An elector is a member of the Electoral College. In the United States, someone who can vote in an election. Stop Stop Stop! I thought everyone can vote in an election. It just said that the Electoral College is the only one that can vote in the presidential election. Those are qualified electors. Hold on! Let's keep going.

### **WHAT AND WHO IS THE ELECTORIAL COLLEGE**

Now let's go to Electoral College. The United States Electoral College is the institution that officially elects the president and vice-president every 4 years. Stop! Man, why do they have people going down to the polls every 4 years, standing in these long lines for 3 or 4 hours, acting as though these are the people who are electing the president and vice-president. So, the president and vice-president are not directly elected by the voters (source of information is Wikipedia), instead, they are elected by the qualified electors, who are chosen by the popular vote on a STATE by STATE basis. If someone is looking to bring about real change, it is done through the local election. When a vote is cast for people who are running for a local office in your STATE, that's when a vote is being cast for a qualified elector. Go to Wikipedia and type in electoral college, and there will be a map of all the Electoral College members in each STATE. Do some research please. (I got off course with that, but I had to point that out). Back to the constitution.

Section 3. No person shall be eligible for the office of Governor who is not a qualified elector. Stop! Even the governor must be a qualified elector.

Section 4. The Governor shall be the commander and chief of the military forces of the STATE. I didn't know that the STATE had a military. WOW!

Section 5. The Governor shall appoint all commissioned officers of the STATE Militia. What? The STATE has a Militia. I thought the Militia was the people in the woods who were anti-government. The real Militia is directly part of the government. WOW! And the Governor shall appoint all commissioned officers including an Adjutant General.

Let's look that up! Adjutant General- each STATE in the United States has a senior military officer, as the STATE Adjutant General, who is the de facto commander of a STATE's military forces, including the National Guard, the Naval Militia, and any STATE defense forces. Formerly a Major General. WOW! Let's skip some of these sections, and get to the role of the BOSSES!

Section 20. The Governor shall be assisted by administrative officers as follows: *A Secretary of State, Attorney General, Comptroller, Treasurer, Superintendent of Public Instruction, and Commissioner of Agriculture*, who shall be elected at the same time as the Governor, and shall hold their offices for the same term; *Provided*, That the first election of such officers shall be had at the time of voting for Governor A. D. 1888.

Now this is where the constitution is giving the definition of each cabinet members post. The rest of the Bosses!

Section 21. The Secretary of State shall keep the records of official acts of the Legislative and Executive Departments of the Government, and shall, when required, lay the same, and all matters relative thereto, before either branch of the Legislature; and shall be the custodian of the Great Seal of the State. He shall also have charge of the Capitol building and grounds, and perform such other duties as shall be prescribed by law.

Section 22. The Attorney General shall be the legal adviser of the Governor, and of each of the officers of the Executive Department, and shall perform such other duties as may be prescribed by law. He shall be Reporter for the Supreme Court.

Section 23. The Comptroller shall examine, audit, adjust and settle the accounts of all officers of the State and perform such other duties as may be prescribed by law.

Section 24. The Treasurer shall receive and keep all funds, bonds, and other securities, in such manner as may be prescribed by law, and shall disburse no funds, nor issue bonds, or other securities, except upon the order of the Comptroller countersigned by the Governor, in such manner as shall be prescribed by law.

Section 25. The Superintendent of Public Instruction shall have supervision of all matters pertaining to public instruction; the supervision of State buildings devoted to educational purposes, and perform such other duties as the Legislature may provide by law.

Section 26. The Commissioner of Agriculture shall perform such duties in relation to agriculture as may be prescribed by law; shall have supervision of all matters pertaining to the public lands under regulations prescribed by law, and shall keep the Bureau of Immigration. He shall also have supervision of the State Prison, and shall perform such other duties as may be prescribed by law.

These are the major players when conducting business in the STATE. We must learn how to do better commerce in this age of Aquarius. We must conduct business with the BOSS!

This show opened the eyes of the people, because of the way it was laid out. First of all, the story at the beginning of the show (which is a true story) was a great way to start off talking about BOSSES, because I had an actual experience when I had to go to the BOSS. 

When I sent out my Injunction, I made sure I didn't have any flags at the top of my paperwork. The flags are considered part of the sovereign citizen movement. I always come in as a special appearance, never a general appearance. Here is an example in exhibit A.





Everything was packaged up and sent out in an Affidavit of Notary Presentment. In the Affidavit of Notary Presentment (See Exhibit F.), the notary is not a party to the claim or any part of the contents, but the notary is a witness to the contents placed inside the package. TITLE 18, PART I, CHAPTER 73, SEC. 1512. Truth is defined in commerce as an unrebutted affidavit, but a court can deny one's affidavit as evidence as mere hearsay if there is not a 3rd party neutral witness, such as a notary, to the process. In any case, it is important for the notary to understand that they will be functioning as a neutral witness. They are not condoning, supporting or agreeing with one's process; they are just witnessing the mailing and receiving of correspondence. When I sent my Injunction documents, I exhausted my administrative remedies. I sent the documents out three times. First time I sent it out regular. The second time it goes out, I put at the top of my Affidavit, *Second Opportunity to Cure*. Third time it goes out, I put at the top of my Affidavit, *Third Notice, Notice of Default by Affidavit*.





warrant, *n.* A warrant is a derivative that confers the right, but not the obligation, to buy or sell a security – normally an equity – at a certain price before expiration. The price at which the underlying security can be bought or sold is referred to as the exercise price or strike price. An American warrant can be exercised at any time on or before

the expiration date, while European warrants can only be exercised on the expiration date. Warrants that confer the right to buy a security are known as call warrants; those that confer the right to sell are known as put warrants.

Warrants are in many ways similar to options, but a few key differences distinguish them. Warrants are generally issued by the company itself, not a third party, and they are traded over-the-counter more often than on an exchange. Investors cannot write warrants like they can options. Unlike options (with the exception of employee stock options), warrants are dilutive: when an investor exercises her warrant, she receives newly issued stock, rather than already-outstanding stock. Warrants tend to have much longer periods between issue and expiration than options, of years rather than months.

Warrants do not pay dividends or come with voting rights. Investors are attracted to warrants as a means of leveraging their positions in a security, hedging against downside (for example, by combining a put warrant with a long position in the underlying stock) or exploiting arbitrage opportunities.

Trading warrants can be difficult and time-consuming, as they are for the most part not listed on stock exchanges, and data on warrant issues is not readily available for free. When a warrant is listed on an exchange, its ticker symbol will often be the symbol of the company's common stock with a W added to the end. For example, Abeona Therapeutics Inc's (ABEO) warrants are listed on Nasdaq under the symbol ABEOW. In other cases, a Z will be added, or a letter denoting the specific issue (A, B, C...).

A **writ** is an order issued by a legal authority with administrative or juridicial powers, typically a court. See **Writ** of certiorari, **Writ** of error, **Writ** of habeas corpus, **Writ** of mandamus. *An order issued by a court requiring that something be done or giving authority to do a specified act.*

The development of English [Common Law](#) relied on the courts to issue **writs** that allowed persons to proceed with a legal action. Over time the courts also used **writs** to direct other courts, sheriffs, and attorneys to perform certain actions. In modern law, courts primarily use **writs** to grant extraordinary relief, to grant the right of appeal, or to grant the sheriff authority to seize property. Most other common-law **writs** were discarded in U.S. law, as the courts moved to simpler and more general methods of starting civil actions.

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


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
