

Anita Bryan and Timothy Faerber purchased this historic property with every intention of sharing it through our community's "Designer Showcase", May 3-May 18, 2025. Now presented by Home Builders Association | Tulsa (HBA), "Designer Showcase" has historically benefited The Foundation for Tulsa Schools. This year, our partnership with HBA affords the public one (1) single ticket for all four (4) gardens, two (2) other interiors AND this spectacular 1923 Mediterranean-style Mansion on Saturday, May 10, 2025.



Anita and Timothy turned over the 6200+ square feet interior, including vaulted garden room, to HBA members. Other than the dated kitchen, decorators and designers have freshened all the rooms. Our own Member Jane Butts has transformed the dining room, while

many fixtures and the Art Deco basement with original terrazzo floors remain true to the era.

The double lot (highly-coveted in this Sunset Park neighborhood of Maple Ridge) has been redesigned by Kelley Design, Inc. New contemporary artwork with its own lighting and all new evergreens and perennials fill planting

beds. A decades-old stone grotto water feature is flowing again!

The 2025 Designer Showcase Tulsa is held at 2156 South Owasso Place in the historic Maple Ridge Subdivision. Volunteers have various opportunities to get involved in this incredible event. 
2427 EAST 41ST STREET

YESTERDAY

The April 11-12, 1964, Tulsa Garden Club 14th Annual Garden Tour included eight gardens. Five

gardens were daytime gardens, available 10 am – 5 pm. The three lighted nighttime gardens were available from 3 – 9 pm.

Gardens chosen showed results of "do-it -yourself" care in making the garden a success.

Tulsa Garden Club was the largest in the state with membership at 350. The Club invited all Oklahomans

and friends from neighboring states to "drive-over" – share in viewing this array of garden beauty.

The garden tour is to raise funds for the Tulsa
Garden Center and the Tulsa Rose Garden.
Admission was \$1.50 for adults, and 25 cents for children. The committee chair was Mrs. Harold W. Looney.




