Now, Paul transitions from his imprisonment to the situation in Philippi The one trapped encourages the free... in darkness, encourages the light.

Phil. 1:27-30 – NLT – "²⁷ Above all, you must live as citizens of heaven, conducting yourselves in a manner worthy of the Good News about Christ. Then, whether I come and see you again or only hear about you, I will know that you are standing together with one spirit and one purpose, fighting together for the faith, which is the Good News. ²⁸ Don't be intimidated in any way by your enemies. This will be a sign to them that they are going to be destroyed, but that you are going to be saved, even by God himself. ²⁹ For you have been given not only the privilege of trusting in Christ but also the privilege of suffering for him. ³⁰ We are in this struggle together. You have seen my struggle in the past, and you know that I am still in the midst of it."

- "Citizens of heaven" he traveled often; foreigner. Different. Paris O
 - As followers of Jesus, we live differently. Rules. Responses.
 - Live in a manner worthy of the Good News of Jesus. Not to earn.
 - Jesus died in our place. Paid the price. Ransom.
 - Live to honor that sacrifice. Be a credit to Christ.
 - Heart transplant... live befitting of the gift of life.
- **Stand together** w/1 **spirit** & 1 **purpose**, fighting together for faith
 - $\circ~$ Our enemy is not within the house of God; it's outside
 - Enemy is the one who denies Jesus... interferes w/ relationship
 - Enemy teaches hate not love... ignores grace of the Cross
 - Enemy opposes prayer... bans Bible...
 - 52 countries make the Bible illegal or severely restricted:
 - Afghanistan Iran Iraq Somalia N. Korea Egypt
 - Saudi Arabia China Cuba Morocco Libya Vietnam
 - N. Korea practice faith in secret/ 15-yrs in labor camp
 - Muslim countries: Bible/ corrupt text about Jesus, contradicts Koran. Islam – fasting growing... Japan, 110% rise since 2010
 - U.S. Bible ban in Utah, now changed; suggested in Ks, Tx, & Fl
 - U.S zoning codes to restrict home worship CA Couple fought \$300/\$500 fines

- Paul's conversion in Damascus Acts 9 "¹⁵ But the Lord said to Ananias, "Go! This man is my chosen instrument to proclaim my name to the Gentiles and their kings and to the people of Israel. ¹⁶ I will show him how much he must suffer for my name."
 - Paul considered it a privilege of suffering. The 2 sides of Grace.
 Fulfillment of what he was told in the beginning. Truth.
 - James, brother of John, killed by sword. Peter prison
 - We don't usually experience that level of suffering here.
 - But suffering/persecution shows this: making a difference!
 - Enemy doesn't target sideline teammates active players ... playmakers get a target and that's reason to rejoice!
 - Don't be intimidated God is on your side. God wins!
 - Can't stomp out message of God's love. Nero tried. 1st century.
 - Oppression is designed to stop action. Keep going.
 - Paul speaks of "the privilege of suffering." Why?
 - 1) Blessings come ... God restores... pays back. Justice.
 - Our suffering is **never final**. Pit/palace. Cruc/Resur
 - **1 Pet. 2:9** "For it brings favor if, mindful of God's will, someone endures grief from suffering unjustly."
 - Matt. 5:10 "Blessed are those who are persecuted because of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven."
 - Matt. 5:11 "Blessed are you when people insult you, persecute you and falsely say all kinds of evil against you because of me."
 - 2) Our trials/suffering make us better. Grow.
 - James 1:3-4 "³ because you know that the testing of your faith produces perseverance. ⁴ Let perseverance finish its work so that you may be mature and complete, not lacking anything."
 - 3) During persecution/pain/trouble draw closer to God.
 - After 9/11, churches flooded... see our need.
 - We know we're dependent. Lost w/o God.
 - Lion's den but we're not alone
