Age old question – ½ full or ½ empty?

We can see our life as a cup. Ask the same question.

Point: The cup is refillable. God is an abundant, overflowing God.

Psalm 23:5 - “You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies; you anoint my head with oil; my cup overflows.”

1 – God is an abundant God.

2 Cor. 9:8 – “And God is able to bless you abundantly, so that in all things at all times, having all that you need, you will abound in every good work.”

- God wants our **cups to overflow** so we can **live fully** for Him. All in.
- David experienced it – even though he spent years living on the run. . .
“The Lord is my shepherd, I lack nothing!” Have **all** I need.
Shall not want. Not lacking. Never in need. Cup overflows.
- **Philippians 4:19 – “And my God will supply all your needs according to His glorious riches in Christ Jesus.”**
 - Our limitations don’t limit God. He has a vast supply.
 - He wants us to live in “plenty;” **recognizing He will supply!**

2 – God waits on us to ask for His water.

John 4 – Woman at the Well. Jesus waited on her. Noon. By herself.

- Jesus asks the Samaritan woman for a drink.
- ⁹**The Samaritan woman said to him, “You are a Jew and I am a Samaritan woman. How can you ask me for a drink?” (For Jews do not associate with Samaritans.)**
 - Stop. She’s Samaritan. **But us:** How can I ask God for anything? I’ve not been living for Him. Sinned. Wandered away. Deserve.

- God loves you. Wants to bless you. Fill you.
- ¹⁰ Jesus answered her, “If you knew the gift of God and who it is that asks you for a drink, you would have asked him and he would have given you living water.”
- Jesus didn’t judge why she was empty. He knows, loves anyway. Gives generously anyway b/c He is good.
- Our Father in heaven “gives his sunlight to both the evil and the good, and he sends rain on the just and the unjust alike.” **Mt. 5:45**
- But **Deut. 28** tells us – God blesses more when we’re obedient.
 - Blessed in city/country. Blessed come in/go out. ⁸ “The Lord will send a blessing on your barns and on everything you put your hand to.”
- These are blessings waiting for us; **ask/receive**. Connect/God.
Live for Him.

3 – Let God fill your cup.

- God is the fountain of living water. He needs to fill/cup, not us.
 - **Jeremiah 2:13** - “For My people have committed two evils: They have forsaken Me, the fountain of living water, & they have dug their own cisterns—broken cisterns that cannot hold water.”
 - If you’re **digging your own well**, you’ll still be thirsty.
 - Rejecting His water leads to brokenness.
 - "broken cisterns" symbolize our failure; false security. Not true fulfillment.
 - Apart from God, it’s all **inadequate** and **temporary**.
 - Brokenness is the inevitable disappointment and spiritual drought that comes from turning away from God’s supply.
 - God urges us to draw from His well. **Seek Him rather than things that do not satisfy**. Isaiah 55:1 (next pg)

- [Isaiah 55:1](#) - “Come, all you who are thirsty, come to the waters; and you without money, come, buy, and eat! Come, buy wine and milk without money and without cost!

4 – Our filling happens in God’s timing. Right on time. Know its Him.

- He is constantly leading us . . . knows our journey . . . knows needs.

[Isaiah 49:10](#) – “They will not hunger or thirst, nor will scorching heat or sun beat down on them. For He who has compassion on them will guide them and lead them beside springs of water.”

Over & over, the Bible shows us God fills us... satisfies... abundant!

- [Matt. 15:34](#) - “How many loaves do you have?” Jesus asked. “Seven,” they replied, “and a few small fish.”
 - He fed 4,000. And they picked up 7 basketfuls of left-overs.
- [Mark 6:38](#) - “How many loaves do you have?” he asked. “Go and see.” When they found out, they said, “Five—and two fish.”
 - Jesus fed 5,000. They picked up 12 basketfuls of left-overs.
- [Exodus 16:4-15](#) – “Then the LORD said to Moses, “Behold, I will rain down bread from heaven for you. Each day the people are to go out and gather enough for that day.”
 - Each day, God provided. All they needed, from nothing!
 - “Each one gathered as much as he needed to eat.”
- [1 Kings 17:14](#) - “For this is what the LORD, the God of Israel, says: ‘The jar of flour will not be used up and the jug of oil will not run dry until the day the LORD sends rain on the land.’”
 - Food everyday for the widow, her son, & Elijah. During a famine, no rain, no river, no crops.
 - At the time of need, God provides.

- [2 Kings 4:42-44](#) – A man came “with a sack of 20 loaves of barley bread from the first ripe grain. ‘Give it to the people to eat,’ said Elisha. / But his servant asked, ‘How am I to set 20 loaves before a hundred men?’ ‘Give it to the people to eat,’ said Elisha, ‘for this is what the LORD says: ‘They will eat and have some left over.’ / So he set it before them, and they ate and had some left over”!!
 - **Our God provides.** Abundantly. With left-overs.
 - **You’ll know then – it was God.**

Your glass isn’t half empty or full. It’s refillable. . . by an abundant God!

[John 7:38](#) – “Whoever believes in Me, as the Scripture has said: ‘Streams of living water will flow from within him.’”
