Fifth Sunday of Easter

From Fr. Mike Gabriel

"This is the day that the Lord has made. Let us rejoice and be glad."

When I think of Easter, this is one of the first

phrases that come to mind. It is actually the refrain for the responsorial psalm on Easter Sunday. The phrase remains for me a reminder of what Easter is about, not only on Easter Sunday, but throughout the Easter Season.

I mention that because each year, I find it sometimes difficult to hold on to the focus of Easter. It's a long season, stretching for almost two months. And it always seems that once we've survived Lent, and celebrated Easter, it just feels like it is time to move on. Yet, Pentecost is coming, but we'll deal with that when we get there. How do we continue to celebrate Easter for all those weeks?

What is strange is that Advent and Lent don't seem to present the same challenge. While both are shorter than the Easter season, it seems that it's just easier to keep the energy going. That said, Christmas and Easter are a bit more significant in most of our lives. So if this is the day the Lord has made, how do you keep rejoicing week after week after week? If we're talking about the exultant joy of the first believers as they discovered that the tomb was empty, I don't think anyone could maintain that. But perhaps there is a quieter kind of rejoicing, not quite so overflowing with emotion. This is the day that the Lord has made. This is true of Easter Sunday, but it is also true of each and every day of our lives. There would be no day had not our God loved us enough to pour forth the fruits of creation. What this means is that no matter what happens today, or tomorrow, or the day after, it is a day that the Lord has made. He has had a hand in each day from the very beginning. No matter what I make of this day, no matter what choices I make, no matter what I accomplish, it is still a day that the Lord has made. What if something happens that doesn't make me feel like rejoicing? Then I recall what Jesus went through to get to that Easter day that the Lord has made. In this way, I connect whatever is happening to what God accomplished through the death and the rising of Jesus. No matter what, that is the cause to rejoice.

On Saturday, May 4 and Sunday, May 5, we will host a food and supply drive for Care for Real to help asylum seekers. Items needed for migrants include:


- Protein bars

First Communion Parent Info

Our parish's First Communion is approaching, and families with students making this sacrament need to know/do several things before this important celebration takes place.

- Some parents have not sent the Sacramental Request Form. Please fill it out and send it to Eloy Escamilla at **eescamilla@stgertrudechicago.org**.
- If you have not paid the registration fee for the 2023-2024 catechetical year, this is the time to do it. Notice that there is a sacramental fee as well. All payments can be done by check or online.
- Your child will practice the reception of Holy Communion on Sunday, April 28 and

Sunday, May 5 during her/his regular Sunday session. Please bring your child on time for those two important sessions.

- On Friday, May 10, there will be a First Communion practice at 6:30 pm. Please be on time.
- Our parish's First Communion Mass is Saturday, May 11 at 10:00 am. No photos are allowed before and/or during mass, but rather after the service.
- On Sunday, May 12, there is a May Crowning celebrated at the 10:30 am mass in church.
 All communicants should participate in the Crowning of Blessed Mary in their First Communion finery.

The attire for First Communion is simple, age appropriate, and should not distract from the focus of receiving the Sacrament. For boys, we ask they wear any color suit or slacks and a dress shirt. Girls usually wear white dresses, but it any color can be worn. Veils are optional, but should not block the face. Gloves can be worn, but not while receiving Holy Communion. While sitting in the pew (and especially when going up for Communion) children should not hold bibles, rosaries, etc. 3

Growing in Faith

"I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit....If you remain in me and my words remain in you...By this is my Father glorified, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples." John 15: 5–8

The Gospel of John is full of remarkable stories like the gospel reading this Sunday. John puts it together for us beautifully and poetically. In many of his stories he writes about signs, deeds and remarks that often reveal a key precept: The Father is in Jesus and Jesus is in us, through his words and through the Eucharist.

KC Conway, my friend and fellow parishioner, and I

were bantering about this gospel passage and she fondly recalled a childhood memory: a huge "vascular" grapevine in her grandmother's garden. Each year, this vine would produce loads of fruit—bunches of gorgeous grapes--for her family.

John uses the powerful and accessible metaphor of vine, branches and fruit to help us make an imaginative link to Jesus and the Eucharist. So, to take John's symbolic image further: Jesus, the vine, is a big vascular system with many branches. Those branches are well pruned, nourished by the "blood" of the vine, and bear fruit. The fruit of that vine becomes the wine of his blood. Through the bread and wine, he remains in us and we in him.

Have I taken this too far? I don't know, but when I read John's stories I reconnect with Jesus in such a profound way.
