19th Sunday in Ordinary Time

In 1982, the Jesuit scripture scholar, John L. McKenzie, S.J., published *The Two Edged Sword.* It is a brilliant study on the Hebrew scriptures, what we refer to as the Old Testament. As the title of the book makes clear, the scriptures are always going to "cut both ways."

In today's Gospel passage, we listen to a somewhat disturbing self-description of the mission of Jesus from St. Luke's Gospel. While the end results may steer us all to peace in God's Kingdom, before we get there the Word of God, living and active in our world, will be the catalyst for division and divisiveness.

The very powerful language Jesus uses should frighten us. He has come to "set the earth on fire" and he is in anguish until this happens. He then goes on to describe that he is not bringing peace, but division. Members of households will be divided among themselves!

Jesus' purpose is not to rip families apart. Rather, he was stating the obvious results when some people respond positively to the Word of God in their lives, and others reject it. When we listen to God's Word and let it into our lives, our lives are changed. Thus, the two-edged sword.

How am I a viable witness to God's Word in my everyday life? Without trying to cause division, is it clear I am not willing to accept some things just because "everyone else is doing them"? Or have I found a closer relationship with the Lord and struggle to follow him wherever He leads me?


Office Hours: The Rectory office will temporarily close at 4:30 pm on weekdays. Weekend office hours may be limited.

Catechists Needed to Teach Religious Education


We are looking for catechists to teach in our parish's Religious Ed program this Fall!

Interested in Becoming Catholic?

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is a process by which adults learn more about the Catholic Church. This free

program begins in the fall and meets until Pentecost.

Many people who begin RCIA are non-Catholics seeking to become Catholic or at least to explore whether Catholicism might be a good home. Those who complete the process and decide to become Catholic are initiated into the Church at the Easter Vigil Mass on Holy Saturday. Others who take RCIA are already Catholic but want a deeper understanding of their faith foundation.

The RCIA process does not ask those who have been baptized in another faith to give up their denominational experiences. Rather, the RCIA process seeks to add new colors and designs to their existing faith life tapestry. In addition to attending Mass, the RCIA process includes weekly gatherings of breaking open the Word of God, sharing our stories, and learning about our faith traditions.
