From Fr. Rich

The Gospel passage today concludes with that extraordinary statement by Jesus about John the Baptist, "Amen, I say to you, among those

born of women there has been none greater than John the Baptist; yet the least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he." (Matthew 11:11)

The magnitude of the change Jesus is ushering in is contained in that bold statement. History is at a turning point. All that came before was preparation for this moment. For from this day onward, our citizenship is in heaven. And nothing and no one can take it from us.

The assurance of our salvation is the starting point for all Christians. We are not starting in some bottomless pit of sinfulness, wondering what might befall us. We have already been redeemed, our sins forgiven, our place in heaven guaranteed. THAT is our starting point. And from there we will go, where? We're not starting from any position of deficit. Our foundation is what Jesus has already done for us.

With that in mind, what Good News can we bring to family, friends, neighbors? How do we share the love God has already bestowed upon us? In this season of gift-giving, the greatest gifts we can give can never be purchased, only shared freely from our hearts and souls -- the gifts of love, forgiveness, hope. Let us be generous in sharing those with others, just as God has already shared them with us!

This service is a time for listening to scripture, singing hymns, spending time in a guided reflection/examination of conscience, and celebrating the forgiveness of our sins through absolution. Help Needed with Collecting Food for Care for Real

We have all felt the uptick in food prices in recent months and while this is not pleasant for the vast majority of us, we are still able to put food on the table and pay our rent. Sadly, there are many families in Edgewater who cannot make this statement.



Greg Gross, the director of Care for Real,

outlined the dire situation that many families are facing on a weekly basis. On a recent day, Care for Real served 295 families in one day. On the same date last year, they served 156 families. They now serve over 1,300 families per week.

And while the need continues to escalate, unfortunately there has been a decrease in the amount of food they receive from their suppliers. Care for Real used to receive 7,500 pounds of food a week from Chicago Food Depository. Now they receive 5,200 pounds; that is two TONS less than what they used to receive.

The need in our community is great and the need is very real. I would like to propose as a parish that we have a monthly food drive for Care for Real. We would need a few adults to organize this (get bins out, collect the food after Masses, notify the parish with an article in the bulletin which weekend we are collecting, and coordinate with Care for Real any special needs for a particular month, etc.)

It would not involve a lot of time and effort and hopefully if this is a regular operation, we can arrange things with Care for Real for them to pick up the food. A few adults along with perhaps some teen help could really make a big difference in our community.

Growing in Faith

In this week's Gospel, St. John the Baptist, in prison and soon to be beheaded, writes to Jesus—not to ask him to save his life, but to seek confirmation that Jesus is the Messiah. If Jesus is not the one, John the Baptist is prepared to wait for another!

The proof Jesus offers him of His divinity is: healing those who are deaf, blind, and lame; raising the dead to life; and proclaiming good news to the poor. This is a daring and transgressive program, which Jesus acknowledges by saying, "Blessed is the one who takes no offense at me."

No offense taken by St John! Even as a baby in St Elizabeth's

womb, he understood that Jesus was the Messiah, and leapt for joy at His approach. St John the Baptist followed the path of the Messiah wherever it led—to the desert preaching in a camel suit, in a river baptizing sinners, to a prison awaiting his beheading.

Jesus pointed out that people sought out St John the Baptist— more bracing than a reed blowing in the wind, more arresting than a rich man in luxurious clothes. He was a wild man in the desert who spoke the unvarnished truth at all times—mesmerizing and liberating! He lived with humility, a rare spiritual gift. St John the Baptist pointed to the Messiah, saying: Jesus is coming, prepare yourself for this miracle. And here, Jesus points back to St John, to show us a model of integrity.
