

John the Baptist reminds us that our role is to prepare the way in small, faithful steps: acts of kindness, moments of patience, gentle attention to the needs around us.



Your gift to the Retirement Fund for Religious make a real, tangible difference to these many women and men religious. Contributions directly support their ongoing care today


and help ensure that their communities can plan wisely for the future care of all their members.

Growing in Faith

Happy Sunday! My name is Dani, a recent member of the Gertrude community. When asked to write this reflection, I wasn't sure what value I could share. But then I remembered if C.S. Lewis could write a best-seller and by self-omission claim "I am a very ordinary layman of the Church," well then, I could give it a go.

More than once, I've been judged of having little patience. Mostly true – it comes from a place of anxiousness and eagerness, especially at work. Being in public service for a decade, the everyday can be a real-life Parks and Rec scene: not enough resources, results taking too long, and constantly



pounding your head on the wall out of frustration. But as I was re-reading Matthew, the story of John the Baptist caught my attention.

Here you have a person trekking through the wilderness going from crowd to crowd preaching the Word to anyone who would listen and all I could think to myself, "Wow, this guy must have been obnoxiously persistent, even in the face of doubt. How did he keep going?" Was it divine insight? Omnipotent knowledge? Or was it...patience? The kind that is neither passive nor idle but active. The kind where you may not know where the road ends but you keep walking. The kind grounded in the faith of your labor.

So, as the sunsets and we return to the week – in a time of seemingly unending turmoil – be like John: grab your wild honey, keep moving, and have faith in your work. I know I will. Amen.
