The Second Week of Advent

As we enter the second week of Advent, we light the candle of peace—reminding us that Christ comes not only to comfort us, but to calm the restlessness of our hearts. John the Baptist's cry in the wilderness urges us to prepare a straight path for the Lord, clearing away whatever keeps us from recognizing God's presence in our daily lives.

This week invites us to slow down, listen more deeply, and allow God's peace to take root within us. Even amid the noise and pressures of the season, the Lord is quietly at work, smoothing rough places and healing what feels broken. St. Gertrude is once again hosting our annual Christmas greenery sale, with a limited number of balsam pine trees, wreaths, and garland available for purchase. Our Christmas greenery sale is a great opportunity for parishioners to get ready for the holidays while supporting St. Gertrude ministries.

Each 6' Christmas tree is \$55. Three different sized wreaths are available—the 18" wreath is \$25, the 24" is \$27, and the 36" is \$35. Garland is also available for \$40 per 5' length.

Greenery will also be sold at the playlot on the west side of the Social Hall, 1401 W. Granville Avenue, on December 7, December 14, and December 21 from 11:30 am to 1:00 pm. Only cash and checks will be accepted for in-person purchases.

An "Ignatian Retreat in Daily Life" will begin this coming January and end in June. The retreat follows the basic themes of the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius, but will take place in the midst of daily life rather than at a retreat center.

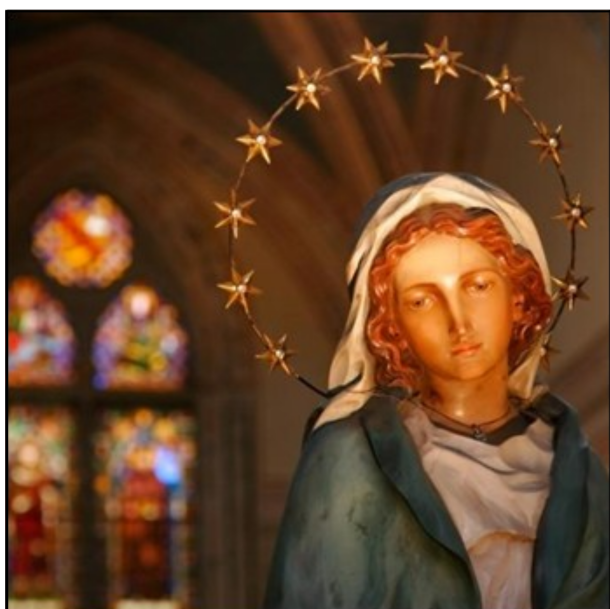
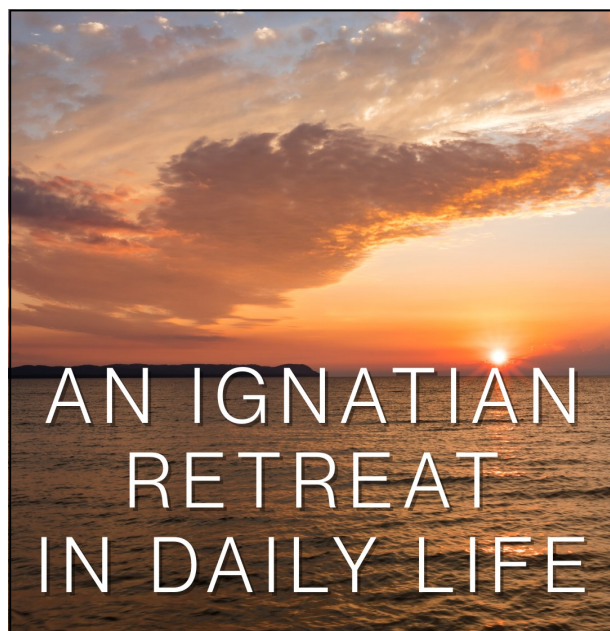

The director of the retreat will be Jim Neafsey, a parishioner at St. Gertrude's who has given Ignatian retreats for 50 years.

There will be a basic orientation to the retreat offered in December. Information sessions will last 45 minutes. Information sessions will take place in the Ministry Center this Sunday, December 7 at 11:30 am (after Mass) and Saturday, December 13 at 9:00 am.

Each session will cover the same content, so you only need to come to one session. They are intended to help clarify what the retreat entails and whether it fits with your desires and pattern of life at this time. This Advent, the Adult Spirituality and Formation Committee invites you to join the two remaining sessions designed to deepen our journey of awareness and hope. Each offers a unique way to encounter the sacred—through prayer, art, and reflection—as we prepare our hearts for the coming of Christ.

Both sessions will take place from 7:00–8:30 pm in the Ministry Center Chapel. You are welcome to attend either one or both.

Session Two – Wednesday, December 10

A Pre-Instagram Birth: The Nativity of Jesus Told Through Art with Fr. Sergio Romo

Selfies and social media capture both the momentous and everyday moments of our lives. Although the technology we use is relatively new, the desire to preserve a moment and share it with the world is ancient. Come explore how, over two millennia, the story of Jesus' birth has been illustrated and retold.

Beginning with the earliest known depictions of the Nativity, Fr. Sergio—an artist in his own right—will trace the development of Nativity iconography, with special attention to works of art housed at the Art Institute of Chicago.

Session Three – Wednesday, December 17

Encountering the Mystery of God's Presence Through Sacred Art with Jim Neafsey

We will explore how gazing at a contemporary work of art titled Sacred Bond can become a form of prayer that invites us to experience God's presence in our own lives. The radiance of a star-filled night sky and the expressive faces of a mother and child traveling through the darkness can awaken deep connections to our longings and life experiences.

Together, we will take time to share what in the painting captures our attention and what moves or touches us. We will also reflect on how Sacred Bond can deepen our understanding of the mystery of Christmas and speak to today's struggles for justice and peace.

Jim Neafsey, a St. Gertrude parishioner, is a painter of sacred images and has served as a spiritual director, retreat leader, and teacher of spirituality for over 50 years.

Please consider being part of this Advent journey. While all are welcome to “drop in,” we ask that you let us know if you plan to attend so we can prepare sufficient seating.

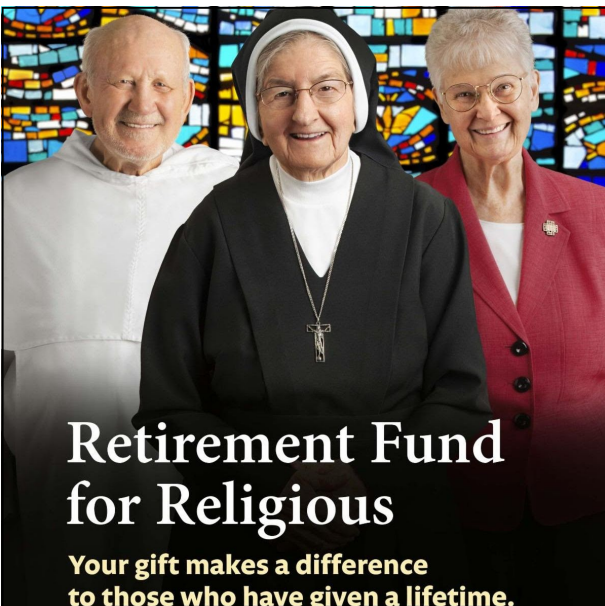

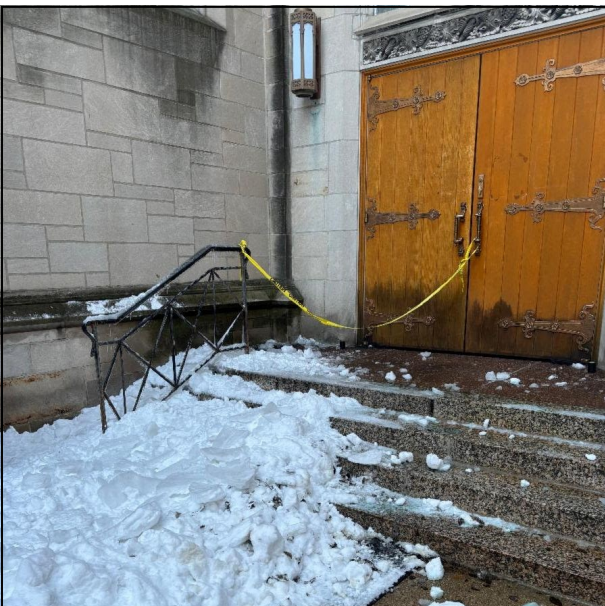
Growing in Faith

I would like to give a personal reflection on Advent this year. I must admit, it can be difficult for me to get into the spirit of the season. Why? Because I worked retail years before I became a musician full-time and it was through that experience that I developed a “negative” feeling towards the holidays.

It's what companies and our system of society does as soon as Thanksgiving is over. Starting with Black Friday, the commercialization and push to buy and buy slaps us all pretty hard in the face—something that I experienced as a retail worker in a very real way. Ultimately, there is no time to rest or be in a state of peace. I promise you will never see me shopping on that day. (I hide in my condo and put up the Christmas tree with my wife, Suzanne, and our dogs).

So, with that in mind, how did I eventually begin to reconcile this and enjoy the season again? It was being reminded that community—and allowing oneself to enter a time of contemplation and waiting—is what is at the heart of it all. I particularly love the quiet music of Advent, for example, the hymn “In the Bleak Midwinter.” These pieces help me focus on meditation and prayer and guide me through the noisiness of the season, keeping me centered (and now excited) for what's to come.
