Supporters may place orders by the half dozen for chicken in green sauce, cheese and jalapeño (vegetarian), or black bean and cactus (vegan). Growing in Faith for February 1

Thanks to St. Gertrude's Adult Formation Committee and parishioner Jim Neafsy, some of us have recently begun an Ignatian Retreat. At the beginning of the book that is guiding our prayer, *The Ignatian Adventure*, author Kevin O'Brien, SJ includes a prayer by Thomas Merton. Two lines from that prayer read: "[My Lord God] I believe that the desire to please you does in fact please you. And I hope I have that desire in all that I am doing."

What pleases God? Many Scripture passages answer that question, and in today's Gospel the most familiar ones are the Beatitudes. Jesus tells his followers: *Be poor in spirit. Be meek. Be merciful. Be clean of heart. Be peacemakers.*

I write this reflection in the aftermath of the killing of Renée Good in Minneapolis. I can tell myself that the world I live in is so much more horrible than it has ever been and that I don't know what to do. Yet millennia ago, Jesus was sent to redeem such a world — a world of warring cultures, unjust institutions, extreme wealth and poverty, and scapegoats. He named, blessed, graced, pleasing to God — those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, those who are persecuted falsely, and those who mourn. The Beatitudes make it pretty clear what is human and holy to God.

With Thomas Merton I pray, "I hope that I will never do anything apart from that desire [to please you]. And I know that if I do this, you will lead me by the right road, though I may know nothing about it."

Growing in Faith for February 8

In another decade, I volunteered at the St. Thomas of Canterbury soup kitchen still located in the Uptown neighborhood. This soup kitchen started in 1978, was a mutual endeavor of the Saint Francis Catholic Worker House and St. Thomas of Canterbury parishioners.

When the church doors were opened every Tuesday and Friday at 5:30 pm, guests were welcomed inside and quickly filled the warm church basement. No one waited in line. The tables were already set and guests chose their own seat. Volunteers walked briskly back and forth between the tables and the kitchen to serve each guest soup, bread, salad, beverages and dessert.

Many of the guests were homeless or living paycheck to paycheck facing food insecurity. No questions were asked, and everyone was welcome. Volunteers were also encouraged to find a seat at a table and join in conversation with dinner guests. We were a community, having conversations and forming relationships.

Working at the soup kitchen was a rich experience for me and I am still reaping blessings from those years. I always volunteered to scour the industrial sized pots and pans that were used to cook the soup. After the dishes were washed and the pots were clean enough, I headed home with a larger heart. That's what happens when you share soup with Christ in a church basement.
