Two weekends ago, six engaged couples participated in one of our parish-based Pre-Cana programs to assist them in preparing for life as married couples. Also recently, the young

people preparing for the reception of the Sacrament of Confirmation in March participated in a retreat day, together exploring the gift of the Holy Spirit in their lives.

Some of our volunteers who help visit the sick and homebound have been working to bring their VIRTUS training up to the current requirement. And every week NCA is assisted by members of the Archdiocesan School Office in the many important nuances of COVID protocols and other, more traditional aspects of education. The Peace & Justice Committee has been working to get ready for the Lenten season and some parishioners are working with the jail ministry through Kolbe House.

I mention all these different activities and ministries because all of them are partially made possible by some of the different services/offices of the Archdiocese of Chicago of which we as a parish are members. The Archdiocese has a broader view and a much greater outreach that St. Gertrude or any individual parish. This includes our annual participation in the outreach of Catholic Relief Services to people in crisis throughout the world.

This weekend, we begin the annual three-weekend presentation for the Annual Catholic Appeal. It is important to be aware that we are always part of the universal church, not just our own small Christian community looking inward. As members of the larger church, it is fulfilling one of our gospel imperatives to look beyond ourselves to the greater world and its needs.


The Annual Catholic Appeal (ACA) makes possible the training and facilitating of so many ministries and activities that no one parish could sustain by itself. Things such as training our facilitator couples for the parish-based Pre Cana program; assisting our young people throughout the Archdiocese with their sacramental preparation; keeping all our children safe through the VIRTUS program, Protecting God's Children; providing help and direction for our Catholic schools and Religious Education programs; offering guidance and resources for peace and justice initiatives, as well as outreach to all those who, as Pope Francis is always reminding us, are living on the periphery.

Pick-up Your MWA Super Bowl Tamale Benefit Orders

The Midwest Workers Association (MWA) will be in the back of church this Saturday, February 12 in the evening and Sunday, February 13 after Mass to distribute orders for their Super Bowl Sunday Tamale Benefit.

If you are interested in tamales and did not place an order, please check with a MWA volunteer to see if they have extra. The suggested donations for the

homemade tamales are \$10 for a half dozen and \$20 for a dozen. There are three kinds to choose from and they come in half-dozen bags of a kind. Choices include chicken in a green sauce, vegetarian "queso y rajas" (cheese and jalapeno), and vegan black bean and cactus.

This benefit generates critical support for MWA's Winter Survival Campaign. The campaign includes winter door-to-door membership canvasses, utility bill advocacy (to stop shutoffs and restore service for members), warm coat & blanket distributions, check-in calls to members and more.



Growing in Faith

In today's Gospel, we hear the familiar words of the Beatitudes which appear in both Luke and Matthew. Unlike Matthew's Sermon on the Mount, Luke's version is often called the Sermon on the Plain. Jesus is "on the level" with his disciples. Jesus "raises his eyes toward his disciples" before speaking, not toward heaven as I mistakenly assumed. What must it have felt like to have that eye contact with Jesus?

Again, I incorrectly expected to read "blessed are THE poor...
THE meek...THE merciful..." as it in Matthew's version. But no, we are in Luke, who writes "Blessed are YOU who are poor...Blessed are YOU who are hungry...". There's an immediacy and directness to Jesus' words. And just as I'm feeling comforted, I read "woe to YOU who are rich...woe to YOU who are filled... woe to YOU who laugh now...". My pantry is overflowing with

food. I love to laugh more than anything...which "side" am I on?

I don't want to sanitize or spiritualize any of the power of this Gospel. Jesus is deeply concerned with the economics of injustice and the societal sins of exclusion and oppression. I imagine it was a mixed crowd of "haves" and "have nots" on the plain that day, perhaps not unlike our city and country today. Out of his radical love for all of us, Jesus meets us where we are, "levels" with us. We are all hungry for hope and healing. The Beatitudes guide us to follow Jesus' path of compassion and love.


