The Fourth Sunday of Lent

From Fr. Mike Gabriel

This weekend, the Gospel reading opens with this: "As Jesus passed by, he saw a man born blind. His disciples asked him, 'Rabbi, who

sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?' Jesus answered, 'Neither he nor his parents sinned, it is so that the works of God might be revealed through him.'"

These words made me think about my favorite hymn. I love music, it's a big part of my life, and I recently read a story about the author of one of my most favorite hymns, "Blessed Assurance". I had the song sung at my first Mass of thanksgiving as a newly ordained priest and again at my 25th anniversary of priesthood. Fanny Crosby was the songwriter. When she was a six-week-old baby, she contracted an eye infection. A man posing as a doctor gave her the wrong treatment and within a few days, she was blind.

I cannot imagine my reaction if that was to happen to me. I assume that I would be bitter and angry to name a few feelings. Instead, Fanny Crosby used the gifts that she had and wrote poems and hymns, 8,000 to be exact, one being "Blessed Assurance".

Like the man in today's Gospel, his blindness was not caused by his parents or by any of his sins, but a way that God's works could be shown. I pray that tragedy never comes into your life, but if it does, remember that everything can be used to praise and glorify God!







Prayer Walk Around Cook County Jail on Palm Sunday, April 2

The Kolbe House Jail Ministry, part of the Archdiocese of Chicago, is inviting Chicago-area Catholics and any other interested participants, to gather outside the Cook County Jail on Palm Sunday, April 2 at 3:00 pm for a 2-mile prayer walk around the Cook County Jail complex. There will be 5 stations along this route.

This event offers us an opportunity to show solidarity with people affected by incarceration. The event will begin and end at Kolbe House, located at 2434 S. California Ave. in Chicago.

The prayers at each of the 5 stations include intentions for the victims of violence, for mercy toward those who have caused grave harm, and for the families of those who are incarcerated. We will pray intentions for healing from trauma, for breaking the bonds of addiction and mental illness, eradicating racism, shining a light on and recognizing the harm caused by the legal system and for "a reimagining of our church and our community, to be one where no one is excluded or deemed unworthy."

Growing in Faith

Our readings this Sunday suggest truth will be discovered in unexpected places. In our first reading, God makes the unlikely choice to anoint young David. "Not as man sees does God see, because man sees the appearance but the Lord looks into the heart," says Samuel.

Our second reading invites us to live as, "children of light". The Gospel reveals the miraculous power of Jesus to restore sight of an alleged sinner. Young David, children, a sinner? The mystery of salvation is somehow discovered where we would least expect it, our readings seem to suggest.

Perhaps this message is timely? How often do I seek light and truth through the easy and obvious: the emulated celebrity, the powerful politician, or the gold enshrouded cleric. And isn't Lent and its disciplines of prayers, fasting, and almsgiving to bring us to the foot of the cross where a lowly carpenter born of a single teenage mother dies the disgraceful death of a criminal? Isn't this the least expected place of all for the redemption of the world?

In a world literally dark and deep in the despair of violence, corruption, and death, it can be hard to find light. Really hard. Maybe I should stop looking for it on Facebook? Perhaps light lies beneath the dark places we think not to look: at the margins, where the poor and despised enjoy the special favor of our loving God.
