

St. Gertrude is once again hosting our annual Christmas greenery sale this Christmas season, with balsam pine trees, wreaths, and garland available for purchase. Proceeds benefit St. Gertrude's ministries.

Each 6' Christmas tree is \$55. Three different sized wreaths are available—the 18" wreath is \$25, the 24" is \$27, and the 36" is \$35. Garland is also available for \$40 per 5' length.

Please note, the boundaries for deliveries are north to Oakton, south to Irving Park, and east of the North Shore Channel.

Greenery will also be sold at the playlot on the west side of the Social Hall, 1401 W. Granville Avenue, on the first four Sundays of December: the 1st, 8th, 15th, and 22nd from 11:30 am to 1:00 pm. Only cash and checks will be accepted for in-person purchases.

Growing in Faith: God's Hands are Our Hands

The wonderful first reading from 1 Kings this weekend is a reminder that not only will God provide for us, he provides through us.

We have this simple story of the poor widow in Zarephath. She is met by Elijah, who asks her for water and then a bit of bread. She and her son are starving and she only has a "handful of flour...and a little oil" which she thinks will be their last meal. Elijah asks her to go and make a cake for him from the flour and oil she has at home. And when she does, her oil and flour never run out for a year. Like the



loaves and the fishes, God's providence is manifested. But in this story, it is Elijah who is the agent of God's providence.

My friend, Terry, told me about a Mexican playwright named Wilberto Canton who wrote a play called *Nosotros somos Dios*, which translated means We are God. And it is about someone who stood up to protect those he loved. His life was sacrificed in the act of stepping forward. He, through his actions, was the agent of God's providence.

I believe God doesn't work through smoke and mirrors. He works through us. Each of us have stories in our lives of miracles that have happened. I was in a car accident years ago that should have killed me. Instead, it changed my life; but not without the intervention of many "agents" along the way.

"God's Hands are Our Hands." Amen.
