Catholic Campaign for Human Development: Working on the Margins - Second Collection This Weekend

On November 16th and 17th, there will be a second collection for CCHD at all of the masses. Additionally, we will welcome guest speaker Ed Jacobs, who is the former Director of Franciscan Outreach and a long-time volunteer for CCHD.

Ed will speak about the important work and our participation in the Catholic Campaign for Human Development. There are envelopes at the back of Church.

More About the Catholic Campaign for Human Development

For more than 50 years, the Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD) has supported organizations that combat poverty and improve the lives of people in communities across the United States.

Not only do CCHD-funded organizations advocate with civic, business, and community religious leaders to improve access to affordable housing, job and educational opportunities, and rights for immigrants—they also respond quickly to urgent needs when communities experience emergencies.

An effective response to natural disasters begins with effective planning before disasters occur. In New Orleans and surrounding areas in southern Louisiana, CCHD is helping Together New Orleans develop a project called Community Lighthouse, which will equip 85 congregations and community organizations with commercial scale solar power and backup battery storage. This effort will form a network of response centers ready to serve communities in a hurricane or other natural disaster once the solar power equipment is completely installed.

By using solar power and backup batteries, the response centers can continue operating in the event of power loss—but they will also be using clean, renewable energy rather than fossil fuels that contribute to climate change and pollution.

When you support CCHD, you help local communities across the country innovate and work together to solve their own unique challenges. Twenty-five percent of your contribution stays in your diocese to support the organizations addressing your community's needs for housing, jobs, and educational opportunities—and for keeping the lights on during a storm.

We are currently in the process of a pastoral search. The PPC will be hosting listening sessions on the following dates/times:


- Sunday, November 17 from 11:30 am-1:00 pm in the Gym

St. Gertrude is once again hosting our annual Christmas greenery sale this Christmas season, with balsam pine trees, wreaths, and garland available for purchase. Proceeds benefit St. Gertrude's ministries.

Each 6' Christmas tree is \$55. Three different sized wreaths are available—the 18" wreath is \$25, the 24" is \$27, and the 36" is \$35. Garland is also available for \$40 per 5' length.

Growing in Faith

"But the wise shall shine brightly like the splendor of the firmament, And those who lead the many to justice shall be like the stars forever." ~ Daniel 12:3

This week I've been thinking about two men whose commitment to justice shone like the stars.

Thursday marked the 28th anniversary of Cardinal Bernardin's death. We remember him for his powerful image of the seamless garment, an ethic that connects all issues that threaten human life. We recall his pastoral letter on peace; his Common Ground Initiative; the AIDS task force he established; his work on interfaith dialogue; the false accusation he overcame and forgave; and the honest and graceful way he faced his own death.



Alexei Navalny rallied and inspired millions while suffering a near-fatal poisoning, an acid attack, arrests, beatings, and imprisonments for his work in exposing corruption in Russian politics and for leading opposition to the Putin Regime. He died in a penal colony in the Arctic Circle eight months ago. His widow, Yulia, just published his memoir *Patriot*, an amazing testament of courage. In his final message, Navalny credited his Christian faith as impelling and helping him endure.

Thinking about Bernardin and Navalny in this historic moment challenges and encourages me. These days, scoundrels and rogues in public life are occupying too much of my attention. It is demoralizing. As an antidote, I am drawing hope from those who illumine our way by their work for a more just world. Their example is like a shining star showing the way forward.
