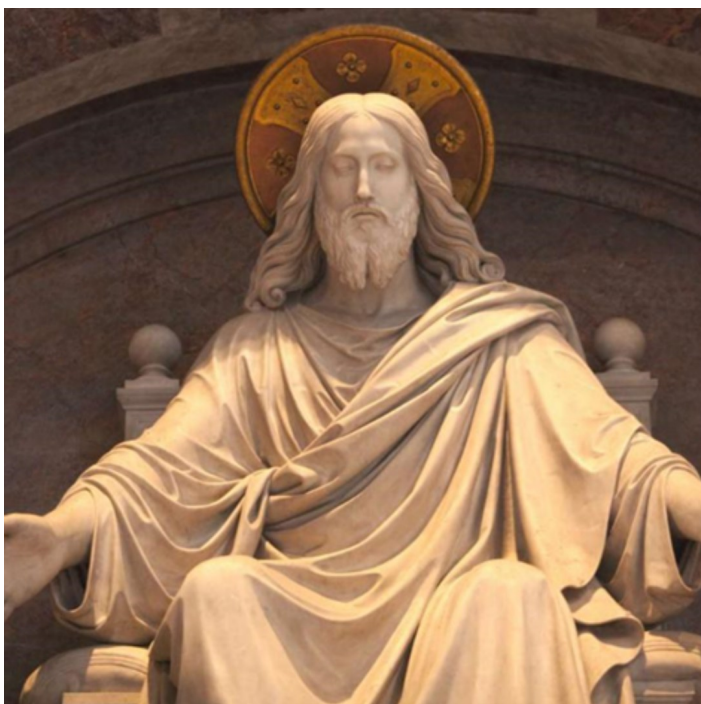

Today's celebration of the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe celebrates Christ's reign of love, mercy, and justice—a kingship unlike any earthly power. This Weekend: Second Collection for the Catholic Campaign for Human Development

The annual Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD) collection is this weekend. For more than 50 years, CCHD has partnered with community organizations to address the root causes of poverty in the United States.

By supporting groups that help people help themselves, CCHD works to break the cycle of poverty—an effort that lies at

the very heart of our faith. Through CCHD grants, community members come together to create jobs, improve neighborhoods, keep schools safe and enriching for children, and raise up future leaders right here in the Archdiocese of Chicago.

Working on the Margins

The Catholic Church has always taught us, through the words of Sacred Scripture and the witness of saints like Francis of Assisi, that the natural world is created by God, that it is good, and that humans have a special duty to care for creation so that it benefits not only themselves but also future generations. Today we live in a time where pollution, climate change, and poor agricultural practices harm creation and place us all in danger.

In 2015, Pope Francis responded to this environmental crisis by issuing the encyclical *Lauda-to Si'* (*On Care for Our Common Home*), in which he emphasizes the connection between humanity and nature and calls for "the whole human family together to seek a sustainable and integral development" (no. 13).

This spirit of cooperation, sustainability, and human dignity animates the work of organizations like La Cosecha Community Supported Agriculture, a cooperative farm network in Albuquerque, New Mexico, which makes locally grown, sustainable, and nutritious foods available to low-income people. With support from the Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD), La Cosecha has expanded its outreach beyond Albuquerque to 11 rural New Mexico counties, increased year-round accessibility to healthy produce and other food products, and obtained a US Department of Agriculture Good Agricultural Practices food-safety certification for its cooperative farm partners.

CCHD-funded organizations show how we can care for the environment, address the needs of the poor, and support responsible and sustainable local businesses at the same time. When you participate in the CCHD collection, you help not only other communities but also your own, because 25% of your contribution remains in your diocese to create local solutions to poverty.

St. Gertrude is once again hosting our annual Christmas greenery sale, with a limited number of balsam pine trees, wreaths, and garland available for purchase. Our Christmas greenery sale is a great opportunity for parishioners to get ready for the holidays while supporting St. Gertrude ministries.



Each 6' Christmas tree is \$55. Three different sized wreaths are available—the 18" wreath is \$25, the 24" is \$27, and the 36" is \$35. Garland is also available for \$40 per 5' length.

An Ignatian Retreat in Daily Life: First Information Session is Tuesday, December 2

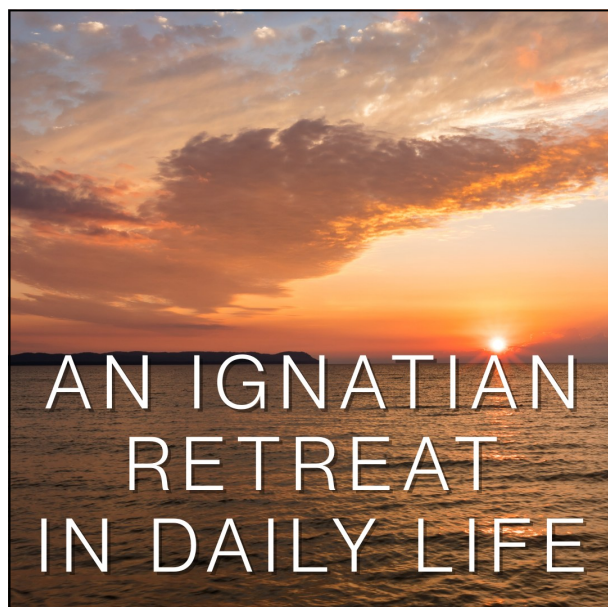
An "Ignatian Retreat in Daily Life" will begin this coming January and end in June. The retreat follows the basic themes of the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius, but will take place in the midst of daily life rather than at a retreat center.

Participants commit to praying on themes from Scripture which will be selected for each day of the retreat. Small groups of retreatants will meet once a week to share their prayer experiences and receive guidance on the next week's themes.

The director of the retreat will be Jim Neafsey, a parishioner at St. Gertrude's who has given Ignatian retreats for 50 years.

There will be a basic orientation to the retreat offered in December. Information sessions will last 45 minutes. Information sessions will take place in the Ministry Center next Tuesday, December 2 at 7:00 pm, Sunday, December 7 at 11:30 am (after Mass), and Saturday, December 13 at 9:00 am.

Each session will cover the same content, so you only need to come to one session. They are intended to help clarify what the retreat entails and whether it fits with your desires and pattern of life at this time. Deepen Your Faith & Hope This Advent: 3-Part Series Offered

Session One, *Pondering in Our Hearts: Lectio Divina and the Virtue of Hope*, is Wednesday, December 3

"The season of Advent means there is something on the horizon the likes of which we have never seen before. It is not possible to keep it from coming because it will. That's just how Advent works. What is possible is to not see it, to miss it, to turn just as it brushes past you.

So stay. Sit. Linger. Tarry. Ponder. Wait. Behold. Wonder. For now, stay. Wait. Something is on the

horizon."

As Jan Richardson reminds us, Advent calls us to slow down—to watch, wait, and open ourselves to the mystery that is already unfolding in our midst. It is a season of quiet anticipation and spiritual renewal, inviting us to notice what is coming to birth within us and within our community.

This Advent, the Adult Spirituality and Formation Committee invites you to join a special three-part series designed to deepen that journey of awareness and hope. Each session offers a unique way to encounter the sacred—through prayer, art, and reflection—as we prepare our hearts for the coming of Christ.

All sessions will take place from 7:00–8:30 pm in the Ministry Center Chapel. You are welcome to attend any or all.

Session one is Wednesday, December 3, titled *Pondering in Our Hearts: Lectio Divina and the Virtue of Hope* with Patricia Sullivan and Karen Spear.

Over the millennia, countless Christians have sought a closer relationship with God through contemplative reading of Scripture and other sacred texts. Rather than reading for information, pondering the Word of God and words of God involves contemplative openness of mind and heart to what the Scripture or other texts have to reveal to us.

Karen Spear and Pat Sullivan, both experienced practitioners of *Lectio Divina*, or sacred reading, will introduce the practice, focusing on a meditation from Fr. Richard Rohr on the theological virtue of hope. In this session, we will walk through the four moments of *Lectio Divina* as we open ourselves to hear the wisdom of Fr. Richard about how we can have hope in a time of turmoil as we enter the Advent season.

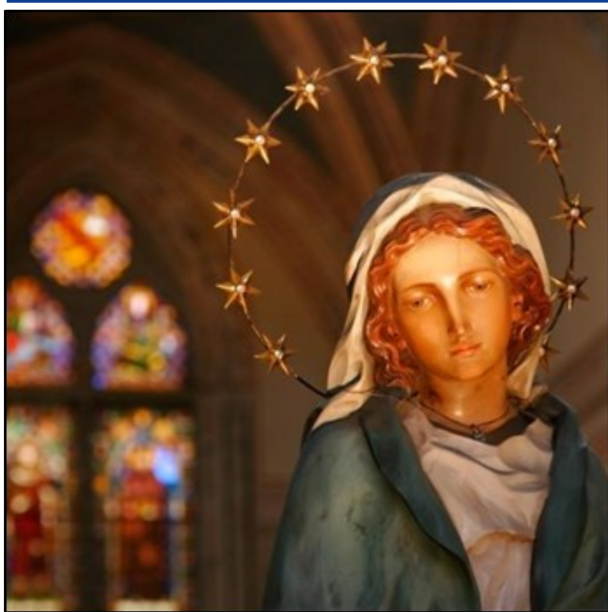

Growing in Faith

There are over 223,000 Catholic churches in the world. Each displays a cross. Has there ever been a king whose symbol is more widespread than Christ's?

The cross is brutal, the bloody mockery of an oppressor. We should shield our children's eyes from it. Has there ever been a king whose symbol is more disturbing than Christ's?

But there it is. The cross. The seat of Jesus' kind of kingship. Not a golden throne, but an executioner's tool.

223,000 crosses cannot be ignored. The cross shows us where to stand. As Pope Leo writes in *Dilexi Te*, "When the Church kneels beside a leper, a malnourished child or an anonymous dying person, she fulfills her deepest vocation: to love the Lord where he is most disfigured."

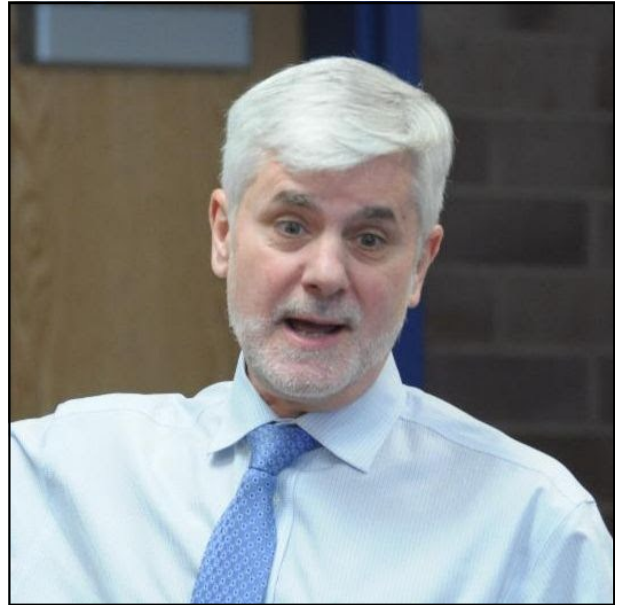
We cannot walk the path to holiness without standing with the persecuted. This is not consolation for me. This sounds like trouble.

The cross shows us how to stand. We must be willing to pay the price. Like Jesus, we cannot hold anything back. As Dietrich Bonhoeffer wrote, there is no cheap grace. This is not consolation for me. I prefer my religion to be painless.

The cross calls the question. Again, Pope Leo, "The Church knows that in every rejected migrant, it is Christ himself who knocks at the door of the community." Am I in, or am I out? This is not consolation for me. I prefer to stand on the sidelines.

The cross is trouble. It challenges us about where and how we stand. It calls the question – are we with Jesus' kind of kingship? Over a billion Catholics signed themselves with the cross today..., someone should have warned us.
