### From Fr. Rich

*"Justice shall flourish in His time, and fullness of peace forever."* 

We are waiting for nothing less than the

fulfillment of the prophecy we hear in the Advent Psalm. Justice and peace established and lasting forever! Our stance, or better yet, our stances, are to work for justice and peace as if it all depends upon us, but to be patient with its arrival because it all really depends upon God!

In other words -- as is true every Advent -- we are invited into a stance of being patient. Which stand in direct contradiction to everything we expect from our modern,

industrialized, mechanized society. We have grown up assured we will be able to get things we want much more quickly. After all, Amazon isn't making all that money because we are kept waiting!

But God's way is not our way. And we learn only after lots of frustration, that God's time is not our time.

In every Advent we are always about three different times: the salvation by our God which happened in real time two thousand years ago; the salvation we experience right now in this present moment; and the universal salvation that will happen when Christ comes again to gather all things unto himself.

As we prepare for the celebration of our Lord's birth at Christmas, what might each of us do that combines both our

participation in this saving miracle, even as we practice patience for the day when all will be made whole?

### Is the Pandemic Over?

In a word, the answer to that question is, "No." However, we have moved into a different attitude towards covid and how we can function in society. So, most people are no longer wearing masks, etc. Part of this transition into this "new normal" is also about how we practice our faith.

In today's bulletin is the letter from the Cardinal wherein he announces that the dispensation he granted when covid first appeared, which allowed us all to not gather for Sunday Eucharist if we felt our health and safety could be compromised, is being lifted. Now he invites us to return to the pre-pandemic policy of attending Mass every Sunday.

On our part, we will keep providing the live-stream 10:30 am Sunday Mass as long as we are able, and parishioners find it helpful -- especially those unable to get to church for any number of health or safety reasons.

This weekend, in cooperation with the Cardinal's letter, we will be renewing baptismal promises and our Profession of Faith after the homily and that rite will conclude with the blessing of the baptismal water.

# Letter from Cardinal Cupich

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

In so many ways—large and small—the pandemic has upended our lives together. Families and, in a special way, young people, have faced distressing struggles. The pandemic made our connections with one another



challenging and difficult. Exactly in that moment when we truly needed supportive relationships with one another, we found ourselves separated. Sadly, this included the relationships and connections that we have in and through the Church.

We did our best to move forward and many parishes offered online Sunday Masses, and went even further and established prayer lines and reached out to those in need. The TV Mass that I celebrated helped to keep us connected as a community of faith in Chicagoland. So many of you have told me how healing and comforting those Masses have been.

In the meanwhile, we are in a new moment. With vaccinations and boosters, restrictions on public gatherings have eased up. Many people feel more comfortable returning to Church. Yet, we know there are some elderly and immuno-comprised persons who are still not ready to return. And they should not return. These vulnerable brothers and sisters have an excusing cause for being absent and for this reason I will continue the TV Mass on ABC for the present time. But for the rest of us, I have decided, in consultation with my advisors, to lift the general dispensation from the obligation of attending Sunday Mass as we begin a new Church year on the First Sunday of Advent, November 26-27.

My hope is that the First Sunday of Advent will provide us with a fresh start to take up again our life together as a community of faith that gathers to worship God. I have asked our pastors to begin the Masses on November 26-27 with the traditional lighting of the Advent wreath. After the homily your pastor will lead the community in a renewal of baptismal promises, acknowledging that we owe our obligation to participate in Sunday Mass to God but also to each other. Our common profession of faith and of our desire to turn away from sin, will be concluded by a sprinkling rite with the waters of baptism.

Let this occasion of our renewal of faith and life, which we all so much want, provide us with a fresh start as we recommit ourselves to worship God and to be supportive of each other week after week as we gather around the Table of the Lord to be nourished and renewed.
