
Veterans Day is Tuesday, November 11



Celebrate the Feast of St. Gertrude at our "Brewed at St. Gertrude" on November 16



Catholic Campaign for Human Development: Working on the Margins - Second Collection November 22-23

The annual Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD) collection will take place the weekend before Thanksgiving. For more than 50 years, CCHD has partnered with community organizations to address the root causes of poverty in the United States.

By supporting groups that help people help themselves, CCHD works to break the cycle of poverty—



an effort that lies at the very heart of our faith. Through CCHD grants, community members come together to create jobs, improve neighborhoods, keep schools safe and enriching for children, and raise up future leaders right here in the Archdiocese of Chicago.

Care for Real Collection is November 22 & 23: SNAP Benefits & Food Pantries

Our Care for Real collection drive is November 22 and November 23 before and after masses.

Please note, our food-insecure neighbors, and Care for Real, are in urgent need of support. Partial benefits went out to SNAP recipients on November 7. However, many customers' benefits have been cut altogether.

According to the U.S. Department of Agriculture, which oversees SNAP, this means that recipients will only receive about 50% of their usual monthly



benefits in November, and it may be delayed. While a federal judge has ordered the Trump administration to fully fund the SNAP program for November, an appeal has been filed.

In Illinois alone, this impacts 1.9 million residents and food pantries like Care for Real are now facing an overwhelming surge in demand.

St. Gertrude is once again hosting our annual Christmas greenery sale, with a limited number of balsam pine trees, wreaths, and garland available for purchase. Our Christmas greenery sale is a great opportunity for parishioners to get ready for the holidays while supporting St. Gertrude ministries.

Each 6' Christmas tree is \$55. Three different sized wreaths are available—the 18" wreath is \$25, the 24" is \$27, and the 36" is \$35. Garland is also available for \$40 per 5' length.

Greenery will also be sold at the playlot on the west side of the Social Hall, 1401 W. Granville Avenue, on November 30, December 7, December 14, and December 21 from 11:30 am to 1:00 pm. Only cash and checks will be accepted for in-person purchases.

The option to purchase greenery online or via paper forms will be available soon.

Deliveries

Deliveries will be offered for a \$6 fee. They will take place on Sunday, December 7 and Sunday, December 14 from noon - 4:00 pm. The greenery team will do their best to accommodate your preferred delivery date and will reach out to notify you when to expect your order.

Please note, the boundaries for deliveries are north to Oakton, south to Irving Park, and east of the North Shore Channel.

Additionally, the Rosary is said every Monday through Saturday in the church right after the 7:30 am mass. Please consider joining us in church—we would love to have you!



Growing in Faith

In the Gospel today, Jesus protests the mockery of God's temple by the wealthy, powerful religious authorities who had turned the holy place of God's reassuring love and faithfulness into a marketplace.

It was all about money. Birds or animals raised according to the Torah could only be purchased with the Tyrian shekel, which had a higher silver content. So people had to exchange their money—and they were already so poor! Jesus was inflamed, and he turned over all those tables, and the money went flying! God's temple is a place of prayer for everyone.

This week, on November 10, we celebrate the feast day of Pope Leo the Great (440–461), a champion



of the poor, who exhorted: "It is but godly and just that we too should help others with that which the Heavenly Father has mercifully bestowed on us. For there are full many who have no fields, no vineyards, no olive-groves, whose wants we must provide out of the store which God has given." (Homily 16)

And how can we not think of our own Pope Leo XIV, the missionary to Peru's poorest, who was himself inspired by Pope Leo XIII, "the Pope of the Workers"? This week, may we rededicate ourselves to stand up for the poor—in words and in loving actions of respectful care.of your own saintly souls.




Help Needed on our Sandwich Making Team

Altar of Remembrance and Book of the Dead



We are thrilled to begin using this new resource at the start of the new liturgical year on November 30, the First Sunday of Advent.








Living with Grief Workshop on Saturday November 22
