From Father Rich

Happy Easter!

In the tradition of some of the Eastern churches, believers greet each other with a special Easter greeting, "Christ is Risen!" And the other person responds, "He is truly Risen!" In that simple exchange is contained the joy, the wonder, and the surprise of our salvation. It is almost more than we can bear, more than we dared to believe.



In such human moments of inexpressible joy, we often turn to two very different strategies. Sometimes the enormity of what we are experiencing leaves us dumbstruck—incapable of speaking because what we are processing goes beyond any words we know. And the other option is that we find others sharing the same experience and with whom we sing and cry out and shout in gladness about our good fortune. Easter summons both reactions from us. In quiet moments, we contemplate what it means that our sins are forgiven, our lives are already caught up in God through Christ Jesus, and we will spend eternity with the God who loves us beyond words or even imagination. Which is also what we do in voice as we sing joyous Alleluias and make wonderful noise unto the Lord in Glorias and other songs of rejoicing.

One of the great truths of Easter is that this gift is for everyone—regardless of how well their Lenten observance was carried out—if at all! It is for those who believe deeply as well as those who struggle with their faith. It is for the wealthy as well as for the poor—and everyone in between. It is for family and friends and neighbors, as well as sworn enemies and those we fear and mistrust. It is for children and for senior citizens and for every age. It is for those that are LGBTQ and every other parsing of the human experience. It is for those successfully married, for those who are divorced, for those living together without marriage, and for those trying to figure out just what their relationship is. It is for the employed, unemployed, underemployed, and retired. It is for students in pre-school, post-graduate school, and all levels of education. It is for the healthy and the sick, for able-bodied and disabled, for the athletes and the nerds, the short and the tall, the fat and the fit. It is for the weak and the strong, the articulate and inarticulate, the hard of hearing and deaf, and those who can hear a pin drop. It is for those with 20/20 vision and those with glasses or contacts and the blind. It is for those with children, those without children, and those who are children.

God's love knows no bounds. So the Resurrection of God's Son, Jesus, cannot be limited to those who think they can draw those limitations. It doesn't depend upon those who agree with me or you or the Church or anyone. God's love is here for everyone.

Always, in the end and in the middle and in the beginning, it is all about God's love for us. As we sometimes say in our prayers, "As it was in the beginning, is now and ever shall be. World without end. Amen!"

May you feel God's love in your life and in your heart. May you share that love with all those you encounter. For today we celebrate the greatest truth of our faith: Christ is Risen! Christ is truly Risen! Alleluia!

Growing in Faith

“Practice resurrection.” It is with this simple, yet powerful phrase, that Wendell Berry concludes his poem, *Manifesto: The Mad Farmer’s Liberation Front*. When I first read these words, I reacted physically. They touched something deep inside me, and I instinctively felt that this is what it means to be a disciple of Jesus Christ—to “practice resurrection” over and over again throughout the course of our life journey. This is what it means to experience conversion, not just once in a lifetime, but continually, as we embrace the mystery of a God who becomes known in the moments of our own “unknowing”, when we are invited, called, or compelled to allow ourselves to fall into the deep mystery of resurrected life.

As sisters and brothers of Jesus Christ, the Risen One, washed in the waters of Baptism and anointed in power of the Spirit, we, in faith, proclaim that, ultimately, there is no form of death that can lay hold to us. We are mandated to be witnesses of this in our

lives as individuals and as a community of disciples - to be about the work of proclaiming the Reign of God where the blind see with fresh eyes, those crippled by injustice and the burdens of life can walk, those who are excluded and marginalized are welcomed, and those whose lives have been deadened are raised to new life.

We live our lives *now* immersed in the resurrected life of Jesus. We “practice resurrection” as we proclaim with our own lives that the power of death in all its forms has been shattered. On this Easter Day we shout “Alleluia!” in praise of the God who, in the resurrected Christ, proclaims the Good News of ever-lasting life.

Dear Sisters and Brothers in the Risen Lord Jesus,

As we walk on our life journeys in this world, we may often feel overwhelmed. Struggle and suffering can mark our lives because of health issues, job insecurity, family concerns, or the painful loss of a loved one. The world itself, in Saint Paul's words, "has been groaning" (Roman 8:22), as it struggles with wars, violence, ecological degradation, economic injustice, and natural disasters. And as we are keenly aware this past year, the Church herself has struggled mightily with the shameful legacy of abuse and its mismanagement.

It seems that the landscape of our lives is entirely shaped by struggle and suffering. And that might seem to be the sum and substance of it all, but, in faith, we know that it is not. Our celebration of the Lord's Resurrection in this Easter season opens our eyes beyond this desperate landscape to a new and hope-filled horizon. There is more to the story than our struggle and suffering. In the Resurrection of Jesus, we can begin to see a new life ahead of us that God offers to us.

As we go forth in this Easter season, I am reminded of the great Psalm 118 that the Church so often prays: *I was thrust down, thrust down and falling, but the Lord was my helper. The Lord is my strength and my song; and has been my savior. There are shouts of joy and victory in the tents of the just. (vv. 13-15)*

May this Easter season renew within you and your loved ones the conviction that God is your helper and an abiding awareness of your victory in the Risen Lord Jesus.
