A Prayer for the Second Sunday of Advent

Dear Jesus, you entered our world on Christmas as the Prince of Peace. This Advent, as we strive to become the best version of ourselves, fill us with a deep and abiding peace. Help us share that peace with everyone we encounter, especially those who need it most. Amen.

From Father Rich

Although today's date is December 8, the feast we celebrate in church is the second Sunday of Advent. The Feast of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary, usually a Holy Day of Obligation, moves to Monday. And because it moves, the obligation part of the holy day is lifted. So Monday is the feast, but the obligation to attend Mass is not in effect for this year.

This week, we also celebrate the feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe, the Patroness of the Americas. Although this is a huge feast for many Hispanics, it is also an important feast for all of us who live in the Americas. When we consider these two Marian feasts, we see how connected we are both as people of the United States and as people of the Americas. The presence of the Blessed Mother under these two titles connects us as members of the Church and as people of this new world. And especially the image of Our Lady of Guadalupe reminds us of the importance of recognizing and respecting the native populations of these lands, truly our "elder" sisters and brothers in Christ. What permeates both feasts is the virtue of hope -- so necessary in our lives and such an important part of this Advent season. This would be a great week to spend some time reflecting on the role of Mary in our salvation history. She is an example of patience as we await the coming of the Lord more deeply into our lives and our world.

This is our parish Christmas Bazaar weekend! Be sure to stop by the gym Saturday or Sunday (December 7 - 8) and find the wonderful bargains available, the great selection of crafts, and the convenience of doing your Christmas shopping while you are supporting St. Gertrude parish! This week, we will be celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation for the children from the NCA Primary campus, and next week for the middle grades at St. Margaret Mary campus.

Next Sunday, December 15, we will celebrate our parish Advent Reconciliation Service at 1:00 pm in church. This service provides some quiet, reflective time, with Advent hymns and a few readings from scripture to guide our reflections. This service usually lasts about 45 minutes and is a great event to include in your Advent preparations for Christmas!

The Giving Trees are still in the back of church with ornaments available for those who would like to participate. Pick an ornament from the basket, take the attached sheet which explains which gifts is needed, place the ornament on the tree, then purchase the gift(s) and return them to church, unwrapped, by December 15 (next Sunday). 

Our Lady of Guadalupe

On a December morning in 1531, the Virgin Mary appeared in Mexico to Juan Diego, an indigenous Mexican farmer. During that first sacred encounter and in several more apparitions over the next few days, Mary spoke to Juan Diego in his native, Aztec language and asked him to petition the bishop to build a church. She instructed him to bring roses to the bishop, and when he opened his cloak to drop the flowers before the bishop's feet, all those present were stunned to see Our Lady's image painted on his cloak.

Why did Mary appear to Juan Diego rather than to the bishop himself? Mary's action is a sign of solidarity with those who might not be considered the most prestigious or powerful by society's standards. She shows that even a humble farmer, for example, has important contributions to make.

A Letter from Cardinal Cupich

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

During the weekend of December 7-8, 2019, our parishes will hold the Retirement Fund for Religious collection, an annual appeal that benefits some 30,000 senior sisters, brothers and religious order priests.

As Christians, we are called to "serve the Lord with gladness" (Ps 100:2). Our elderly religious offer a shining example of what it means to answer this call. During their days of active ministry, they worked tirelessly to build Catholic schools and hospitals, promote social justice, and embrace the neediest among us. In retirement, many continue in volunteer ministry, and all pray for the needs of our Church and world. Inspired by love, their service-past and present is marked by joy and a deep desire to do the will of God.

As you may know, many religious communities find it increasingly difficult to provide for aging members. Most older religious worked for little or no pay. Today, their communities do not have enough retirement savings. At the same time, health-care costs continue to rise, and fewer members are able to serve in compensated ministry.

Your gift to the Retirement Fund for Religious provides vital funding for medications, nursing care, and more. It also helps religious congregations plan for future retirement needs, even as they continue to serve the People of God.

For the almost forty years during which this collection has been taken, the Archdiocese of Chicago has been one of the most generous donors for this cause. I understand you are asked to support many worthy causes. I invite you only to give what you can. Most importantly, please pray for God's continued blessing on all our women and men religious. Rest assured, they are praying for you.

Week II: Love & Learning

Most of us are familiar with the idea of "tough love." It usually means we are in a situation where, for the good of the other person or persons involved, we need to enforce a certain discipline or impose certain boundaries or limits. Usually in these situations, the other person(s) might only be partly aware of what has brought them to that point, and often don't understand why a change in behavior or activity is necessary.

As we hear the preaching and prophesying of John the Baptist, we can imagine how difficult it must have been for many people to grasp the change he was talking about! The arrival of the Messiah in the way he showed up was certainly not what many believers expected! Even John would wonder if Jesus really was who he thought he was. By that time, John was already in prison, facing the end of his life. The assurance he received from Jesus in the response message was to remind John of what had been happening and how it fulfilled the promises.

In our own lives and in our own world, we are asked again, in this Advent season, to consider how we are responding to God's presence in our lives. The foundation is love, and the invitation is to learn anew what we may already have learned. But our lives have changed and our world has changed. So given this present moment, how is our faith journey going? Are there things I need to change to better be present to God? How am I treating my family members, my co-workers, my neighbors and friends?

The second candle of the wreath indicates that the journey, to which we need to be more attentive, is becoming increasingly brighter. How, then, can I walk in the light of the Lord?
