## SEVEN GIFTS OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

Review of our definitions of the Gifts of the Holy Spirit

Wisdom	Wisdom is to take past experiences and make them into good decisions	<b>Wisdom</b> is both the knowledge of and judgment about “divine things” and the ability to judge and direct human affairs according to divine truth.
Understanding	Understanding is to comprehend the truths of the Catholic faith and knowing how to follow them	<b>Understanding</b> is penetrating insight into the very heart of things, especially those higher truths that are necessary for our eternal salvation—in effect, the ability to “see”.
Counsel	Counsel is to seek out advice from God	<b>Counsel</b> allows a man to be directed by God in matters necessary for his salvation
Fortitude	Fortitude is the strength to be yourself and do Gods work in the world	<b>Fortitude</b> denotes a firmness of mind in doing good and in avoiding evil, particularly when it is difficult or dangerous to do so, and the confidence to overcome all obstacles, even deadly ones, by virtue of the assurance of everlasting life
Knowledge	Knowledge is something you get from experience, learning, prayer and other people	<b>Knowledge</b> is the ability to judge correctly about matters of faith and right action, so as to never wander from the straight path of justice
Piety	Piety is being faithful to God	<b>Piety</b> is, principally, revering God with filial affection, paying worship

		and duty to God, paying due duty to all men on account of their relationship to God, and honoring the saints and not contradicting Scripture. The Latin word <i>pietas</i> denotes the reverence that we give to our father and to our country; since God is the Father of all, the worship of God is also called piety
Fear of God	Fear of God Is to worship and respect God	<b>Fear of God</b> is, in this context, "filial" or chaste fear whereby we revere God and avoid separating ourselves from him—as opposed to "servile" fear, whereby we fear punishment

### **1 Corinthians 12: 27-31**

<sup>27</sup> Now you are the body of Christ, and each one of you is a part of it. <sup>28</sup> And God has placed in the church first of all apostles, second prophets, third teachers, then miracles, then gifts of healing, of helping, of guidance, and of different kinds of tongues. <sup>29</sup> Are all apostles? Are all prophets? Are all teachers? Do all work miracles? <sup>30</sup> Do all have gifts of healing? Do all speak in tongues<sup>[d]</sup>? Do all interpret? <sup>31</sup> Now eagerly desire the greater gifts.
