Baptism of the Lord

Sunday's Feast of the Baptism of the Lord is the bridge connecting the Christmas season to our return to Ordinary Time in the Church's liturgical calendar. With this feast, the season of Christmas comes to a close as Jesus begins his public ministry. This year, the section of Ordinary Time before the next season is brief, only five Sundays before the Lenten season begins on Ash Wednesday, February 17.

The Feast of the Lord's Baptism is also sometimes called the second of the three Epiphanies: the first is when the Magi came to do him homage, the second is when he was baptized by John and the heavens were opened and God's voice proclaimed him as God's Beloved Son, and the third is the miracle at

Cana when he first demonstrated who he was with the miracle of the water turned into wine.

But it would be a mistake if we thought the time of epiphanies was ended! Indeed, God continues to reveal the Divine Presence in so many ways every moment of every day. But we often miss these little revelations because we are distracted, upset, in crisis, or simply preoccupied. But if we can train ourselves to slow down for at least a few minutes each day, it is hard to miss the presence of God in the splendor of creation, in the lives of those we encounter every day, in the promptings of our hearts to do good for others, in every opportunity to love others as God has loved us.

With the start of this new year, the harder work of Renew My Church begins. The parishioners of St. Ignatius have begun the painful process of planning the close of their parish. Have you ever experienced a radically deeper appreciation of life, of a loved one, of something in nature — thus feeling freshly alive or falling in love all over again? Maybe a new, vivid awareness of the Spirit's presence is what happened in today's Gospel.

How else explain why Jesus would be baptized and receive the Spirit? Surely the Spirit was already within him! Perhaps Jesus' encounter with John was one of those highlight moments for him and his companions. It was so special that, recording the event years later, Mark pictured the heavens splitting and God's speaking those wondrous words: You are my beloved! Listen to him!

Have you ever had experiences of receiving assurance, in words or actions, that you were loved? My appreciation of my parents' unconditional love grows each day! Surely it grounds my belief that God's love sustains me. Additionally, God's Spirit sustains the entire creation with which I am interconnected.

In *Laudato Si'*, Pope Francis reminds us in paragraph 216: "... the life of the Spirit is not dissociated from the body or from nature or from worldly realities, but lived in and with them, in communion with all that surrounds us." Just think of that!

If you have ever felt the presence of divinity within yourself, within others and/or creation, pause today to treasure those experiences. Awareness of divinity deepens with prayerful reflection.

If you realize the importance of being assured of love, perhaps today you'll tell others — all living beings— how loved they are.
