October is Domestic Violence Awareness month. Domestic violence is not limited to any age, sex, socio-political division, economic status, geographic location, etc. It is present everywhere, among all people. Unless we are willing to recognize it, learn how to change behaviors, respect and assist victims of abuse, etc., we will never end this

Repair, Renew, Refresh

This is week five of our *Repair, Renew, Refresh* campaign to raise \$100,000 to supplement a recent gift from Ray Simon and the Polk Bros. Foundation. As of Wednesday, October 13, we have received \$47,000.00! With these funds, we hope to be able to address five needs in the parish:

1. Exterior repairs to the church and rectory **roofs** from some long-term damage, and the damage from February's severe snowstorm. This includes repairing and replacing certain sections of roofing, and all the **interior water damage** in both buildings.
2. Installation of three new **handrails** to provide accessibility for anyone stepping up from the main floor of church into the sanctuary, and from the main floor of the sanctuary onto the altar platform.
3. **Re-carpeting** the church. The current carpeting is over 30 years old and can't get any cleaner, nor can it be repaired any more.

4. Rebuilding the entrance **stairways** to the Parish Hall main entrance, and the south (accessible) entrance to the church.

5. Establishing the St. Gertrude **Catholic Education Support Fund** to assist parish families with children enrolled at NCA. This fund will be available for families in need both for enrolling new students, and for assisting families dealing with crises due to health, employment, or other unexpected situations.

A donation form is part of the ***Repair, Renew, Refresh*** brochure. Please complete the form, place it and your donation in the return envelope, in the Sunday Offertory, or drop it off at the rectory office, or mail it back.

Celebration of the Lord of Miracles/El Señor de los Milagros - October 14-17

A series of special events will take place this week at St. Ignatius Church, 6559 North Glenwood Ave, culminating in *La procesión del Señor de los Milagros* (the procession of the Lord of Miracles). This joyous Peruvian Catholic tradition takes place each October in Lima and in cities like Chicago with a Peruvian population.

It celebrates the mural of Jesus Christ in Lima known as *The Lord of Miracles (Señor de los Milagros)*, which remained standing after earthquakes in 1655, 1687, and 1746 destroyed most of the city. Each year, large crowds gather to celebrate this miracle with a procession, music, and food.

On Friday, October 22 from 9:00 am-12:30 pm, pro-bono attorneys from CDEL will help our parishioners and neighbors to complete and notarize personal legal documents such as powers of attorney wills, etc. This workshop will be in our Ministry Center and is the third one sponsored by our Heart to Heart Seniors Ministry.

Heart to Heart Update for September 2021

September events sponsored by our staff included the second of three workshops creating notarized legal documents such as powers of attorney, wills, etc., for our Edgewater neighbors. Pro bono attorneys from the Center for Elder and Disability Law completed these vital documents onsite in our Ministry Center. Our dedicated volunteers continued to make weekly telephone calls to our homebound seniors and assisted them with grocery shopping and getting them to and from medical appointments. We are so grateful to have them on our team!

An integral part of our Heart to Heart Seniors Ministry is our free Lending Closet serving all of Chicagoland and dispensing loans and occasional gifts of durable medical equipment such as wheelchairs, rollator walkers, knee scooters, tub transfer benches, shower stools, commodes, canes, and incontinence supplies. This month, we dispensed 37 pieces of this equipment to 23 individuals in 14 zip codes and accepted 16 donations from families who no longer needed these loans for their loved ones. We also helped to connect a family wishing to donate a hospital bed to a family

greatly in need of one.

A Blue Cross/Blue Shield van brought one woman, aged 83, to our door to pick up some medical equipment. And another woman drove up to us from 91st Street to obtain some equipment for her father's homecoming from Weiss Hospital after treatment for a stroke. In a note we received from her, she had this to say: "Thank you soooo much for your kindness and generosity...Everything worked out perfectly and I can't wait for my father's return home. On behalf of my father, myself and my family, we want to say once again, a super thank you to you, Heart to Heart, and St. Gertrude for your donation".

Synodal Church - What is This and How Does it Affect Us?

On September 18, as bishop of Rome, Pope Francis offered a reflection on

the synodal process he has initiated as a means of renewing the church in our time.

The Holy Father is asking the universal Catholic Church to take up a journey together to reflect on the theme: “For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, Mission.” Pope Francis has called this a time of “mutual listening that involves the entire People of God. But this listening is not about garnering opinions, taking a survey, but listening to the Holy Spirit, as we read in the book of Revelation: ‘Whoever has ears should listen to what the Spirit says to the churches’ (2:7).”

The word “synod” says it all, it means “journeying together.” As such, everyone has a part to play, for we are all gifted with the Spirit of Christ. It begins by each of us being in touch with the inner restlessness in our hearts.

There is always something missing in our lives. We all want to grow, and we want our church to be more responsive to the needs of its people. We should value this desire as a gift from God, who is a God of surprises. We should not be afraid of the challenges we face, the questions we find hard to answer, but instead be prepared for surprises, for Christ the Risen One is alive and active in the church and is always doing something new.

The church has been following the promptings of the Holy Spirit from its earliest days, as we read in the Acts of the Apostles, where Peter receives a disturbing vision in which he is told to eat things considered unclean. He then goes to the house of Cornelius, the pagan centurion, who also has a vision that God would hear his prayers.

This was a pivotal moment, for now those who were not part of the Jewish

faith could be recognized as being called by God to become disciples. Peter was hesitant, but the Spirit intervened in a way that represented a new moment in the Christian faith. As the pope observed: “The Spirit overcomes Peter’s resistance and opens a new chapter of missionary history. That is how the Spirit works.”

The story of salvation has repeatedly revealed God working in unexpected and new ways. The Holy Father recalls the story of Balaam as an example of how God’s plan will not be thwarted. Balaam failed to listen to God’s word because he was intimidated by the king, Balak. Because Balaam refused to defy the king, as God told him to do, the donkey he was riding spoke out in his stead. The point is that God’s Spirit will not be impeded.

“It is a story that teaches us to trust that the Spirit will always make his voice heard. Even a donkey can become the voice of God, can open our eyes and change our course when we go astray. If a donkey can do that, how much more can a baptized person, a priest, a bishop, a pope do it? We need to rely on the Holy Spirit, who uses all of creation to speak to us: he only asks us to clean out our ears, to hear better.”

We should have no doubt, the Holy Father tells us. “The Holy Spirit needs us. Listen by listening to each other. Leave no one behind or excluded.” We are “not strengthened simply by reforming structures or by giving instructions, offering retreats and conferences, by issuing guidelines and programs. All those things are good, but as part of something else, namely our rediscovery that we are a people meant to walk together, with one another and with all humanity.”

The Archdiocese of Chicago will join this journey in the first phase beginning this fall. More information about the synodal process will be made available

in the coming weeks and months.

There will be a kickoff at a special Mass on Sunday, October 24 at Holy Name Cathedral, scheduled for 5:30 pm. Let us all pray for the success of the synodal process, for our efforts in the archdiocese, and here at St. Gertrude Parish.

Growing in Faith

When James and John said, "Teacher, we want you to do for us whatever we ask of you," this sounds like the request of young children, needing to feel safe and comfortable. Jesus had been trying to explain to the disciples

that suffering was coming, as his message would be rejected by authorities. He explained that greatness is equated with servanthood, the opposite of power and authority.

As we “grow in faith,” we understand that being in relationship with God isn’t only about being held in God’s embrace, but also being ready to serve. We’re called by Jesus to be co-creators in the work of bringing forth God’s reign of love and justice. When James and John made their immature request and the other disciples “became indignant” about it, Jesus responded as a loving, yet challenging teacher, knowing that they struggled to understand his message.

Many teachers and guides have shaped my life. Dorothy Day, designated as “Servant of God” by the Church, practiced the works of mercy through her life in the Catholic Worker and challenged church and state authorities to change unjust structures. Her witness reminds us that we are called to both minister to our broken human family and speak and act out against the injustices that harm God’s family and creation. Her life inspired me to pursue my path as a social worker.

Who models servanthood for you, and how can you participate in God’s call to create a more just and loving world?
