

From Father Rich

Today we welcome Ed Jacob, who will speak to us about the important work accomplished through our generosity to the Catholic Campaign for Human Development. Please be attentive to his message. Next week's second collection is for the Catholic Campaign for Human Development.

Today is Veteran's Day. As we honor and pray for all the men and women who have served our nation in the Armed Forces throughout its history, let us join in prayers of thanksgiving for all the good their service has accomplished.

Next weekend is our Parish Feast Day celebration! We begin with the International Dinner this Friday evening, then celebrate St. Gertrude at all the weekend masses, including the celebration of the Anointing of the Sick at every mass, and also the All Are Welcome Concert on Saturday evening. At the 10:00 am Mass, we welcome the girls and boys preparing for the celebrations of their First Reconciliation later this month, and their First Holy Communion in the spring as we celebrate the Rite of Acceptance with them. While this makes for a packed weekend, it also reflects the vitality of St. Gertrude Parish.

Don't forget the annual ECRA Thanksgiving Service which is also next Sunday at 3:00 pm at the Ismaili Community Center at 6259 North Broadway. Members of St. Gertrude will be participating in this wonderful annual gathering. Please join us as we unite the prayers of our varied faiths in thanking God for our many blessings.

At the 10:00 am Mass next weekend, we will present the annual *Spirit of St. Gertrude Award* to Sr. Terri MacKenzie, SHCJ. Sr. Terri has been a wonderful and positive presence in the St. Gertrude Parish community for many years. She is a native Chicagoan, from St. Ignatius Parish, and has been a member of the Sisters of the Holy Child Jesus for 66 years. Sr. Terri's particular interest in care for our home planet has led her to be the force behind so many of our parish "Green" activities. She organized the first Earth Day celebration in 2005 and co-chaired the Green Team with Sandy Bowen for many years. This past year, she handed the reins of the Green Team over to George Tully to ensure it would continue once she moves back to her religious community next year. She has been part of the Growing in Faith group, often writing articles for the bulletin; helped with the organic garden at the Rectory; has participated in the Poetry Group, Refugee Committee, and the Green Team; and is the current author of the Care for our Common Home weekly bulletin blurbs referencing the *Laudato Si'* encyclical of Pope Francis. Sr. Terri is a 10:00 am Mass regular and has also served as a Greeter at the Saturday 5:00 pm Mass. She has led many Lent and Advent reflection groups, using original material found on her website, ecospiritualityresources.com. (These resources are used throughout the world.)

She loves St. Gertrude's welcoming spirit, liturgies, homilies, traditions, music, activities, emphasis on Gospel values in these challenging times, and is awed by the spirit and participation of so many gifted parishioners. She is dedicated to increasing awareness that divinity lives and acts in all creation; that "the world is a joyful mystery to be contemplated with gladness and praise." (*Laudato Si'* par.12); that we have a responsibility to do all in our power to enhance the well-being of our interconnected and interdependent Earth.

Growing in Faith: All That They Had

Today is Veterans' Day. Let us pause to recognize those who were drafted or those who with "wide-eyed optimism" willingly signed-up to serve their country. Few wars are fought for a heavenly cause; nonetheless, men and women, who served whether for a past war or during relatively peaceful times, left their worldly persona behind. They gave it their all, and for some, that meant their very lives. So, we remember and honor them.

At a recent charismatic prayer service, a veteran implored Jesus for the healing of his wounded arm and leg. It was a privilege to join with others to pray and ask in Jesus' name for healing. Paul writes in Hebrews to put our faith in Jesus, as our High Priest who intercedes before God on our behalf, and in doing so, that trust yields to our salvation.

Juxtapose this with today's two widow stories: the first is a poverty-stricken widow who Elijah

approached requesting the last bit of food that she had. Because she wasn't lacking spiritually, she quickly surmised that he was a man of God and thus, felt compelled to share *all that she had* in order to feed him. She was immediately blessed to experience that "you can't out give God!"

In Mark's gospel, the poor widow obediently *gave all that she had* to the temple treasury. Her offering, although meager, was exalted by Jesus. Could there be any doubt that God subsequently blessed her, and will for us, too, when we act in faith?

A Letter from Cardinal Cupich

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

In Pope Francis's message regarding the Second World Day of the Poor, which will take place on Sunday, November 18, 2018, the Holy Father proclaimed that we must come together to hear the cry of the poor, to answer their cry, and to lift the hearts of those on the margins. He emphasized that "we are in debt to the poor, because, in hands outstretched to one another, a salvific encounter can take place to strengthen our faith, inspire our charity and enable our hope to advance securely on our path towards the Lord who is to come."

Organizations funded by the Catholic Campaign for Human Development lead the call to the marginalized in their communities to take heart, rise, and act against injustice on behalf of themselves, their families, and their communities. The Chicago Housing Initiative is, for example, one such organization. With support from a CCHD grant, the Chicago Housing Initiative can work directly with families who are experiencing housing instability or homelessness to create more fair, inclusive, and effective housing and land development policies in Chicago. This, in turn, helps address the lack of affordable housing available to low-income individuals and families.

By emphasizing self-help, participation, and cooperation, the Catholic Campaign for Human Development's holistic approach leads to increased human dignity and stronger, more economically viable communities. Anointing of the Sick

On the weekend of November 17-18, we will be celebrating our Parish Feast Day. (St. Gertrude's actual feast day is November 16th, but we are moving it to the weekend so we can all do this together.)

We will celebrate the Anointing of the Sick at all the Masses that weekend. This sacrament is for anyone suffering from any illness or condition, temporary or chronic, and even for those who simply are feeling the effects of aging. The sacrament is one of the oldest rituals in our Christian tradition.

In the earliest days of the Church, some members of the community were dismissed from the celebration of the Eucharist before mass was finished in order to bring the Eucharist and the blessed oil to those unable to attend because of some illness or infirmity.

The Anointing has always been understood to be about comfort and healing of both body and spirit, and so includes every kind of distress—physical, mental, emotional, psychological, and spiritual. It is also this comprehensive understanding that led those same early Christians to the conclusion that whenever anyone receives the Anointing of the Sick, all their sins are forgiven. And that remains true to

this day! (From the Epistle of James, 5:14-15: 14 “Is anyone among you sick? He should summon the presbyters of the church, and they should pray over him and anoint [him] with oil in the name of the Lord, and the prayer of faith will save the sick person, and the Lord will raise him up. If he has committed any sins, he will be forgiven.”)

The anointing takes place right after the homily and is in two parts. In the first part, there is a prayer for those to be anointed. Then those who wish to receive the sacrament come forward for the imposition of hands which signifies the calling down the Holy Spirit. In the second part, a Prayer of Thanksgiving is prayed over the Holy Oil, and then those to be anointed come forward a second time when the priest will anoint their forehead and the palms of their hands. Once everyone is anointed, there is a Prayer of Thanksgiving and then mass continues as usual.

If you know anyone in your family or in the community who might want to receive the Anointing of the Sick, please invite them to any of our parish masses the weekend of November 17-18.

Care for our Common Home

“Where there is sin, grace abounds.” God’s grace surrounds us and is with us—as we approach Advent, can we cooperate with this grace? For if we can, we can spread this grace into a world that needs it so badly.

Approaching Advent, we read about the Hebrew’s expectations for the last days. Jesus would have shared these expectations; no one at that time would have understood “the naturally slow pace of biological evolution.” (par.18) What remains true is our call to remain vigilant, in Pope Francis’ words, “To dare to turn what is happening to the world into our own personal suffering and thus to discover what each of us can do about it.” (par.19)

Chapter One of *Laudato Si’* discusses many of these things and how they affect each of us. As we celebrate St. Gertrude and anticipate Thanksgiving, let us give thanks for the gifts of creation, but also “take a frank look at the facts to see that our common home is falling into serious disrepair.” Let us remain hopeful “that we can always do something to solve our problems.” (par. 61) The NCA Green Team strives to do this!
