

Recently, I was listening to a performance by the Chicago Symphony of Aaron Copeland's <u>Lincoln's Portrait</u> on the radio. As I listened to the text which is part of the piece, I was struck by both Lincoln's eloquence and how applicable it is to the situation our nation is facing today. While I certainly hope our divisions today are not as damaging or destructive as the "original sin" of slavery which he was addressing, we are, nonetheless, a nation divided and much in need of healing. But as we move forward, we have to be aware of the same truths Lincoln was speaking about in 1862, "The dogmas of the quiet past are inadequate to the stormy present. The occasion is piled high with difficulty and we must rise with the occasion. As our case is new, so we must think anew and act anew. We must disenthrall ourselves and then we shall save our country."

I was most of all struck by the notion that we must "disenthrall ourselves and then we shall save our country." Because the opposite of that is also true—if we will not disenthrall ourselves, we shall lose our country. Most of the parts of our nation that make us great are gifts from God: the extraordinary natural resources, the abundance of unbelievable beauty of every kind in every state, the climate, etc. What we human beings add or subtract to that greatness is in how we use those abundant riches, and especially our behavior toward others—our character. Being the richest, the strongest and most powerful, the most threatening militarily, all those things are the perishables. Throughout history empires have risen and fallen because that is what they depended upon. What made the greatest of them endure for longer periods of time was in their character—in how they treated their fellow human beings. Great nations that lifted up others became stronger, while those who tore others down quickly perished. Our true greatness today is not something that can be measured by

dollars and bombs and production lines. Our greatness today is measured by the ever-expanding concern for all our sisters and brothers to live freely, to choose their own leaders, and to care for the weakest and most vulnerable among us.

We must disenthrall ourselves of that terrible lie that we are great because somehow, we created the wealth that makes our standard of living possible! No, that is God's gift. Certainly, generations have worked extraordinarily hard to use those resources to lift themselves up, to provide their children with a greater possibility for their own lives, and to share from our abundance with those throughout the world who are starving, living in poverty, etc. The true greatness we claim as our own is the moral character which speaks truth, which does not tolerate bigotry of any kind, which recognizes our failings and seeks to build up the entire human family.

I am reminded of a quote I love—even though I have no idea who first said it, "Character is defined by how we behave when no one else is looking." It isn't in what we proclaim from the rooftops about how wonderful we are that will define us. It is in the quiet, often hidden way we treat one another, especially the weak, the broken, the sick and grieving, the poor, the prisoner, and the outcast.

Which is a very long way of saying the crisis we face as a nation today is not most of all political—although that is how this particular crisis will likely play itself out. But the real crisis is spiritual. Our souls, our spirits, are wounded and we are going to decide if we value the very things we also claim we treasure from the teachings of Our Lord, Jesus Christ. Or are we going to follow a different way, a cheapened way that values only what can be bought and sold? That is why this needs to be a time of prayer. Power and money, influence and bravado will not deliver us. Only placing our trust in God and following what His Son has taught us can lead us safely home.

Equally as important as tending to basic needs is the human connection that Heart to Heart provides to the lonely, poor, or those in need. Social services at St. Gertrude is about showing love and care through a listening ear, a smile, a kind word, a visit to break up a long day, or a helping hand. It's about putting faith into action by loving our neighbors and tending to their needs.

Heart to Heart depends on the generosity of the parish community to continue its work. 

Growing in Faith

Two of the readings in today's liturgy feature lepers who have been healed. But really, it is about how they reacted to their cure.

Naaman and the Samaritan both were transformed in body and in faith. Scripture scholars point out that both Naaman and the Samaritan were outsiders, not Israelites. And through their external healing, the outsider's internal faith was transformed. Moreover, they both gratefully returned to the source and gave thanks.

I'm sure many have experienced a profound healing in your lives or in the lives of dear family or friends. It's almost a cliché, that "people find God when they go through a time of suffering." But suffering can, indeed, connect us to God. It can bring us in intimate contact with others and also connect us to those we don't even know in an extraordinary way.

In 1996, I was in a car accident that should have killed me. It didn't, but I had a long recovery to unscramble my brain. Even today, I deal with some hip and back issues that linger from that accident so long ago. Still, I'm profoundly grateful for what I went through to become who I am today. And, the opportunity that I had, we all have: the chance to

cultivate a grateful heart.

When we go through hard times of suffering and difficulty, Jesus encourages us to experience a deepening of our faith and be truly grateful for God's presence in our lives and the love and support that surrounds us.

- Indicating contempt for the other person/ mocking, ridiculing, rolling eyes, laughing
- Acting as the final authority
 Criticizing in a harsh and uncalled-for manner
- Not listening, interrupting
