

HISTORY OF CFPTF COLLEGE



PROGRAM BACKGROUND

In May 2022, our nonprofit responded to the urgent need for education and vocational training in Cité-Soleil by establishing a college on Fontaine Hospital's (CHF) premises.

This initiative came from the realization that many of the young boys in armed groups are middle school and high school dropouts without family or community support. It is nearly impossible for these at-risk youth to afford food, housing, and schools. Quick money (often from illegal activities) for food, and housing come before education

Our goal is to address the root causes specific to the unique challenges atrisk youth from Cité-Soleil and surrounding areas face pushing them towards a life of crime and deceit

Program Services:

- Vocational education dual enrollment opportunity for Ecole Mixte Petit Coeur de Jesus (EMPCJ) students
- Academic education (2-4 year degrees)
- Community development workshops
- International undergraduate studies opportunities

Trough education that lead to employment our hope is to reduce the number of at-risk youth who participate in delinquent activities to make ends meet.

Through our international education program we seek to identify Haitian high school students with a strong track record of leadership and civic engagement with the desire






PROGRAM MISSION & VISION

- Empowering up to 200 Haitian youth, especially at-risk youth with access to affordable vocational and academic education, and assist them in successful job placements a year over the next three years.
- To make international study opportunities a reality for 21 qualified high school students with a strong desire to return home and apply what they've learned over the next three years.



Our vision is a to have contributed to the personal and professional development and recruitment of at least 500 medical professionals, educators, skilled tradesmen in and around the commune of Cité-Soleil within the next three years.

Our vision is also for the study aborad students who have returned home apply the skills learned in the public and private sector and also in the social sector serving as mentors, professors, educators, coaches, trainers, speakers, employers.
