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# **About Fontaine Hospital**



**Background:** Fontaine Hospital (CHF), located in the heart of the commune of Cité Soleil, Haiti, is a beacon of hope for the community.

Founded in 1991 by Jose Ulysse, this private nonprofit hospital has become one of the region's pillars, providing medical care and support to residents of this highly marginalized community.

Kareen Ulysse, Mr. Ulysse's oldest daughter, founded Centre Hospitalier de Fontaine Foundation (CHFF) (EIN 84-4726109), a nonprofit organization to rally support behind her father's private nonprofit hospital, and his education and workforce development initiatives in Cité-Soleil, Haiti.

**Mission and Vision:** Fontaine Hospital's mission is to serve 100,00 individuals annually, emphasizing the most vulnerable.

CHF's vision is that its facility has all the necessary equipment, materials, funding, and Human Resources to provide healthcare closer to international standards.

Why is CHF Important?: 93% of healthcare institutions charge user fees costing more than low-income individuals from highly marginalized communities like Cité-Soleil can afford. Nearly two-thirds (63%) of households in low-income communities do not consult a health professional due to cost.

In an August 29, 2023 letter, the Ministry of Public Health and Population (MSPP) stated that Fontaine Hospital (CHF) has been the sole operational hospital in the commune of Cité- Soleil over the past two (2) years.

Fontaine Hospital is deeply committed to the community through Multipurpose Community Health Workers.

CHF regularly deploys its community health workers in Mobile clinics, emergency hospital admission, nutrition and health awareness campaigns, and hygiene training sessions, while also actively participating in initiatives to improve the living conditions of residents in the region.

The hospital also collaborates with local and international organizations to ensure equitable access to healthcare.

CHF is a major Unicef partner. UNFPA/CERF, WHO/PAHO, DWB-France and Geneva, FFTP, MDM Canada are also Fontaine Hospital's partners.

Fontaine Hospital remains an informative example of dedication to the well-being of the community and the importance of quality health services for the most vulnerable populations.

CHF embodies hope and healing in the heart of this disadvantaged community.

# **Sustainable Energy**

Electricity is essential for adequately functioning medical equipment, air conditioning, and ventilation, ensuring a safe and comfortable environment for patients and personnel.

Since launching its Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU), CHF's energy needs have become far more significant than what is financially possible to maintain every month. Frequent power outages seriously affect the quality of medical care at Fontaine Hospital, particularly in essential wings such as neonatology, pediatrics, Labor and Delivery.

On January 2, 2024 UNFPA finalized the installation of 32 Solar Panels to the L&D, Pediatrics, and NICU.

# **Staff Transportation**

CHF provides transportation to its staff members.

Monday - Friday, the CHF mini school bus takes a growing number of staff to and from CHF.

With the closure of most healthcare centers in Port-au-Prince, Haiti, the number of patients consulted at CHF continues to rise.

Concurrently, to maintain the quality of care, the number of personnel also increases, with the majority unable to afford daily transportation as prices have more than tripled and continue to rise since Fall 2022.

CHF needs an additional diesel 40passenger vehicle to reduce overcrowding and increase staff comfort.

# Neonatal Intensive Care Unit Supplies, Equipment and Mateials

On June 14, 2023, Dr. Daniel, Dr. Michel, and Nurse Alexandre took the bold initiative to turn on an incubator to save the life of a premature infant in distress.

The service has been operational since.

However, CHF needs to be better equipped to increase the odds of survival for preemies under 32 weeks.

# Improvement of Maternal and Child Health Care

Improvement of Maternal and Child Health Care and Facility: Reduce infant and maternal mortality by improving the quality of maternal and child health care provided at Fontaine Hospital (CHF)

- 1. Monitoring Equipment
  - a.timely maintenance and Repairs
- 2. Hiring Highly Qualified Staff
  - a.Part Time: Trainers/Consultants b.Full Time
- 3. Capacity Building
  - a. Due to the shortage of specialists we rely heavily on inperson and virtual training for our generalists by specialists.
- 4. <u>Infrastructure reinforcement</u>, improvements and expansion
  - a.Increase the number of beds in:
    - i. Labor and Delivery
    - ii. Pediatric
    - iii.Neonatal Intensive Care

# Reduce & Prevent Maternal and Infant Death

**Context:** Only 13 percent of women in the lowest socioeconomic demographics give birth in healthcare settings, compared to 79 percent for those in better financial positions.



When questioned by the CHF staff regarding why they failed to seek prenatal care and to give birth at a hospital, around 65% of the women questioned stated that giving birth in a health establishment is too expensive.

They are forced to give birth at home often unaware of pre existing complications due to lack of prenatal care with the assistance of unskilled people (matrons) increasing their own, and the infant's risk of death.

Maternal mortality per 100,000 live births increased from around 523 in 2005 to 646 in 2016 before falling to 529, according to the latest EMMUS.

Poor health outcomes are linked to persistent poverty, lack of access and quality of care, inadequate community inaction, and, in particular, low levels of service utilization.

Haitians make about 0.5 outpatient visits to health institutions per year on average, and only 39% of pregnant women gave birth at health institutions in 2016 – mainly due to ingrained behavioral practices of going to "traditional birth attendants" or "matrons" for deliveries, quality of care and high cost of giving births at a hospital.

### Nutrition

Implement short and long-term nutrition programs to treat, reduce, and prevent malnutrition especially in children, pregnant, breastfeeding mothers and seniors.

Context: Cité Soleil, a commune in the West department with an estimated population of 300,000 is currently experiencing a very worrying nutritional crisis due to the expansion of gangs and insecurity. The expansion makes accessing health services to treat malnutrition difficult and weakens the best preventative measure: personal finances as businesses continue to close throughout Port-au-Prince.

As more families fall into poverty, more children, pregnant women, and seniors suffer from malnutrition.

Added to these problems are the gradual departure of NGOs and the closure of institutions specializing in nutrition and food security intervention, thus contributing to the deterioration of the nutritional state of this population.

Fontaine Hospital (CHF) remains MSPP's and UNICEF's preferred acute malnutrition treatment institution in Cité Soleil.



# **Gender Based Violence**

Increase awareness of the problem of gender-based violence and put prevention and support mechanisms in place for the survivors.

**Context**: Gender-based violence is rooted in the unequal power dynamics between genders. This inequality is often financial, where men, often the breadwinner, control the finances.

The financially dependent woman, usually a mother with limited elementary education, is subjected to unspeakable acts of violence by her husband/partner, who knows she has nowhere else to go.

Low-income women who do escape become victims of physical, verbal, and even sexual violence in the residence (home or public park) where they are seeking refuge from an abusive partner.

### **Mobile Clincs**

Increase Access to affordable healthcare: Offer Ambulatory care to 20,000 individuals through mobile clinics.

Context: Mobile clinics are one of the safest ways to reach populations in highly marginalized areas who are hesitant or incapable of visiting hospitals or health centers for various reasons. The most common causes, however, are lack of funds for transportation, consultation, hospitalization, medications, and safety concerns on the way to and from the hospital due to increased gun violence throughout the communes of Delmas, Cité-Soleil, Carrefour, Croix-des-Bouquets, and Tabarre.

Mobile Clinics, which cost beneficiaries less than \$5, allow CHF to consult patients, prescribe medications, refer emergency cases to CHF, and schedule follow-up appointments, thus laying the foundation for preventative care. CHF's Mobile clinics are also a means of communication with the community,

raising awareness on various topics.

The success of each mobile clinic is credited to the collaboration between CHF and community leaders, health workers, multipurpose community health agents (ASCP) who visit churches, schools, play centers, and peristyles, other commonly attended meeting points with the community to announce upcoming mobile clinics and register beneficiaries.


CHF is looking to offer specialized mobile clinics such as Laboratories, Female Reproductive Cancer Screenings, and imaging (Ultrasound and X-ray).

Over the past two years businesses all over the capital have permanentaly closed their doors. As a result the already cashstrapped beneficiaries find themselves unable to cover at least 50% of their medical fees despite CHF's affordable prices.

Unlike many medical institutions CHF provides medical care to all despite their inability to cover 100% of their fees. Partners in the public, private, and NGO sectors in Haiti and abroad help, through in-kind and financial donations, make it possible for CHF to provide affordable prices, and forgive a portion or all of the medical bills of qualified cases.
