ABOUT C.H.F. HOSPITAL

The Center Hospitalier de Fontaine (CHF) is a community health institution operating in the municipality of Cite Soleil since 1991.

The center is located in the district of Fontaine Duvivier, Carrefour Duvivier new road very close to the sub-police station of Carrefour Duvivier.

According to the MSPP, the CHF service area is populated by more than one hundred and eighty thousand people (180,000 people),

People who visit the Hospital come from the communities of Duvivier, Martial, Bassan, Vaudreuil, Blanchard, Damien, Village des Repatries, Canaan, Drouillard, Cite Soleil, Bas Delmas.

The Hospital operates 24 hours a day and has all the essential services: Maternity, Pediatrics, Sonography, X-rays, Dental Clinic, Laboratory, Pharmacy, Operating Room, Community Health (vaccination, family planning, nutrition) Pregnant Women consultation, Mobile clinics where we go to meet the sick and the elderly. We are now working on re-opening our technical school in an effort to stimulate workforce and economic development of the area.











ABOUT E.M.P.C.J. SCHOOL

Ecole Mixte Petit Coeur de Jesus is a Kindergarten to 9th grade school operating in the municipality of Cite-Soleil since 1996. The school is located on Route 9 at the Ancient Fort Dimanch intersection

The school was founded by Mr. One Francois, who himself was in the same position as his students: poor, hungry, growing up without a support system in Cite-Soleil. What him and his students also shared was the desire to become more and to bring change to the place he called and still calls home.

At the age of 16, using money he earned helping a woodworking and pottery shops he started school and graduated as an adult. He founded the school to help children in his position break the cycle of poverty through education. He was a living proof after all.

Today E.M.P.C.J. has 585 students as many schools in the area have closed with only 21 teachers. Me. Francois would like to hire more teachers, and pay his teachers more but he cannot afford to.

Meals are served once or twice a week depending on how much money is available to purchase food and pay the cafeteria staff.

The school day ends by 12:00 pm on days food isn't served to give the students a chance to find something to eat.
