Polk County Renovations

Polk County is currently working on renovations to property owned by Polk County at both 1900 and 1914 Carpenter Avenue. The Polk County Board of Supervisors, Broadlawns Medical Center, and St. Vincent DePaul are collaborating to open the first crisis access center in the county. The west half of the building is being renovated to accommodate a

host of crisis services that will include a 24-hour crisis observation center, psychiatric urgent care, and a sobering center. The purpose of this center is to divert individuals who are experiencing mental health and substance abuse crises from the emergency departments and the Polk County Jail. Individuals will be better served with community-based mental health and substance abuse services.

The east half of the building will be renovated to house a "Welcome Center" that will serve as a one-stop hub of basic services for immigrant and refugee families who are new to Central lowa. They will be able to access resources for transportation, childcare, food, education, language and more. The goal is to help move them faster and more efficiently towards self-sufficiency and create a hub of diverse activity in a historically underserved neighborhood.

Watering Directions for New Trees in Brook Run

Many of you have noticed trees that have been planted in Brook Run, by Forever Trees. They will be ready for watering after the last freeze.

Here are some tips on how to water them:

- 1. After the last freeze in the spring, trees should be watered with 5 gallons per week.
- 2. Trees have been planted with a gator bag attached.
- 3. Fill the green bag with water. It will hold 10-15 gallons for less frequent need to fill.
- I. The trees are dormant, but will be ready for water soon.

Cajun Chicken & Sausage Gumbo

- 1 cup vegetable oil
- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- 1 pound andouille sausage, sliced 1/4 inch thick
- 2 celery stalks, chopped
- 1 large green bell pepper, chopped
- 1 large onion, chopped
- 4 cloves garlic, minced
- Salt and pepper to taste
- 1 pinch Creole seasoning, or to taste
- 6 cups chicken broth
- 1 bay leaf
- 1 rotisserie chicken, boned and shredded

Directions

- Heat oil in a stockpot over medium heat; whisk in flour until roux is smooth and has cooked to the color of chocolate milk, about 8 to 10 minutes. Be careful not to burn the roux. If you see black specks in the mixture, it's best to start over.
- 2. Add sausage, celery, bell pepper, and onion into the roux; cook and stir 5 minutes. Add garlic; continue to cook and stir another 5 minutes.
- Season with salt, pepper, and Creole seasoning; stir well to blend. Pour in chicken broth and add bay leaf. Bring to a boil over high heat; reduce heat to medium-low and simmer, uncovered, for 1 hour, stirring occasionally.
- 4. Stir in the chicken and simmer 1 hour more. Skim off any foam that floats to the top during this time.

Best served with Rice. You can also add your favorite ingredients to this gumbo like: Shrimp, Crab Legs, Oysters, Ham, Okra, or Filè powder.

City of Des Moines Council-Ward 2



It appears spring is here, but just wait, I expect we will see a few more weeks of winter. The variation in the outdoor temperatures is hard on our roadways. Please report potholes to the city so repairs can be made quickly. The goal is to have potholes repaired within 72 hours of being reported. The reporting app is available on the city web site, www.dsm.city > mydsmmobile

This is an easy and handy tool to use to report multiple issues to the city. We always want to hear from our residents.

City Council is busy working with the city manager and the finance department in finalizing the upcoming budget. The proposed budget is posted on the city website dsm.city for review and resident input. Street improvements near Brook Run include NE 23 Street/Easton-Fourmile to E. 56th Street. In FY 2026-FY 2028.

The city is working with Polk County, Broadlawns, and St. Vincent De Paul to create a safe welcoming place for adults in need of behavioral health services. A sobering center and sobering services will be available to keep people in need out of our jail and allow our first responders to return to their patrol duties faster. Paramedics and EMT personnel will be available offering a hand off to community services such as detox, residential treatment, employment services, and wellness activities. Several nonprofit partners will also be assisting, offering help to those who seek help.

Big news! Brook Run Village has been included in a multi-million dollar stream improvement project aimed at reducing soil erosion and improving water quality in Polk County. Steve Wallace and Marty Chebuhar are the neighborhood's liaisons working with Polk County Public Works on the project.

This is a major development long sought by those concerned about erosion along Brook Run's stream banks and its related problems, including silting of our ponds. Joining this project offers solutions to worries that have troubled our neighborhood for many years.

The board voted unanimously at its February meeting to move forward on the project, which would involve Association cost-share funding. The overall effort, which targets erosion issues in various areas of the county, is to be financed primarily with a state-approved \$10 million grant using federal pass-through dollars. It also involves assistance from the City of Des Moines and Polk County. More information will be released as details are worked out. Directors expect to ask the Association's membership for approval of the final plan.

Reminders:

Fishing is permitted in designated areas from April 1 to October 31. Please refer to the Fishing Policy which can be found at www.brookrunvillage.com for the rules and designated areas. In an effort to maintain the water quality of our ponds, Brook Run residents and visitors are asked to not feed the geese and ducks which migrate to these waters.

Lori are so proud of him.








Thaden Abbas
