The next planned event will be March 22 -26th featuring The Easter Bunnies.




Brook Run Park Timeline

Completion Date: June 2023

Brook Run Park Improvements will include updated playground equipment and safety surfacing to the existing playground. Additionally, the millings trail connecting the Park from Village Run Drive will be replaced with a


concrete sidewalk connection that is ADA accessible. New playground equipment includes a We-Go-Round, Chill Spinner, Bucket Seat, and 3 new ground panels with different puzzles. The engineered wood fibers will be converted to rubberized tile safety surfacing and will match the existing playground equipment. The Parks and Recreation

Department has been selecting playgrounds to be updated to be more inclusive for children with physical and cognitive disabilities. Brook Run Park was selected for these updates.

Fire Department and Police Department. The opening of Fire Station 11 at 42nd and Hubbell has resulted in quicker response times to the Brook Run neighborhood and all of Northeast Des Moines. If you have not yet toured Station 11 please stop by some time and take a look around. It is a state-of-the-art building that offers our first responders an environmentally safe workspace. Nationally we have one of the best firehouses in the nation at Station 11.

I represent Des Moines on the Fourmile Creek Watershed Management Authority (WMA) Board. We all know Fourmile Creek has been prone to flooding for many years and has impacted residents in the Brook Run neighborhood. The Fourmile WMA has created a masterplan that will convert additional land along the watershed into a more natural state that will promote water quality and reduce the possibility of flooding. The city is also adding additional basins to the north of Brook Run that will prevent the rapid movement of water during heavy rains. The city will continue to work with the neighborhood on streambank stabilization efforts.

The new walking trail in your neighborhood will be an improvement for all to enjoy. One walk around the loop is nearly a quarter mile. The playground was originally planned to be completed fall 2022. The DURASafe playground surfacing must be completed by certified/ specialty installers when weather conditions are favorable. The crews travel the region during the "weather window" when the work can be done. The installers did fall behind due to weather, and they are planning to make your park first on their stop this season. So, if the weather cooperates the playground and park should be completed in June. (Please see attached map)

BRVOA Policy on Fishing in Common Areas:

The Brook Run Village HOA governing board has adopted regulations for fishing in Association-owned ponds. The rules are designed to meet Association needs in the areas of liability, safety, security and privacy while also providing clarity to Brook Run Village residents who fish. The Brook Run Village ponds were constructed solely for storm water retention. Except for fishing in areas designated by the regulations, no other recreation is permitted on the ponds. The fishing policy is available in full on the Brook Run website (www.brookrunvillage.com) under the Association's list of "Recorded Documents" as well as the Polk County Recorders website.

The Board and the Stormwater Committee continue to work with the Polk County Public Works Department's watershed management group in seeking federal and state funding to rehabilitate eroded streambanks in Brook Run Village. Dredging may also be an option for all three of the storm water retention ponds and future dam access as part of the overall watershed management work. The Brook Run Village Owner's Association Board of Directors meets the first Wednesday of the month with the agenda and previous months minutes posted on the approved media sites. The location of the meeting is in the meeting room of the Des Moines Fire Station 11, 4150 East 42nd Street & corner of Hubbell Avenue, Des Moines.
