Parks are a critical part of Des Moines, and is a frequent topic of conversation with residents, and it is clear that they mean so much to you. Our Parks and Recreation Department kicked off the month by unveiling improvements to Cohen Park (1000 Scott

Ave.) The improvements include new and exciting active recreation amenities like a half basketball court, a bouldering area, an interactive ball wall called Sutu, various site furnishings, and signage in conjunction with the relocated historic water trough. The Cohen Park improvement project aligns perfectly with our <u>LiveDSM</u> goal of investing in neighborhood parks and ensuring that every household is within a 10-minute walk of a park or green space.

Fourmile Mountain Bike Park on Des Moines' Eastern Border

The proposed mountain bike park will be a four-mile, soft-surface trail system north of Copper Creek Lake Park. The trails will be classified as bike-optimized. That means the trails will be designed for mountain biking, but can be used by everyone. The features will be easily navigated over or around, by foot or wheels. You can expect to see the trail system utilized by bikers, hikers, walkers, bird watchers, trail runners, and more. Even in the winter, the trails will be in use by fat tire bikers. Residents from nearby Copper Creek Lake Park will be able to enjoy the paved walking trail around the lake before breaking off into the new mountain bike park to experience the natural trails. It will be a local park amenity where residents and avid outdoor recreation enthusiast can capture hours of enjoyment!

City of Des Moines Council-Ward 2



Summer is here and it is hard to believe we are almost half way through 2024. As I drive through the neighborhood I see how good everything looks and the park is always busy with residents enjoying the outdoors.

To address frequent odor complaints and improve quality of life in Des Moines, the Neighborhood Inspections Division (NID) installed 10 odors monitors in October of 2023 in several locations around the City's Municipal Service Center 2 (MSC 2) located on Maury Street. The monitors provide real-time measurements of odor-causing chemical compounds and feed the data into a web-based dashboard managed by NID staff. There is
