Polk County Announces: Water Quality Scientific Assessment

Polk County, Iowa is proud to announce the completion of a comprehensive scientific assessment focused on the water quality of the Des Moines and Raccoon Rivers. This groundbreaking study was led by a team of fifteen distinguished scientific advisors, in collaboration with nine key data partners including City of Des Moines, Des Moines Water Works, Iowa Department of Natural Resources, National Agricultural Statistics Service, United States Army Corps of Engineers, and United States Geological Survey.

The Central Iowa Scientific Water Research Assessment team logged over 4,000 hours of research and analysis. The project has now concluded with the issuance of the Currents of Change: Final Scientific Assessment of Source Water Research Report, which provides all supporting data and analysis and fully outlines clear projects and pathways (local, regional, and statewide) for improved source water quality in the Des Moines and Raccoon Rivers.

The assessment provides an in-depth investigation into the current state of conditions across central lowa, with a primary emphasis on river flow, drinking water,

ecological health, and recreational impacts. By carefully analyzing these critical components of water quality, the study aims to provide actionable insights and recommendations for future projects to ensure the sustainability and vitality of lowa's water resources.

Key findings from the assessment highlight the intricate balance between river flow and the surrounding ecosystems, illustrating the direct effects on drinking water quality and the broader ecological health of the region. Furthermore, the study elaborates on how these factors influence recreational activities and the overall well-being of the community. Polk County is committed to leveraging this valuable scientific data to foster informed decision-making and proactive measures that will enhance the quality of life for its residents while preserving the natural beauty and integrity of its waterways. Currents of Change would not have been possible without generous funding from the 2023 Polk County, Iowa Board of Supervisors who commissioned this project using American Rescue Plan Act dollars.



"Info You Need to Know"

Crispy Honey Sriracha Chicken Wings

Recipe Supplied by Sara Moody

Ingredients

- 2 tablespoons baking powder
- 1 tablespoon kosher salt
- 1 teaspoon ground black pepper
- 1 teaspoon smoked paprika
- 2 1/2 pounds chicken wing sections

Honey Sriracha Glaze

- 1/3 cup honey
- 1/3 cup sriracha sauce
- 1 tablespoon seasoned rice vinegar
- 1/4 teaspoon sesame oil
- 1 pinch sesame seeds, or as desired





Directions

- **1.** Preheat the oven to 425 degrees F (220 degrees C). Line a baking sheet with aluminum foil and place an oven-proof wire rack over the foil.
- 2. Whisk baking powder, salt, black pepper, and paprika together in a small bowl.
- **3.** Place chicken wings in a large bowl. Sprinkle 1/2 of the baking powder mixture over wings and toss to coat. Repeat with remaining baking powder mixture, tossing well to coat.
- **4.** Arrange wings on the rack of the prepared baking sheet.
- **5.** Bake in the preheated oven for 20 minutes. Turn wings and continue baking for 20 minutes. Turn wings again and bake until wings are browned and crispy, about 15 minutes more. Transfer wings to a large bowl.
- 6. For the glaze: Whisk honey, sriracha sauce, rice vinegar, and sesame oil together in a bowl until smooth. Drizzle glaze over wings and toss to coat completely.
- 7. Transfer wings to a serving platter and sprinkle sesame seeds over the top.
