TOM TALPEY

Thomas E. Talpey was born on March 20, 1925, and passed on from his Washington, New Hampshire home on September 30, 2022. I had spoken to Mr. Talpey a few times when looking for the person to receive the Greater Hillsborough Senior Services cane for the oldest resident in Washington. He would often say he didn't have paper or pencil handy to take down the information I required and to talk to his son Bill when he visited him. And so, after Mr. Talpey has passed it is to Bill, I called to get the information I needed to tell you about this extremely intelligent and loving man.

Thomas was born in Auburn, New York and lived there with his family until he joined the Navy for World War II and was sent by the navy to Cornell University to study electrical engineering. From there he went on to the University of Michigan to get his Ph.D. and then to the University of Grenoble in France to get his Doctorate in the field. Thomas taught at the University of Michigan for a time, he worked for Bell Telephone in New Jer-

sey for twenty-seven years, retiring in 1984. In 1960 he took a leave of absence from Bell Telephone to work for Cornell University on the initial development and construction of Arecibo Ionospheric Observatory in Puerto Rico, he was there for three years.

In 1948, Tom married the love of his life Elizabeth (known by all as Betty) and they raised two children. Sarah (who has passed) and William. Sarah has their only grandchild and hence their two great grandchildren.

In 1974, Tom and Betty purchased their Washington, NH home and moved there permanently in 1985. Tom served on the Washington Planning Board and the Washington Historical Society for many years. He also spent years working on the Manahan-Phelps-McCulloch photograph collection in Hillsborough. Tom was a juried member of the League of NH Craftsmen, making Tiffany style lampshades from polished jade, stone and glass. His work was displayed in the Living with Crafts exhibit at the Sunapee Craft Fair for many years and his lampshades are prized possessions of those who purchased one.

From his son he comments on how his parents were wonderful people, beloved by their community, and he never heard his father ever say a bad word about anyone nor ever saw him mad. I wish I had gotten to know Mr. Talpey. He sounds like a very interesting and kind man. As the one who last held the Washington Cane, he was an excellent example of the kind of person we should all be.



ONE INTERESTING FACT

Despite its geographical separation from the original and its Western counterpart, New Hampshire was in fact originally called North Virginia.

The naming had to do with a similarity between the landscape of the states, and by all accounts original residents liked the name. It was eventually renamed to pay tribute to England's Hampshire County.


