Guy Landry

He was known as a kind, helpful, giving friend and neighbor to all who knew the man. He loved to help children and young adults to be out in nature and active. He would fix motorcycles for free for many. His workshop always had a project or two to help those who needed an expert mechanic and tinkerer.

Guy Gerald Landry was born January 28, 1934, and left this earth on April 27, 2022. He was born in Coaticook, Quebec, Canada and stayed there with his family till they took a train to Manchester, New Hampshire and ultimately settled in Windham. He graduated from Nashua high school in 1954. From there he entered the Army National Guard and the Air National Guard where he used his experience to work on the mechanical instrumentation on planes.

It was only through pure serendipity that he met the love of his life Rita. One day, Rita and her best friend Lucille were out on a motorcycle ride and it started raining. They took shelter under a tree. While waiting for the rain to pass, two men on motorcycles stopped to take shelter from the rain under the same tree. These two men were Guy and his best friend, Les. Guy and Rita married in 1955 and had six children, Maurice, Roger (who passed in 1977), Michael, Leah, Henry and Marie. He had five grandchildren and two great grandchildren at the time of his passing.

In the 1960's Guy started a motorcycle repair shop in his garage in Londonderry. In the following years he expanded the business and moved twice - to Windham and then Salem. He worked at Sylvania here in Hillsborough from 1986 and until his retirement in 1999. While working in the area he used to travel around looking for a new place to settle and continue his and Rita's life into retirement. One day he traveled up on Windsor Road and found Rocky Ledge Road in Windsor where he found his perfect landing spot. He lived in a camper on the property for years, clearing and preparing the site for their forever home which was completed in 1990.

Neighbors to this day will stop by the Landry homestead and tell stories of friendship and the kindness of Guy. He and his wife would be a fixture at the Corner Store for many years until she passed in 2010. He became lost without her. It helped that friends and family would often take him to the Corner Store for lunch and visit with him.

The family is forever thankful to Vivian Clark for the many years of caretaking and support of Guy. She is a blessing and still visits with the family.

Guy was awarded the Windsor GHSS Cane in 2021 and it has remained his for now. He will be missed by many.
