Walter C. Peck

Walter C. Peck was born on October 22, 1928, in Waterbury Connecticut. He lived in Cheshire, Connecticut for twenty years and after one year in high school he went to a tech school in Wolcott, Connecticut where he wanted to study auto mechanics but was instead placed into tin smithing and became bored and frustrated so he joined the Army and went off to see the world.

Walter was in the 7th Air Command and stationed in Hawaii for oversees duty. He got out of the service in 1946 and returned to CT where he had his own business and also worked as a Corrections Officer at the local prison.

Walter and Phyllis married young, he was 21 and she 20. They had two children, Walter III who lives in Hooksett, and Donna who lives in Milford and has the five grandchildren and five great grandchildren Walter's delight.

After twenty years Walter sold his business and having purchased a home in Washington, NH and a camp in Maine as well as their home in CT he decided to come to New Hampshire. As was told to me, the home in Washington is like "Walton's Mountain" with family on all sides in their own homes. Moving to Washington he was soon approached by a friend to see if he would take over the school bus driver position. He was agreeable to doing that and did so for twenty years. The students would comment on times when Walter would intercede to stop an action and he often would tell the kids "I've done worse than you and can tell from your eyes what you intend to do".

His home in Washington is now his nephew's son who is starting his family life. Having raised his nephew, seeing his son taking over his home was a joy, and he is pleased it is in good hands.

Walter has hunted and fished all over. He has many stories to tell of hunting trips and fun times he had earlier in his life. Now he is comfortable sitting and telling stories and sharing his life with his partner Gail Dauphinais whom he lives with. Gail and Walter recently moved from Washington to Hillsborough and are enjoying their new surroundings, neighbors and life.

His parting words to me were "Do what you want while you are young and can do it, do not wait till you are too old to enjoy life."

- 1 pound imitation crab meat
- 1 shallot, minced (red onion okay also)

1/2 cup celery , minced

- 1/2 teaspoon paprika
- 1/2 teaspoon fresh or dried dill
- 1/4 teaspoon Kosher salt
- 1/4 teaspoon coarse ground black pepper
- 1/4 Teaspoon dried crumbled Thyme

- 1. In a large bowl add all the ingredients together gently, stirring until well coated.
- 2. Refrigerate for an hour before serving.


