Article V - Members

The nonprofit corporation will have no members.

Article VI - Purpose

The organization is organized exclusively for charitable, religious, educational, and scientific purposes under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

The purpose of the Corporation is to further the common good and general welfare and in furtherence of public and societal benefit of the people and the community in and around round the Clear Lake and Galveston Bay, Texas by indentifing abandoned and derelict boats, vessels and structures that represent environmental, navigation or safety hazards and work to remove and dispose of those abandoned and derelict items and engage in any related activity, including but not limited to:

- 1. The preservation of and reclamation of the marine environment of Clear Lake and Galveston Bay, Texas, and including but not limited the tributaries thereto,
- 2. The lessening of the burden of government, specifically, federal, state and local governments that lack the necessary resources (both in terms of finances, labor, equipment and materials) by providing guidence and resources to achieve the Corporation's purposes,
- 3. The education of the general public of the environmental and navigational hazards abandoned and derelict vessels, boats and structures present to area residents', businesses' and recreational boaters' quality of life on the local area waters of Clear Lake and Galveston Bay, Texas, and including but not limited to the tributaries thereto,
- 4. Promote public safety on the local area waters of Clear Lake and Galveston Bay, Texas, and including but not limited to the tributaries thereto,
- 5. The removal of, clean up of and abatement of environmental hazards and navigational hazards on Clear Lake and Galveston Bay, Texas, and including but not limited to the tributaries thereto,
- 6. Removal and disposal of abandoned and/or derelict boats, vessels, barges, structures (sunken or afloat) on the waters of Clear Lake and Galveston Bay, and including but not limited to their tributaries that represent polution or environmental hazard,
- 7. Raise funds from the general public, including but not limited to individuals, corporations, companies, partnerships or from federal, state and local governments or agencies, including but not limited to seeking grants for the purpose of funding efforts to pay for labor and/or materials infurtherance of the goals and objectives of the corporation.
 - 8. Contracting with individuals or companies to aid and assist in the removal and disposal of abandoned and derelict boats or structures from Clear Lake and Galveston Bay, and including but not limited to tibutaries there to,
 - 9. Coordinating, cooperating, assisting and working with federal, state and local agencies, etc. to accomplish and achieve any of the foregoing goals and purposes, including but not limited to the Texas Parks & Wildlife Department, U. S. Coast Guard, Texas General Land Office, U. S. Corp of Engineers, Texas and federal related environmental agencies, law enforement agencies, and municipalities and counties that border or are situated on Clear Lake and Galveston Bay, Texas.

No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence lesgislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of (statements) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activies not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.
- 3. Upon the dissolution of this organization, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose.
