





Techniques for Showcasing Your Perspective



Narrative Integration

Weave relevant aspects of your background into your professional story.



Perspective Offering

Preface unique insights with "From my experience..." statements.



Strategic Networking

Serve as a bridge between your organization and your communities.



Problem-Solving Applications

Draw upon approaches from various aspects of your identity.

Context Setting

Team kickoff meeting for customer service improvement project.



Identity Connection

Jamie mentions growing up in a multigenerational household.



Skill Linkage

Explains how this developed communication adaptability skills.



Professional Application

Shows how this helps with diverse customer communication needs.



Key Elements of Effective Positioning

Natural Context

Introduce identity aspects that feel relevant to the conversation.

Skill Connection

Clearly link identity elements to specific professional skills.

Concrete Examples

Provide tangible examples of workplace application.

Relevance

Connects the identity-based strength directly to the project

5

Professional framing

Presents the personal background as a source of professional

Techniques

- Narrative Integration: Weaving relevant aspects of your background into your professional story

 Drawing upon approaches from various aspects of your identity

Case Study: Javier Rodriguez

Initial Approach

Downplayed immigrant background and language journey

Repositioning

Became valued as cross-cultural communication specialist



Opportunity Recognition

Project struggling with Spanishspeaking market expansion

Perspective Offering

Cautiously shared cross-cultural insights

Resonance

What aspects of Javier's approach connect with your own experience?

Underutilized Elements

Which identity aspects might actually be valuable in your current role?

Application Opportunity

Where could you strategically bring a unique perspective next month?

Benefits of Strategic Identity Positioning

Individual Benefits	Organizational Benefits
Increased authenticity and job satisfaction	Enhanced innovation and problem-solving
Career differentiation and advancement	Improved market insights and customer connection
Expanded professional network	Stronger team collaboration and performance
Reduced code-switching fatigue	More inclusive workplace culture



Common Challenges & Solutions

Concerns

Concern about being reduced to a single identity aspect.

Solution: Control your narrative by highlighting multiple identity elements and their professional applications.

Relevance Uncertainty

Difficulty seeing how personal background connects to work.

Solution: Start with skills analysis, then trace backward to identity sources.

Workplace Receptivity

Concern about how identity sharing will be received.

Solution: Begin with small, clearly relevant connections in supportive contexts.
