Meeting Minutes

October 2, 2020 Zoom Meeting 2:00 PM

OLD BUSINESS

Property Updates

- 57 Townsend Greenwich Update from Carol
 - o Carol received update from Virgil Giles, Village Administrator. Building will be demolished in November.
 - Carol prepared a purchase agreement and sent it to Virgil via DocuSign.
- 1 S West Avenue Willard Update from Tim
 - The adjacent property owner is no longer interested in the property.
 - James/Tim proposed that the land bank and City split the cost of demolition and clean up this property. Cost for demolition is \$5,000. The land bank would pay \$2,500 and the City would pay \$2,500. Disposition of the property will be determined later.
 - The land bank is now in a financial position to assist with demolitions to accomplish our mission.
 - Skip made a motion to proceed with demolition of the building and split the cost with the City of Willard, seconded by Mitch and passed.
- 0 Section Line 30 Road Bellevue (Sherman Township) Update from Dick
 - One of the neighbors is interested in the property.
 - This property is not a buildable lot so it would fall under our side lot program.
 - A price of \$5,000 was set.
 - o Skip made a motion to sell the property at \$5,000, seconded by Joe and passed.
 - Per HCLRC policies, all adjacent property owners will be notified by certified mail that the property is available and the selling price.
 - 0 & 19 Pierce Street Greenwich Update from Carol
 - o The interior of the property needs to be evaluated before a price can be determined for this property.

- Justin offered to do this evaluation. Skip offered to assist if he is available. Carol will check with Shawn to see if he is interested in participating as well (he already has the keys).
- Need to determine price (\$10,000 to \$15,000 suggested)

Round 3 Property Acquisition Update - Carol

- Request letters are ready to go to the auditor once the check is signed.
- OK to put on the land bank website.

- 119 Dale Street Willard (CE 2019-0810)
 - o 3-Unit, 2-Story Apartment
 - 1,248 Square Feet
 - Built in 1900

 - 0.1776 total acres
 - \$28,300 Auditor's Appraised Value
 - o \$15,214.17 Back Taxes
 - \$145.82 Willard Mowing Assessment

This property is located between two municipal parking lots. The apartment building is in bad shape. The City has boarded it up. It was suggested that the building be demolished and donated to the City. Tim will talk to James to determine if the City is interested in the property and if they can assist or do the demolition.

Renewal of HCDC Contract to Administer Huron County Land Bank

- HCDC and HCLRC entered into a contract for HCDC to administer the land bank on October 2, 2018. The two-year contract includes a automatic renewal clause that allows the contract to continue for an additional two years.
- Skip made a motion to automatically renew the contract, seconded by Joe and passed.

OTHER

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Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the land bank has been meeting via Zoom. Even though the public can attend the Zoom meetings via computer or telephone, it was suggested that perhaps we should have a physical presence at the administration building for the meetings with limited attendance. Skip offered to be available at the building for the meetings. Karmen offered to help set up the meeting (and be available if/when Skip cannot be). Board members thought this was a good idea.
