

PROGRAM CURRICULUM 2021-2022



Children practice language and social skills as they share their interests and ideas and work collaboratively to plan activities, do research, and engage in project work and investigations together. Weather permitting, children have daily outdoor play and often take walks to explore our campus and the downtown Westport neighborhood.

At Christ & Holy Trinity Preschool we have developed a curriculum that is inspired by the philosophy of the Reggio approach and provides developmentally appropriate experiences that support each child's individual growth toward readiness for kindergarten. Through the use of collaborative projects and open-ended materials, your child's imagination and creativity are incorporated into classroom learning experiences.





Children participate in daily teacher-led activities such as circle time, music or games and are also provided with various learning provocations that allow them to explore learning concepts in the eight domains of the Connecticut Early Learning and Development Standards (Cognition, Social-Emotional Development, Mathematics, Social Studies, Science, Physical Health and Development, Language and Literacy and Creative Arts).

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS 2021-2022

Along with enriching classroom experiences, CHT students take part in an array of special programs and traditions every year such as:

Hands-on Animal Experience Our science curriculum is enhanced by monthly visits from the Darien Nature Center. Children enjoy a close-up introduction to a wide variety of creatures such as frogs, lizards, turtles, and chinchillas.

Music Enrichment Children learn about music of other cultures though visits from Creative Music for Children.



Weekly Chapel Service Our Wednesday chapel service is a school tradition that brings us together to provide an age appropriate introduction to Christian stories and songs.



Mother or Another Celebration The children at CHT work together to plan and prepare a special day for mom or another primary caregiver who takes care of them in their lives.

Working Parents' Day This is a special Saturday event where parents are invited to come spend time in their child's classroom and share some special activities together.

Lunch Programs Children are invited to participate in lunch programs such as Pizza Wednesday or BarTaco Friday, which provide delicious hot lunch options and give parents a welcome break from packing lunches.

Community Outreach Projects Families are invited to participate in community outreach projects to support those in need.

Annual Christmas Pageant This CHT tradition is a collaborative performance by the children of the songs and story of the Nativity.

The Two's Program emphasizes helping our youngest students develop the positive social relationships and classroom skills for successful experiences in school. Teachers strive to instill a love of learning in a warm and nurturing environment and work with parents to facilitate each child's unique learning needs and development. We support children as they develop their ability to take turns, listen at circle time, follow directions, work together, and show empathy for others. In the Two's classes, children experience being part of a small group who works and plays collaboratively, shares ideas and cares for one another.





Creative activities such as art, music, movement and fingerplay enhance small and large motor development, while group circle and story time develop communication and language skills. The learning activities are designed to be "hands on," and reflect the children's interests and ideas. Art and sensory experiences are open-ended and focus on the "process, not the product."

The teachers in our Two's Program develop warm relationships with the children and create an environment that fosters creativity, curiosity, self-confidence and collaboration.



The Sea and Sky Classes

Option of 3, 4, or 5 days per week 9:15-1:00pm Late-day program available Tues – Fri 1:00-2:10 pm

The Threes Program is guided by the natural curiosity of each child and their desire to understand the world around them. Together children and teachers choose topics to



study, explore questions, build on discoveries, and interpret their findings. Children are encouraged to make connections between their own experiences outside of school and the topics that are being explored within the classroom. Project work is purposeful and gives children the opportunity to practice their cognitive, literacy, math, science, and social skills.



In addition to topic and project study, children have time to explore provocations and participate in structured and un-structured activities in the classroom and outdoors. Teachers facilitate each child's growth and skill development using the Connecticut Early Learning and Development Standards (CTELDS) and daily routines and activities are planned to help

children learn self-help skills and gain confidence and independence.

Daily circle time and small group activities encourage a love of literacy, language,



phonemic awareness and print recognition and provide opportunities for children to share their ideas and plan collaborative project work.

The Sun & Rainbow Classes

Option of 4 or 5 days per week 9:15-1:00pm Late-day program available Tues – Fri 1:00-2:10 pm

The Four's Program builds on the learning experiences of the Three's Program and focuses on encouraging young learners to further their skills as researchers, critical thinkers, and problem solvers. Children are given opportunities to pursue their interests through exploration and inquiry, and to express their ideas through creative arts. Daily routines and teacher-led activities that include literacy, math, science, creative expression and cooperation prepare your child for their experiences in future educational environments.





Every day, the children are provided with opportunities to engage in both child-directed and teacher-led activities that build and enhance verbal, social, and cognitive connections. Teachers serve as facilitators who provide provocations and activities that highlight learning concepts, further

explorations and guide children toward higher order thinking. Children learn problem-solving skills and build self-esteem through project work which often incudes the creation of collaborative displays,



presentations, an exhibit, or culminating activity.

Learning goals are set and assessed for each child based upon the Connecticut Early Learning and Developmental Standards (CTELDS). The teachers carefully observe children and document their emerging skill development and growth toward goals. Both small and large



group activities are designed to accommodate different styles of learning and developmental areas. The dynamic and nurturing environment in our Four's Program provides a wonderful foundation for future school experiences.



The Star Class

5 days per week 9:15-1:00pm Late-day program available Tues – Fri 1:00-2:10 pm

The Five's Program provides a wonderful bridge between preschool and kindergarten. Our teachers harness the energy and curiosity of this special age and channel it in creative ways to teach literacy, math, scientific inquiry, and problem-solving skills. Academic skills are masterfully woven into an emergent, projectbased curriculum developed collaboratively by the teachers and students.





The school day includes both independent and collaborative experiences in various learning centers

and activities available throughout the classroom. Provocations and activities are designed to provide opportunities for exploration, practicing skills, creative expression and the development of higher order thinking. Children are also exposed to the more formal learning environment encountered in kindergarten through circle time activities and interactions with the Smartboard. Daily outdoor time promotes gross motor skill development through free play and teacher-led activities and games. The children are provided with opportunities, not

answers, and are guided toward acquiring new knowledge to better understand the world around them. Within the smaller class size of this program, social relationships can flourish, and children learn to act as "peace-makers" to mediate and problem-solve any disagreements and conflicts that arise between peers.

Through various project investigations...

- Children develop phonemic awareness and gain exposure to literacy through books and poetry, as well as creative writing activities in journals.
- Math skills are introduced through a diverse range of games and activities, including sorting, patterning and sequencing.
- Children participate in the inquiry process and learn how to pursue their topics of interest through experiments, conducting research, collecting data, consulting with experts, and sharing of ideas.
- Children work together to represent their ideas and learning through individual and collaborative displays and artistic creations.

Early-Day Program

Our Early-Day Program is available for parents who need an earlier drop-off time on a regular or occasional basis. When parents need to start their child's school day a little earlier, children may be dropped off for Early Day as early as 8:30am. Early-day is available Monday through Friday.

Late-Day Program

Our Late-Day Program allows you to extend your child's school day until 2:10pm on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays. Late-Day may

either be reserved in advance for an entire session or parents may sign up daily on a first-come, first-serve basis. Late-Day programming is designed to extend and support our curriculum by

offering both indoor and outdoor learning opportunities that focus on:

- **Creative Arts** Children have additional opportunities to express their creativity and develop artistic techniques though various art activities including painting, beads, clay, dough, wire, drawing and Artist studies.
- **Cooking** Children learn and practice cooking skills as they try out new recipes and make snacks they can enjoy together and take home to their families to share.
- Science Additional opportunities for experimenting and exploring various science concepts such as magnetism, color mixing, cause and effect are provided. Children also enjoy nature walks and exploring concepts related to plants, animals and weather.







- **Sports and Yoga** These programs help children get enough physical activity during the winter months and provide the opportunity to increase strength and coordination, engage in cooperative games and learn relaxation techniques.
- **STEM** Children are provided with a wide variety of building materials such as wood, blocks, legos, cardboard, and recyclables to work individually and collaboratively on creative building projects.

To apply for the 2020-2021 school year, you may submit a completed Application for Enrollment and non-refundable \$250 registration fee at any time. Applications by current families and alumni are due by November 20, 2020 to be given first consideration and then all applications from new families are considered in the order they are received based on availability. To register your child and reserve their spot in a class, you must submit a signed Enrollment Agreement and first tuition payment. (Any payments made via credit card are subject to a 3.5% processing fee.)
