Classes starting at 9am

Class 1: Pairs Hunter Trial – Optimum Time

The team nearest to the bogey time will win. Riders must be aged 12yrs or over as of the date of competition. This class will follow the Novice TC course and the fences will be between 80cm & 1 metre in height.

Entry fee: £65 per pair (including BTC rider levy)

Prizes: Rosettes to 8th, prizes in kind.

Class 2: Novice Team Chase – Optimum Time

The team nearest to the bogey time will win. Riders must be aged 12yrs or over as of the date of competition. The fences will be between 80cm & 1 metre in height.

Entry fee: £130 per team (including BTC rider levy)

Prizes: Rosettes to 8th, prizes in kind.

Class 3 Novice Team Chase - Speed

The fastest time will win. All riders must be 16yrs or over on the day of the event. The fences will be between 80cm & 1 metre in height.

Entry fee: £130 per team (including BTC rider levy) Prizes: 1st £120, 2nd £80, 3rd £60. Rosettes to 8th.

Class 4: Intermediate Team Chase - Speed

The fastest time will win, all riders must be 16yrs or over on the day of the event. The fences have a maximum height of 1.10 metres.

Entry fee: £140 per team (including BTC rider levy)

Prizes: 1st £200, 2nd £150, 3rd £ 100, 4th £80. Rosettes to 8th.

Class 5: Intermediate Team Chase - Optimum Time

The team nearest to the bogey time will win, all riders must be 16yrs or over on the day of the event. The fences have a maximum height of 1.10 metres.

Entry fee: £140 per team (including BTC rider levy) Prizes: 1st £150, 2nd £100, 3rd £80. Rosettes to 8th.

Class 6: Mini Team Chase - Optimum Time (NEW!)

The team nearest to the bogey time will win. All riders must be 12yrs or over on the day of the event. Each team must contain at least one adult over the age of 18. The fences will be between 70 – 80cm in height and will be straightforward.

Entry fee: £120 per team Prizes: Rosettes to 8th, prizes in kind.

Start Times: Start times will be available from 4.00pm on Friday 15th March via the team chasing website and https://kimblewickraces.co.uk/team-chase

Course Walking: The course will be open to inspection from 2.00 pm on Saturday 16th March

Competitors will need to provide their own number bibs. Numbers will be printed by the secretary and can be picked up at the secretary's tent on the day.

Competitors will need to have their hats tagged in order to ride. Tags will be available from by the Secretary prior to riding. In addition spot checks will be conducted on body protectors at the finish to ensure compliance with new rules. Anyone not wearing a compliant body protector will ensure elimination for their team.

2024 Course Details

The courses run over old pasture and through woods and are designed to flow well. This is the third running of the team chase and there are new fences in all courses which are designed to make them easier than in previous years. The novice and intermediate courses have been shortened for 2024 with the novice particularly so. In particular the first few fences of the novice have been made easier and the sections towards the end of the course in the copse on the novice and intermediate tracks have been completely changed.

The new fun class follows a similar, but shorter route to the novice class. It is approximately 1m with 18 fences which are between 70-80cm in height and will be straightforward. The novice and pairs is approximately 1.5 miles with 19 jumps, fences will be between 80cm & 1 metre. The intermediate course is just under 2 miles with 24 fences and a maximum height of 1.10 metres including a new pen.

Rules and Conditions of Entry

This Team Chase is held under the auspices of the BHSA Governing Body and in accordance with BHS Team Chasing Rules. The making of an entry constitutes acceptance of those rules. Full rules at: www.teamchasing.co.uk

DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY: The Organiser does not accept liability in respect of any accident, illness or disease caused to or suffered by any horse, owner, rider, groom, spectator, sponsor or any other persons or property present at the site of the Event and their property and accourrements. All cars, horseboxes and trailers are parked at owners risk. Cars to be parked in the designated areas.

HEALTH & SAFETY STATEMENT: The Organiser of this event has taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of every person present. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey the instructions of the Organiser, officials and stewards.

The Organiser advises that, due to uneven and, in parts, irregular terrain at this event, it may be difficult at times for spectators to move around freely and easily, as a result of which it may not be suitable for these spectators who suffer from certain medical conditions. All the spectators enter the event at their own risk and are advised to wear suitable footwear. The Organiser shall not incur

New Rules for 2024

- 1. If a rider falls or is unseated in any circumstance whilst on course then that rider is immediately eliminated and must retire from the competition. If the competitor does continue on the course following a fall their team will be eliminated from the competition in the event of that competitor jumping a further fence. If a rider unseats anywhere on the event site, they may not start a round until they have undergone a Head Impact Assessment (HIA) and been cleared by the event Healthcare Professional.
- 2. Hat standards Hats will be identified by a BTC, BE, PC or BRC approved Hat Tag. With effect from 1st January 2023 only the following hat standards will be accepted: British and European PAS 015 (2011) or VG01 040 2014-12 both with a BSI Kitemark or Inspect IC Mark; American ASTM F1163 2004a onwards with SEI mark, Snell 2016 or 2021 (no other mark is needed with Snell) or Australia and New Zealand AS/NZS 3838 2006 onwards with SAI Global mark.
- 3. Body Protectors All competitors must also wear a body protector **British Equestrian Trade**Association (BETA) 2018 Level 3 standard (blue and black label). A body protector of this nature is also required when competitors are wearing air jackets of any make. From 1 January 2024 body protectors meeting the 2009 standard will no longer be permitted for use. The BETA 2018 label will be the only accepted standard.

GENERAL RULES and CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- 1. BHSA TEAM CHASE RULES APPLY for ALL Classes. These may be viewed on www.teamchasing.co.uk and in the Secretaries tent on the day. Some of these rules are mentioned below.
- 2. For TEAM CHASE CLASSES each TEAM is to consist of a maximum of FOUR HORSES AND RIDERS and at least three must complete the course to finish. Team members are started together. First horse starts the clock and the time of the third horse to finish, will be the finishing time for the team.
- 3. In class 1, 2, 5 & 6, the closer to the Optimum Time (OT), the fewer time faults incurred wins. The OT is calculated from the speed declared, over the course for each Class. A slower time away from the OT will be placed higher than a faster time away from the OT.
- 4. COURSE LENGTHS and NUMBER OF FENCES, stated in the schedule, are approximate. FENCE HEIGHTS refer to the maximum height of fixed rails. Hedges may be higher.
- 5. In ALL CLASSES competitors must JUMP every fence on their course only, in order, and pass between all designated flags.
- 6. PENALTIES in TEAM CHASE CLASSES will be scored as follows: REFUSALS will not be penalised, but a competitor who has more than three refusals at any one fence, or five in total, will be eliminated and must leave the course. The team will be disqualified for abuse of this rule by any individual member.

- 7. The first three horses must be within the PEN at one time or a 20 second time PENALTY will be awarded to count against it in the event of a tie and or take that team further away from the optimum time. If any horse strays on to the agricultural crops that team will suffer a 20 second time PENALTY to count against it in the event of a tie and or take that team further away from the optimum time.
- 8. When a horse falls during any BTC class, the competitor is immediately eliminated and must retire. If the competitor does continue on the course following a horse fall their team will be eliminated. A horse is considered to have fallen when at the same time its shoulder and quarters have touched either the ground or the obstacle and the ground, or when it is trapped in a fence in such a way that it is unable to proceed without assistance or is liable to injure itself.
- 9. Any horse ELIMINATED or RETIRING must leave the course at a walk. If a competitor falls behind and is caught by the team following on course they will be asked to retire and leave the course immediately
- 10. Each Team will be given a STARTING TIME. Any team missing its correct time may be fitted in at the end of the Class, if possible but this is not guaranteed.
- 11. Team Captains must declare any changes to their teams at least 30 minutes prior to their appointed starting time and register any change of horse or rider. Each Team / Competitor must report to the COLLECTING RING Steward 10 minutes before their actual starting time.
- 12. Competitors may exercise their horses beforehand only in the area provided, which includes a PRACTICE jump.
- 13. For safety reasons NO motorised vehicles including ATVs are permitted on the course other than officials and their vehicles. Visitors with mobility restrictions who would otherwise use motorised vehicles should contact the secretary's office for information and assistance.
- 14. The ORGANISERS RESERVE THE RIGHTS to: Withhold or amend any prize or cancel any class because of insufficient entries; Alter the advertised times; Refuse any entry with or without stating reasons; Alter the course or leave out any obstacle before or during the competition; Split a class if there is significant change in course; Eliminate any competitor not adhering to the rules; Eliminate any horse they consider to be exhausted; Eliminate any competitor for excessive use of the whip.
- 15. In the event of cancellation more than 1 week before the event is scheduled, a refund of 50% of entry fees will be made for all classes. If the event is cancelled less than 1 week before the event, 25% of entry fees will be refunded.
- 16. Veterinary surgeons, Farrier and a Horse Ambulance will be on site during the competition. Competitors must pay for any services on the day.
- 17. Dogs must be kept on a lead at ALL times no exceptions.
- 18. Children should remain under the care and be under the responsibility of their parents at ALL times.
- 19. It is a requirement that all participants carry third party insurance for not less than £5m. It is also strongly recommended that all participants have personal accident insurance.
