Instructions. Fill each syringe to the unit line below. Note: 1ml = 100 units.

Members are initially shipped 3-months supply of Semaglutide for the following doses.

If using High-Dose the first time after Mid-Dose, use the following dosing:

If already transitioned to High-Dose, use the following dosing:				
	1-12	12 syringes	80 units	2mg
	Remember: Months are 4-weeks. 3 Months is 12 weeks.			
	If you need extra syringes, order 1ml or .5ml Insulin Syringes, 5/16" (8mm), 31G (.25mm) <u>HERE</u> . Use MedPURE's <u>Dosing Calendar</u> to write-down the units above on your inject-days.			
	Your shipment contains 3-Months (12 weeks) of Semaglutide in vials and empty syringes.			
	Check all foil & paper wrapping for your vials and empty syringes.			
	To fill syringes, use <u>How to Fill Weight-Loss Syringes</u> and watch this <u>video</u> .			

☐ Then, every 7-days (weekly), on your "inject-day," self-inject your next correctly-dosed syringe.

☐ Properly discard any unused medication after 90 days. Do not reuse syringes.

Immediately, or on your next inject-day, self-inject Week #1's syringe.

Do not flush medications or pour down a drain.

☐ Use a Sharps Container or a Bottle with Cap to dispose of used syringes.

☐ Keep all medicines out of the reach of children. Do not share or take anyone else's medicine.

Refrigerate your vials & filled-syringes & vial(s) in a sealed plastic bag or a hard travel-case.
