



Dr. Melvyn E. Bassett, a devoted educator, community leader, and man of unwavering faith, departed this life on May 28, 2025. He was a beloved son, husband, father, grandfather, brother, mentor, and friend.

Melvyn was the second child and only son of Carl Eugene and Cecily Edwina Bassett. He was born and raised in Somerset, where he enjoyed a joyful and adventurous childhood. Melvyn told many stories of growing up with his siblings and cousins. He often reminisced about swimming at Scott's Bay and paddling with (Dr.) Johnny Cann and Joe Richards down to Robinson's Marina and back—simple pleasures that formed the foundation of a life rooted in community and camaraderie. He attended Southampton Glebe School, where older boys like Lance Furbert affectionately nicknamed him "Pixie."

He later enrolled at Sandys Secondary School, where he forged lifelong friendships that remained strong through every season of his life. His family often heard stories from his high school and college years, full of fun and mischief with close friends such as Larry Scott, Melvin Simmons, and others. His sister Barbara recalls that although Melvyn was a great tease, he was also the best big brother—protective, kind, and always ready with a story or a joke. As a young man, Melvyn demonstrated a strong curiosity for learning, a love for music, and an early sense of leadership that would later define his career and service.

A proud alumnus of Wilberforce University (B.Sc., 1970), Howard University (M.Ed., 1977), and St. John's University (Ed.D., 2004), Dr. Bassett dedicated his life to education and youth development. His remarkable 37-year career in education began as a classroom teacher at Sandys Secondary School, where he later rose to

the roles of Deputy Principal and then Principal. He led the school through its transition to Sandys Secondary Middle School and became its longest-serving principal, leaving an enduring legacy of leadership and dedication. He also co-directed the Bermuda Learning Styles Centre and served on the International Learning Styles Network.

As a contributing editor and published author, Dr. Bassett was instrumental in shaping academic and character-building resources for Bermudian students, always with a vision for their future success. One notable example was his organization of college tours to the United States to inspire students to pursue higher education.

Melvyn was a champion of others and a guiding light to many. Countless individuals have shared how he served as a mentor and a steadfast source of encouragement, inspiring students and professionals alike to realize their full potential.

Dr. Bassett served Bermuda faithfully through numerous national initiatives, including the Tumin and Archibald Commissions. He held leadership and advisory roles on several boards, including West End Development Corporation (WEDCo,) the Sandys Parish Council, the National Alliance of Black School Educators (NABSE), Endeavour, the Bermuda Education Network, and the Bermuda Middle School Association. His love for youth and the arts was evident in his role as Co-Director of Bermuda's first drumline production and the Bermuda National Youth Jazz Ensemble. In recognition of his lifelong dedication to education and community service, Dr. Bassett received the Queen's Certificate and Badge of Honour in 2010. In 2015, he was further recognized for his outstanding contributions to the island by being inducted as an Honorary Fellow of Bermuda College.

Melvyn's entrepreneurial spirit was evident throughout his life. In the 1970s and 1980s, while balancing a demanding teaching career and a young family, he pursued various business ventures. He was part-owner of the Game Fish Inn Restaurant, the owner of the Lawn and Garden Centre, and engaged in several other enterprises with varying degrees of success. He was never afraid to try something new and embraced each opportunity with enthusiasm and determination.

Melvyn's life was defined by his deep faith in Jesus Christ. His passion for the gospel fueled his dedication to Child Evangelism Fellowship. At the time of his passing, Dr. Bassett served as the Executive Director/National Leader of Child Evangelism Fellowship (Bermuda), and a member of the Executive Committee of the Child Evangelism Fellowship International Board of Trustees in Warrenton, Missouri.

His leadership extended across many spheres — a Deacon at Calvary Gospel Chapel, Chairman of Preserve Marriage & Family Bermuda, Vice-President of Peak Potential Ltd., and Trustee and former Deputy Chair of the Willowbank Foundation.

Melvyn was a faithful friend who will be dearly missed by his Friday golf crew, Saturday hot dog lunch group, Sunday Growth Group, and the many others whose lives he touched through the friendships he so intentionally and lovingly nurtured.

Despite Melvyn's many responsibilities and commitments, he always made time for family. In the late 1960s, while still a student at Wilberforce University, he met Sushila Mendis, a young nurse from Sri Lanka. They married in 1970, and their love remained strong until Sushila's passing—on this very day—June 25th, twelve years ago. Their union was blessed with one daughter, Rusheika, who remembers her father as a kind, loving, and no-nonsense man—intentional about creating joyful memories throughout her childhood and into her own journey of parenthood.

His grandchildren were his pride and joy, and he never missed an opportunity to share their accomplishments with anyone who would listen. They will fondly remember his funny—and sometimes not-so-funny—jokes and antics around the dinner table, the cherished tradition of Christmas Eve shopping followed by dinner at La Trattoria, and his faithful presence at their games and activities. Just two weeks before his passing, Melvyn traveled with his daughter, son-in-law, and sister, to celebrate the graduations of his eldest grandson from university and his only granddaughter from high school—both held on the same weekend in two different states.

Melvyn also held a special place in his heart for his foster daughter, Darricka, and was proud to attend her wedding in the UK last summer.

A man who lived out the words of Hebrews 13:16 — "And do not forget to do good and to share with others, for with such sacrifices God is pleased" — Melvyn's life was a continuous offering of service, generosity, and grace.

Dr. Melvyn E. Bassett will be remembered as a man of vision, humility, and conviction—one who used every platform given to him to glorify God and uplift others. His impact on the Bermuda community, and all who knew him, is immeasurable.

He was predeceased by his beloved wife of 44 years, Sushila Bassett, and his sister Carol Jean Posthlethwaite. He leaves behind his cherished daughter Rusheika and her husband Pastor Joseph Furbert; foster daughter Darricka (nee Williams) Furbert and her family; and five treasured grandchildren—Micaiah, Eli, Eden, Marcus, and Isaiah—each a testament to his enduring legacy of love and faith.

He will also be lovingly remembered by his sister Barbara Dillas, nephew Dwayne Dillas, the Bassett and Joell cousins, honorary nephew Neville Hassell, Calvary Gospel family, the Willowbank family, the CEF family, Sandys Secondary family, close friends Walter and Brenda Lister, Calvin and Suzanne Smith, Floyd Ming, and numerous other friends.

We both travelled to Rich Crest, North Carolina for an International Child Evangelism Conference. He assisted me for the duration of the conference, thus our friendship grew even stronger.


Dr. Bassett was a true man of God, he gave me hope, he was "Lux In Tenebris", a light in Darkness for me.


