# Tree Descriptions

## SEEDLINGS & TRANSPLANTS

### Arborvitae

Their popularity as landscape plants is due to their fast-growing, easy to care for nature, and the years round visual interest they bring. Transplant Only

### Black Spruce

**Michigan Native**

Also called swamp spruce, moist. Prefers cool sites. Used by wildlife for shelter and small animal food.

### Blue Spruce

Slow to moderate grower in fertile loams and clays. Used for windbreaks, wildlife and Christmas trees. Blue color varies with nurseries.

### Concolor Fir

**NEW!**

Known for its soft, flat, silvery-blue needles and citrusy scent. A favorite Christmas tree due to its excellent needle retention and attractive shape. Hardy for landscapes and windbreaks.

### Douglas Fir

**Native to North America**

Grows well on most upland soils except those with high lime content in top soil. Prefers cool climates.

### Norway Spruce

Fast grower, does well on well to poorly drained soils, clay and loamy sands. Identified by its drooping branches and large cones. Use for windbreaks, timber, pulpwood and wildlife resources.

### Red Cedar

**Michigan Native**

Dense, somewhat prickly blue-green foliage that turns deep purple by late fall. Grows on most soil types except swamp. 30-100' in height

### Red Pine

**Michigan Native**

Moderate to fast grower, prefers well drained soils. Used for windbreaks, timber, pulpwood and wildlife. Much better choice than Austrian Pine.

### White Cedar

**Michigan Native**

Prefers cold, wet sites with slow drainage, but not stagnant water, wider variety of wood uses. The most important winter food of Michigan's whitetail deer herd.

### White Pine

***Michigan's State Tree!***

Slow grower at first but once established grows faster, moist sandy loam, but will grow from swamps and sand, timber, windbreaks, pulpwood and wildlife.

### White Spruce

**Michigan Native**

Slow to moderate grower in fertile loams and clays, faster when established. Lumber, pulpwood, Christmas trees, wildlife. Deer are not overly fond of these.

## DECIDUOUS

### Black Cherry

**Michigan Native**

Grows best in deep, moist soil. Wood is hard and strong, useful in furniture making. Sweet cherries are a great wildlife food source.

### Black Walnut

**Michigan Native**

Thrives in well-drained, moist soils and prefers full sun. It does not perform well in shaded areas. **Roots release a toxin that harms surrounding trees. Don't plant near birch.**

### Butternut Hickory

**NEW!**

Produces sweet, edible nuts and offers golden fall colors. Valuable source of food and strong wood for handles and furniture.

### Chinese Chestnut

Blight resistant with sweet-tasting nuts often roasted for holiday eating, it is also a great tree for wildlife.

### Hazelnut

**Michigan Native**

AKA Filbert. Prefers deep, well drained soils. Doesn't tolerate wet feet. Produces a crop in 3 to 4 years. Excellent turkey food source.

### Mountain Ash

**Michigan Native**

A short tree with a showy floral displays in late spring and early summer and bright orange berries in the fall. Winter food source for birds. **Not a true ash and not affected by Emerald Ash Borer.**

### Pawpaw

**Michigan Native**

Easily grown in average, medium to wet, well-drained soil in full sun to part shade. Prefers moist, acidic, fertile soils. Will grow in shade but becomes leggy.

### Redbud

**Michigan Native**

A spectacular landscape tree with magenta pink flowers that is easily grown in well-drained soils and partial shade. An ideal showy spring feature.

### Red Mulberry

**Michigan Native**

Juicy berries produce mouth watering jelly and deep purple wine. Hardy 25-40 ft. Fast growing tree good for shade. Ripens in July.

### Red Maple

**Michigan Native**

Fast grower in a variety of soils, nice shade tree with beautiful red fall foliage.

### Silver Maple

**Michigan Native**

Rapid grower in well drained moist soils, graceful foliage. Useful for lumber, birds, small mammal food sources.

### Sugar Maple

**Michigan Native**

Best in fertile, slightly acidic, moist soils in full sun. Grows poorly in compacted, poorly drained soils. Intolerant of road salt. Generally intolerant of urban pollution.

### Swamp White Oak

**Michigan Native**

A striking tree with lustrous two-tone leaves; dark green on top with a silvery-white underside. Fall color is an orange-gold to yellow in mid-autumn. An excellent shade tree for any landscape.

### White Birch

**Michigan Native**

Rapid grower in well drained sand, loam, used for reforestation, in yards and by wildlife.

### White Oak

**Michigan Native**

Slow grower in all but the wettest soils, food source for grouse, small mammals & whitetail.

## SHRUBS

### Butterfly Bush

Full sun to partial shade, slender branches with stalks of fragrant color in lavender, white or magenta. Plant mid-summer to frost.

### Buttonbush

Michigan Native

These small-growing shrubs grow best in wet soil and swampy areas. Their tiny button-like flowers attract hummingbirds and butterflies.

### Dogwood, Flowering

Michigan Native

Dry to moist soils, beautiful white spring flowers, red fruit, birds and small mammals.

### Dogwood, Red Osier

Michigan Native

Prefers moist soils, especially along streams, useful for erosion control, white flowers, small white fruit, red branches in winter, good food for white-tail deer.

### Dogwood, Silky

Michigan Native

Moist soils, white flowers, blue fruit, useful for erosion control, birds and small mammals.

### Elderberry.

Michigan Native

Rich moist soil in sunny location, white flowers, purplish-black fruit. Use for wildlife and wine making.

### High Bush Cranberry

Michigan Native

Tolerates poor soils, prefers cool, moist site, small white to pink flowers, fruit is translucent red berry. Species good for wildlife.

### Lilac

Purple colored fragrant flowers bloom best in full sun and moist soil.

### Nannyberry

Michigan Native

Moist to well-drained soils, white flowers, blue-black fall fruit, called wild raisin, birds and other wildlife.

### Ninebark

Michigan Native

Moist soil, large clusters of white flowers, red fruit, wildlife.

### Serviceberry

Michigan Native

Well drained variety of soils, edible blue-black fruit, eaten by birds. Also known as **Juneberry**.

### Winterberry

Michigan Native

Also known as **Michigan Holly**, found in moist soils-occasionally drier soils-easy to grow, small white flowers, but look out when it comes to fall its slender branches are covered with small red berries that remain into winter giving color to the landscape, wildlife.

## GARDEN PLANTS

### Asparagus, Jersey Giant

A male hybrid garden plant. Its energy goes into producing spears rather than seeds as with female plants. A very productive plant: yields 2-4 times more spears than older varieties. It is also disease resistant, which is a bonus.

### Blueberry: Bluecrop/Earliblue

one of each plant

A great blueberry plant for colder climates. Produces big clusters of large, all-purpose berries Cold-hardy. Ripens in July. Earliblue are sweet and firm.

### Grapes, Concord

Vigorous and hardy, ideal for jelly and juice.

### Grapes, Niagara

Popular white grape, excellent flavor, table use and wines.

### Raspberries, Red Heritage

Harvest starts in early fall and will last until extremely cold weather. Prefers a soil pH of 5.6-6.2. Fertilize garden with 10-10-10 fertilizer or compost.

### Strawberries, Seascape

A day neutral type of strawberry variety. It is noteworthy for high flavor, high yield, large fruit size, firmness, symmetry, attractive appearance and flexibility in planting requirements.

### Allium "Bubble Bath"

Soft lavender flower clusters are held on strong stems above a mound of glaucous blue-green foliage. 'Bubble Bath' has lighter purple flowers on large 3" flower clusters. Grows to 26-28". Full sun to partial shade.

### Dicentra Spectabilis "Bleeding Heart"

Old fashioned Bleeding Hearts form large, bushy clumps of powdery green foliage. Blooms in late spring with rose-pink and white tips. Grows to 30-36" in partial to full shade.

### Echinacea "Coral Craze"

5" vibrant coral pink flowers mature to lavender pink with wide petals. Dark, near black stems with a matching dark cone. Grows to 26-28". Full sun to partial shade.

### Heliopsis "Sun Dial"

An upright variety of False Sunflower that captivates with its striking color contrast. The gold flowers with their red eyes beautifully complement the dark olive-green foliage, creating a vibrant display. Grows to 48-54", full to partial sun.

### Hibiscus Root

Commonly known as hardy hibiscus or swamp rose mallow, is a vigorous, sturdy, rounded, somewhat shrubby, hairy-stemmed, woody-based perennial of the mallow family. It typically grows to

### Liatris bulbs:

Also known as blazing star or gay feather perennial. Plant bulbs three to four inches apart and five inches deep. Flowers in July/August with purple or white flower spikes.

# Fruit Tree Descriptions

**Gale Gala Apple:** A whole tree sport of the Royal Gala, this new strain has all the characteristics of its parent with a fuller red color. Growers report one-pick harvests with 95-100% packouts. **EMLA 7**

**Ginger Gold Apple:** The best of the early goldens, Ginger Gold has all the qualities of Golden Delicious, but ripens 6-8 weeks earlier. It has a sweet, tangy flavor and a firm, fresh crisp. Can be picked green. **EMLA 7**

**Honey Crisp Apple:** Sweet as honey. Crisp, cream-colored flesh is mild, sweet and aromatic, ripens in early September. **EMLA 111**

**Idared Apple:** A dual-purpose apple suitable for fresh eating and processing. This bright red apple keeps well in long-term storage and bears annually with heavy crops. A good pollinator. Blooms early. **EMLA 111**

**Jonaprince Apple:** A cultivar of Red Johnathan with an improved red color, large fruit size and a high-yield. Favored for its exceptional quality. **EMLA 106**

**Liberty Apple:** Bright, shiny McIntosh type with crisp, juicy flesh. Flavor intensifies in storage. A hardy, vigorous tree that produces annually and resists scab, fire blight, mildew and cedar apple rush. **EMLA 7**

**Pristine Apple:** An early ripening, scab-resistant variety. Pristine apples are yellow with smooth, glossy skin and a high sugar content. Very scab-resistant, but susceptible to fire blight. **BUD 111.**

**Red McIntosh Apple:** This is the Summerland Red McIntosh. The fruit colors early with a deep red hue. A hardy and productive tree, it is sometimes used as a hardy understock for other apple varieties. Ripens Late September. **EMLA 7**

**Scarlett Spur II Red Delicious Apple:** Finishes coloring three days earlier than its parent, with all the winning characteristics of the original - dark mahogany color, crisp white flesh, excellent fruit production, and outstanding type. **EMLA 111**

**Wickson Crabapple:** A small, bi-colored apple known for its tang and high sugar content. Highly flavored and very hardy. **EMLA 118**

**Wolf River Apple:** A antique variety best known for its large size. It is an early-season apple, excellent for cooking and baking. The finish is a very pale red blush on yellow background. Wolf River is a hardy winter tree and somewhat scab resistant. **EMLA 7**

**Balaton Cherry:** renowned for its versatility and luscious fruit, reminiscent of the Montmorency but larger and firmer in texture. This tree offers an extended cherry-picking season, bright red cherries for a longer harvest. Self pollinating. **MAZZARD**

**Rainier Cherry:** Large, yellow fruit with a half-red blush; birds are less attracted, due to the yellow half. Very firm, sweet flesh has a fine texture and distinct, outstanding flavor. Bud-hardy and crack-resistant, making it the cherry of choice for backyard gardeners. Self pollinating **MAZZARD**

**Bartlett Pear:** The leading commercial pear for both canning and fresh fruit sale. This large fruit has a smooth and attractive appearance. Its flesh is tender and juicy, buttery and of high dessert quality. Tree has a tendency for compact, upright growth which lends itself to dense plantings. Also excellent for home use. Self pollinating, Ripens in August. **OHXF 87**

**Harrow Crisp Pear:** The fruit has a very attractive finish, with a red blush over smooth, yellow skin and mildly sweet flavor. The tree is hardy, productive and resistant to fire blight. This variety harvest with Bartlett and sizes slightly larger. **OHxF97**

**Glohaven Peach:** This large, round, uniform peach has little fuzz. Its skin color is mostly red with a gold background with firm, clear yellow flesh. The tree is vigorous and moderately hardy. **LOVELL**

**Red Haven Peach:** Tree is vigorous, very bud-hardy and productive. Fruit is medium-sized and colors to a brilliant red. One of the best commercial varieties. Ripens around August. Self pollinating **SEED**

**Sunglo Nectarine:** A very high-quality, yellow fleshed nectarine for the mid-season. Fruit is large and red over a golden background. An excellent variety for the commercial pack or retail market. **LOVELL**

**Stanley Prune:** The gold standard for prunes. This variety produces abundant crops of oval-shaped fruit with deep purple skin and sweet golden flesh. Tastes great when picked fresh or when dried or canned. Self pollinating **SEED**

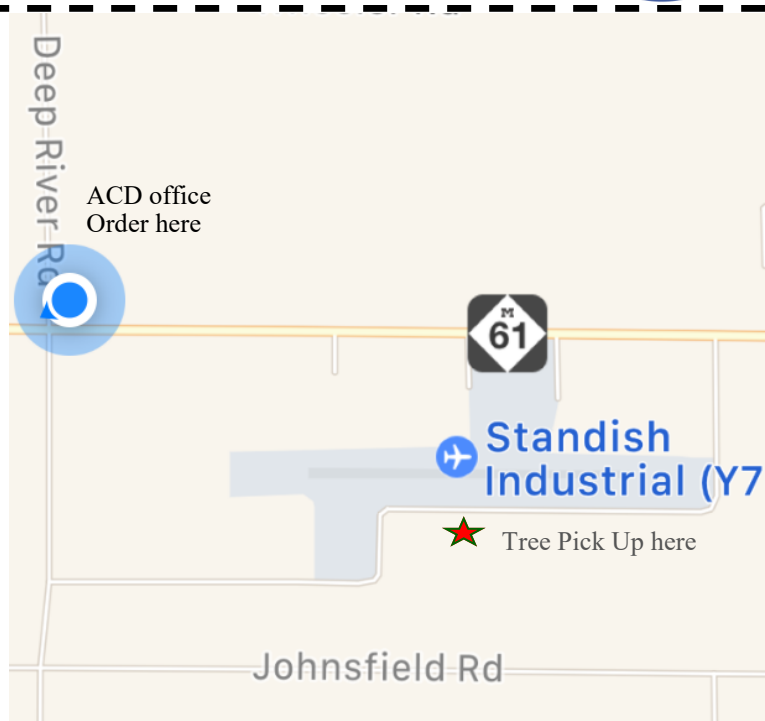
