The Bourke Family Foundation to Host Fourth Annual Golf Tournament Fundraiser

Prizes can be won for a variety of contests in addition to prizes for the winning and losing teams. A silent auction will take place along with additional raffles followed by a dinner reception and live auction.

"Our goal is that one day, not one mother, child or teacher will lack the basic necessities to survive and opportunities for education. We have seen the impact each light has on a child through higher test scores, greater confidence and participation in school, along with a decrease in student dropout rates", says Larry Gates, CEO of TBFF. "Our programs need support like this tournament to continue delivering sustainable, long-term solutions that provide those in need with the basic necessities for life."

In 2018, TBFF was able to provide 22,000 solar room lights across Botswana, Zimbabwe, Liberia, Zambia, and Haiti. This year, TBFF hopes to provide even more solar room lights to children and solar panel systems to light up libraries across Sub-Saharan Africa. Their stand out accomplishment hopes to be the building of a library, fully installed with solar panel light systems. Brigid Bourke, co-founder of TBFF says, "Lighting a library doesn't just change the life of one child, it helps transform an entire community." TBFF's "Lights for Literacy" program has delivered over 55,000 solar powered room lights to secondary school children in Zimbabwe, Kenya, Tanzania, Ghana, Liberia, Madagascar, Botswana and Haiti. Additionally, TBFF has provided and helped with the installation of over 140 solar panel systems to light school libraries in Tanzania and Zimbabwe.
