In Pennsylvania, licensed wildlife rehabilitators and volunteers must have RVS certification to handle "rabies vector species" or RVS. To obtain RVS certification, it is required for rehabilitators and volunteers to attend RVS training in addition to obtaining pre-exposure rabies vaccines or have a protective rabies titer. There are many more requirements for licensed rehabilitators to handle RVS species. Learn more about the requirements at this training. A copy of the RVS protocol will be provided on a CD.

A representative from Dept. of Health will discuss rabies in relation to human health which will include rabies vaccination protocol for pre-exposure and post-exposure.

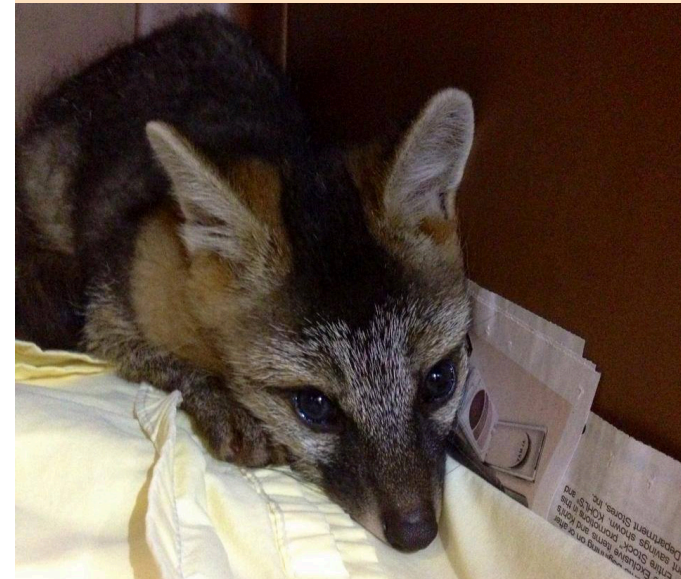
