GHB (Gamma-Hydroxybutyrate)

WHAT IS GHB?

GHB (Gamma-Hydroxybutyrate) is a central nervous system depressant that produces effects similar to alcohol. It's often used recreationally for its euphoric and relaxing effects, and is sometimes known as a "party drug" or "date rape drug."

Form: Usually a clear, oily liquid or sometimes a powder.

- Method: Swallowed (often diluted in a drink). Doses are very small (measured in mL or caps/drops).
- GHB has a steep dose-response curve: a little too much can lead to unconsciousness, overdose, or death.

SHORT-TERM EFFECTS (Low to moderate dose)

- Euphoria
- Increased sociability
- Relaxation or sedation
- Reduced inhibitions
- Heightened libido
- Dizziness or nausea

MIGH DOSE OR RISKY USE

- Vomiting
- Confusion or hallucinations
- Seizures
- Loss of consciousness ("Gsleep")
- Coma or death (especially when mixed with other depressants)

RISKS & DANGERS

- Very easy to overdose —
 especially because the
 difference between a "fun"
 and a dangerous dose is
 very small.
- Mixing with alcohol, benzos, or opioids is extremely dangerous and increases risk of coma or death.
- Can impair memory and consent — linked to sexual assault in some cases.
- Risk of dependence, especially with regular use (withdrawal can be severe and life-threatening).

(1) HARM REDUCTION TIPS

- Start low, go slow doses are measured in millilitres or drops.
- Wait 2+ hours before redosing – it builds up in your system.
- Use a syringe or measuring cap – not a sip or guess.
- NEVER mix with alcohol, benzos, or opioids.
- Have a sober friend nearby

 someone who knows what
 to do in case of overdose.
- Don't use alone.



SIGNS OF OVERDOSE

- Loss of consciousness (can't wake them)
- Slow or irregular breathing
- Seizures
- Vomiting while unconscious
- Skin turning pale, cold, or blue
- Gurgling or choking sounds

What to do:

- Call emergency services immediately 000
- Place them on their side (recovery position)
- Stay with them until help arrives
- Do NOT leave them to "sleep it off" — GHB coma is not sleep
- Label your bottle if you're carrying it.
- Be aware of consent— GHB affects memory and decision-making.
