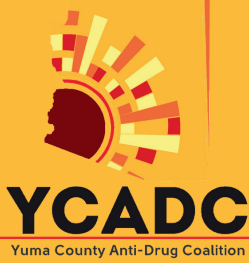

Delivered Red Ribbon merchandise and balloon kits to over 20 schools.

FENTANYL AWARENESS VIDEO

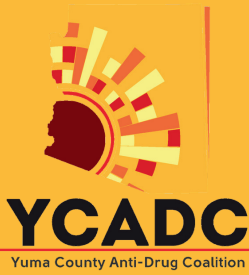

COMMUNITY CONNECTIONS

During the final quarter of 2023, YCADC focused on building meaningful relationships with community leaders, organizations, and public safety partners. The coalition partnered with the City of Yuma Mayor and City Council to officially kick off Red Ribbon Week, demonstrating a shared commitment to promoting healthy, drug-free lifestyles among youth and families. YCADC also began collaborating with Yuma County Sheriff Leon Wilmot on the development of the "One Pill Can Kill" fentanyl awareness campaign, laying the groundwork for a countywide effort to educate the community about the dangers of fentanyl and counterfeit pills. In addition, YCADC increased its community presence by participating in local outreach events, including the City of Yuma's annual Scary & Safe Halloween event, where we connected with families, distributed prevention resources, and expanded awareness about our Coalition.

COMMUNITY INSIGHTS

Youth in the community continue to face high exposure to risk factors, including limited access to mental health services and increased proximity to drug trafficking activity along the border. Focus on reducing youth substance use and opioid-related harm through early intervention and education strategies.

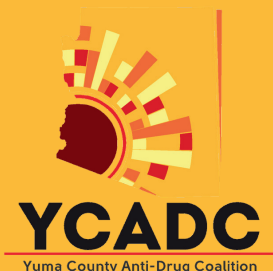
Implement targeted public awareness campaigns focused on fentanyl, opioids, mental health, and substance misuse prevention.

In 2023, the Yuma County Anti-Drug Coalition focused on rebuilding momentum, strengthening community connections, and laying the groundwork for future growth. Following the arrival of Joanne Fiser as Executive Director in October, YCADC immediately engaged the community through Red Ribbon Week activities, prevention outreach events, and collaborative efforts with local partners. During the final quarter of the year, the coalition enhanced its website and social media presence to improve communication and access to resources while developing a strategic roadmap for quarterly prevention and awareness campaigns in 2024.

The coalition also began planning several initiatives that would become cornerstone programs in the year ahead, including the launch of the YCADC Radio Show, the revival of Grad Night after a ten-year hiatus, and expanded community outreach efforts focused on prevention, mental wellness, and youth engagement. These foundational efforts positioned YCADC for significant growth and impact.

Looking ahead to 2024, YCADC will focus on expanding resource distribution, increasing community awareness and outreach, strengthening coalition membership and partnerships, and creating innovative opportunities to connect youth, families, and community members with prevention and behavioral health resources. Through collaboration, education, and advocacy, YCADC remains committed to building a healthier, safer, and more connected Yuma County.
