YCADC Coalition Updates - Joanne:

Q2 Marijuana Campaign Initiative:

- o YCADC has created a youth internship that has been very well received by the community so far, there were enough applicants to create a waiting list for the future
- o Alice Byrn and Woodard are looking to host a PE Class Day takeover with YCADC
- o Radio Show "1400 Outlaw Country" last broadcast with Henry Gonzalez received over 1,000 views on Facebook live within the first 24 hours
- o Grad Night 2024 is being brought back for the first time in a decade thanks to the collaboration of the Optimist Club of Yuma, Yuma County Anti-Drug Coalition, and South Yuma County Anti-Drug Coalition
- o YCADC members David, Henry, and Ryan will be presenting at the YUHSD board meeting 3/13.
- o New quarterly campaig on marijuana will begin in April, and SGT. Moreno will be leading an informative Marijuana presentation following the April meeting

Chicanos Por La Causa (CPLC) - Parenting Arizona Presentation by Ramon Flores and Nancy Quintero:

- o CPLP works to remove barriers to meaningful life while supporting people of all backgrounds, and they believe that "Everyone deserves the power to a meaningful life"
- o Parenting Az provides: Parenting classes, home visits, a family resource center, building resilient families, drug prevention for teens, and active parenting of teens
- o CPLC was recently awarded the Yuma Opioid Abatement (OA) program and plan to reach out to approximately 750 individuals, they have already reached this number and are looking to surpass it

o They are also looking to provide their RX360 training and active parenting classes to at least 90 families, these trainings will be made available to individuals or organizations

Good of the Order:

- o Coalition growth has been consistently growing since our location change to Yuma County Main Library.
- Henry Gonzalez received the National Drug Awareness Communication Community Outreach Award for his work with HIDTA
- o Beginning April the coalition will have 2 conference rooms available for our meetings to sustain our growth.
- o Ryan shared that 2023 data provided by the Yuma County Public Health Services District shows that 2023 was the first year since 2018 in which there were no reported overdose deaths for individuals under 18 years old.
